The Allegheny County Department of Human Services (DHS) provides publicly funded human services for some of the county's most vulnerable individuals and families.

Using federal, state and local funding, we meet many of their needs through our extensive network of services.

But government funding can only be used to meet specific, eligible needs. It seldom pays for items or opportunities that are considered optional, supplemental or life-enhancing.

We rely on the generosity of county residents and organizations to help us meet these other needs. These life-enriching items and opportunities often help to bring a sense of normalcy to difficult circumstances.

The DHS Office of Community Relations (OCR) spearheads or partners on several annual projects in which the community can help.



Allegheny County Music Festival Fund

raises monies to purchase items and opportunities otherwise out of reach for vulnerable children and young adults.



DHS Holiday Project

provides new gifts for children and teens involved with child welfare and those living in homeless shelters with their parents.



SummerBooks

collects and distributes new and gently read books to children, ages birth to 12 years, to encourage reading while children are out of school.



Project Prom

provides new and gently used formal attire for teens served by DHS.

DHS is

responsible for providing and administering publicly funded human services to Allegheny County residents.
