Introduction

This SIP revision request submits the case-by-case reasonably available control technology (RACT) determinations and/or nitrogen oxide (NOx) averaging plans, and enforceable RACT measures that are indicated in redacted permits, and certifies that all necessary said determinations/averaging plans and enforceable measures in redacted permits have been submitted, as required to meet certain of Pennsylvania's Clean Air Act (CAA) obligations under the 1997 and 2008 8-hour ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) and the EPA RACT II Conditional Approval.

Statutory Authority:

The Air Quality Program operates under the approval of the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection in accordance with the provisions of 25 Pa Code Chapter 133. The Air Quality Program controls air pollution from sources by means of visible, mass, and concentration emission standards equal to, or more stringent than, those standards established by the DEP for emissions (25 Pa Code 133.4 (b) (2)). Since the early 1990s, Allegheny County has implemented numerous RACT controls to meet the CAA's RACT requirements.

Background:

The federal Clean Air Act (CAA) of 1990 gives the states primary responsibility for achieving the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). The NAAQS are established by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as the maximum concentrations in the atmosphere for specific air contaminants, set to protect public health and welfare. The principal mechanism at the state and local level for complying with the CAA is the State Implementation Plan (SIP). A SIP outlines the programs, actions, and commitments that a state will carry out to fulfill its responsibilities under the CAA. Once approved by the EPA, a SIP is a legally binding document under both state and federal law.

Ground level ozone, one of the principal components of "smog," is a serious air pollutant that is known to affect human health and the environment. High levels of ozone can damage the respiratory system causing breathing problems, throat irritation, coughing, chest pains, and increased susceptibility to respiratory infection. High levels of ozone also cause serious damage to forests and agricultural crops, which results in economic loss to logging and farming operations. In May 2012, EPA designated 46 areas of the country as "non-attainment," unclassifiable, or unclassifiable/attainment under the 2008 8-Hour ozone NAAQS. Among the non-attainment areas is the Pittsburgh-Beaver Valley Ozone Non-Attainment Area (NAA) located in Pennsylvania.

Ozone is generally not directly emitted to the atmosphere; rather it is formed in the atmosphere by photochemical reactions between volatile organic compounds (VOC), oxides of nitrogen (NOx), and carbon monoxide (CO) in the presence of sunlight. In order to reduce ozone concentrations in the ambient air, the CAA requires all non-attainment areas to apply controls on VOC/NOx emission sources to achieve emission

reductions. CO's role in forming ozone is relatively insignificant, therefore the CAA does not specify requirements on CO emission reductions regarding ozone attainment. Among effective control measures, the Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT) controls are a major group for reducing VOC and NOX emissions from stationary sources.

RACT Requirements

The US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has defined RACT as the lowest emission limitation that a particular source is capable of meeting by the application of control technology that is reasonably available considering technological and economic feasibility (44 FR 53761 at 53762, September 17, 1979). Section 182 of the CAA sets forth separate RACT requirements for ozone non-attainment areas.

- The first requirement, contained in section 182(a)(2)(A) of the CAA, and referred to as RACT fix-up, requires the correction of RACT rules for which EPA identified deficiencies before the Act was amended in 1990. Allegheny County has no deficiencies to correct under this Section of the CAA.
- The second requirement, set forth in section 182(b)(2) of the CAA for VOC sources, applies to moderate or worse ozone NAAs. This requires NAAs to implement RACT controls on all major VOC sources and on all VOC sources and source categories covered by a Control Technique Guideline (CTG) issued by EPA. Allegheny County's CTG Certification SIP, submitted by PA DEP to EPA on July 24, 2018 has been approved by EPA (84 FR 18736, May 2, 2019).
- The third requirement is in section 182(f), and subjects major stationary sources of NOx to the same RACT requirements that are applicable to major sources of VOC. In addition, Section 184(b)(1)(B) of the CAA applies the RACT requirements in section 182(b)(2) for moderate nonattainment areas (and 182(f) by extension), to marginal nonattainment areas and attainment areas located within ozone transport regions (OTRs) established pursuant to section 184 of the CAA.

Requirements and Certifications specifically satisfied by this SIP Revision:

The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PA DEP) submitted its April 23, 2016 final rule, entitled *Additional RACT Requirements for Major Sources of NOx and VOCs* (46 Pa.B. 2036) (RACT II Regulations) as a SIP revision to meet RACT requirements for volatile organic compound (VOC) and oxides of nitrogen (NOx) emissions under sections 172(c)(1), 182(b)(2)(C) and 182(f) of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C.A. §§ 7502(c)(1), 7511a(b)(2), 7511a(f)) and the 2008 ozone NAAQS implementation rule (80 FR 12,264; March 6, 2015).

On May 9, 2019, the EPA published a final rule entitled *Approval and Promulgation of Air Quality Implementation Plans; Pennsylvania; Regulatory Amendments Addressing Reasonably Available Control Technology Under the 1997 and 2008 8-Hour Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standards*, (84 FR 20,274), which conditionally approved certain provisions of Pennsylvania's RACT II Regulations (RACT II Conditional Approval).

Section IV of the EPA's RACT II Conditional Approval required PA DEP to submit the following by May 9, 2020:

- 1. All facility-wide or system-wide averaging plans approved by PADEP under 25 Pa Code § 129.98 including but not limited to any terms and conditions that ensure the enforceability of the averaging plan as a practical matter, and;
- 2. All source-specific RACT determinations approved by PADEP under 25 Pa Code § 129.99, including any alternative compliance schedules approved under §§ 129.97(k) and 129.99(i); the source-specific RACT determinations submitted to EPA for approval into the SIP shall include any terms and conditions that ensure the enforceability of the source-specific RACT emission limitation as a practical matter.

In this SIP revision, ACHD is submitting all of the case by case RACT determinations and averaging plans required by the RACT II Conditional Approval for sources located in Allegheny County, and the enforceable RACT measures indicated in the related redacted permits for such sources. (See Section B.2.) At the request of the EPA, ACHD is also submitting the corresponding complete, i.e., unredacted, permits for such sources. However, ACHD notes that it does not include these complete, unredacted permits as being submitted to be part of the SIP.

ACHD is also submitting the necessary documentation demonstrating that all procedural requirements regarding public notice and public comment with respect to these determinations/plans have been satisfied.

As stated in the cover transmittal letter, ACHD certifies that, with this SIP revision submittal, it has submitted all of the case-by-case RACT determinations and averaging plans required by the terms of EPA's RACT II Conditional Approval with regard to air pollution sources located in Allegheny County, and that the enforceable RACT measures indicated in the redacted permits resolve the requirements of the EPA RACT II Conditional Approval.

Notice of Public Comment:

SIP Revision 84C was the subject of a public comment period and a public hearing. As mentioned above, public hearing documentation for the four public comment periods is included in Section B.2(the comment/responses), and Section D.

Responsible Agency:

The agency with direct responsibility for preparing and submitting this document is Allegheny County Health Department, under the Department's Director, Dr. Debra Bogen. The working responsibility for air quality planning and permitting falls within Air Quality under Ms. Jayme Graham.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED REVISION TO THE STATE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN FOR OXIDES OF NITROGEN, VOLATILE ORGANIC COMPOUNDS (RACT II) AND NOTICE OF INTENT TO ISSUE REVISED INSTALLATION & MAJOR (TITLE V) OPERATING PERMITS

In accordance with Article XXI §2102.05.c and §2103.21.c, the Allegheny County Health Department is proposing to modify and issue permits for the following major source facilities and to revise the State Implementation Plan (SIP) for nitrogen oxides (NOx) and volatile organic compounds (VOC) Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT II). The proposed RACT II determinations, if finally approved, will be incorporated into each facility's respective permit, and a revised Title V operating permit will be issued. The relevant RACT II requirements will be submitted to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for the conditions to become part of the Pennsylvania State Implementation Plan (SIP) and will remain in effect until replaced pursuant to 40 CFR 51 and approval by the EPA. Requirements that are not part of the RACT II determination will be excluded from the SIP submittal.

The proposed SIP revision does not adopt any new regulations. It incorporates the provisions and requirements contained in the amended RACT II approval for the facility, which are intended to satisfy the requirements of the 1997 National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) and the 2008 NAAQS for ozone. The following is a summary of the proposed amendments to the RACT II determination that will be submitted to the EPA as a SIP revision:

UNIVERSAL STAINLESS AND ALLOY PRODUCTS, INC (0027-OP17a), 600 Mayer Street, Bridgeville, PA 15017, for the manufacture of specialty steel products. The facility is composed of one electric arc furnace (P001), one argon-oxygen decarburization vessel (P002), four electro-slag reduction furnaces, one hot rolling mill, one bar mill, and associated reheat and annealing furnaces. The facility is a major source of nitrogen oxides (NO $_X$) and therefore subject to Reasonable Available Control Technology (RACT). Except for P001 and P002, the other emission sources at this facility are required to comply with the presumptive RACT requirements in 25 Pa. Code 129.97.

PPG INDUSTRIES, INC. – SPRINGDALE PLANT (0057-OP18a), 125 Colfax Street, Springdale, PA, for a Title V operating permit. The facility consists of a paint production facility (Paint Plant), a resin development center, and research & development facility (Development Center). The facility is a major source of volatile organic compounds (VOC) and hazardous air pollutants (HAP) and therefore subject to Reasonable Available Control Technology (RACT). Emission sources at this facility other than the ones listed below are required to comply with the presumptive RACT requirements in 25 Pa. Code 129.97.

In addition to revising the State Implementation Plan (SIP) for nitrogen oxides (NOx) and volatile organic compounds (VOC), under Article XXI, §2103.11.e. and §2103.21.c, notice is hereby given that the Allegheny County Health Department intends to issue an Installation Permit (IP) for the following facilities.

BELLEFIELD BOILER PLANT (0047-1003), 4400 Forbes Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15213 for a captive steam generation facility, which supplies steam for heating and refrigeration. The plant is composed of six (6) boilers emitting from one stack. The facility is a major source of nitrogen oxides (NO_x) and carbon monoxide emissions (CO) and therefore subject to Reasonable Available Control Technology (RACT). Except for B003 and B007, the other emission sources at this facility are required to comply with the presumptive RACT requirements in 25 Pa. Code 129.97.
