


Everyday Lives: Values in Action

These are all interconnected. What happens in one area of life affects another.

CONSIDER

At times, activities designed for persons with disabilities may be preferred ...don't limit your search to specially designed or service provider agency offerings.

Locating the activities that best fits will require some investigating and trying things out.

What activities are fun and engaging? Is there an interest in lifelong learning?

ASK

- ❖ Call ahead or do an internet search to be sure that the activity and physical site will meet needs.
- ❖ Consider needed accommodations—can they be met even if not typically available?
- ❖ Are noise cancelling headphones or sunglasses available?
- ❖ Restrooms...Available? Family room – gender neutral – adult changing table?
- ❖ Is there somewhere to take a break if needed?
- ❖ Where is the closest accessible parking?

POSSIBLE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE / DISCOUNTS

- **Scholarships or sliding scales** may apply for fees.
- Will caregivers / supporters be charged?
- **Allegheny County Music Festival Fund (ACMFF)**, www.alleghenycounty.us/Human-Services/ACMFF/ Children and adolescents receiving services through DHS, a DHS-contracted provider, or Allegheny County Juvenile Probation are eligible. Requests must be made by a social service professional. Requests have included dance lessons, computers and age-

appropriate software, developmental toys, graduation expenses, summer camp tuition, registration fees for recreational activities.

- **ACHIEVA Charitable Residual Account**, provides supplemental supports and services for children and adults with disabilities and a demonstrated need.

PARTICIPATING IN YOUR LOCAL COMMUNITY
