 4 Allegheny County Council does hereby congratulate Pressley
 5 Ridge upon the momentous occasion of its 185th
 6 anniversary, and we thank Pressley Ridge for its 185 years
 7 of dedication and commitment to improving the lives of
 8 children and families everywhere. Thank you so much.
 9 (Applause.)
 10 Now, do you want to --- if anybody wants to say
 11 something ---.
 12 MS. COLE: Hi. On behalf of Pressley Ridge, I
 13 just want to thank everyone for their support. We are
 14 proud to be part of Pittsburgh's North Side and continuing
 15 to provide services today, not only on the North Side of
 16 --- of Pittsburgh, but also throughout the State of
 17 Pennsylvania and the other five states in which we are in.
 18 We could not do it without the support of
 19 communities and we greatly appreciate this recognition
 20 today, so thank everybody for that.
 21 (Applause.)

 23 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Come on up front for
 24 pictures. Come on up front.

 26 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. The next one,

 30 MR. BARKER: A proclamation naming April 2017 as
 31 "Autism Awareness Month" in Allegheny County. Sponsored
 32 by Council Members Catena ---
 33 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Oh, they're here?
 34 MR. BARKER: --- Baker, DeFazio ---.
 35 MR. FUTULES: They're here.
 36 MR. BARKER: Who's here?
 37 MR. FUTULES: He says they're here.
 38 MR. PALMIERE: I was looking for Benita. I'm
 39 sorry. Go ahead. Do this one and we'll do ours next.
 40 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Well, let's do this
 41 one and then ---.
 42 MR. BARKER: Sponsored by Council Members
 43 Catena, Baker, DeFazio, DeMarco, Ellenbogen, Futules,
 44 Kirk, Klein, Kress, Macey, Martoni, Means, Palmiere,
 45 Ranalli-Russell and Walton.

1 Catena, DeFazio, DeMarco, Ellenbogen, Futules, Kirk,
 2 Klein, Kress, Macey, Martoni, Means, Palmiere and Walton.
 3 MS. RANALLI-RUSSELL: Thank you. Uh-huh (yes).
 4 Hi, everybody. First of all, I want to thank Pressley
 5 Ridge for --- on their occasion of 185th anniversary and
 6 thank them for everything that they've done for the kids
 7 and to keep kids and their families together.
 8 They have a school of --- for autism, and for
 9 deaf children, and for children that have behavioral
 10 problems. And like I said, they try to do whatever they
 11 can to keep the children and their families together, so
 12 thank you very much. It's nice to know that they have
 13 places out there like that.
 14 So this is Brad. Oh, this is Ron. I'm sorry.
 15 That's right. Brad, and he is the chairman of the board
 16 for Pressley Ridge. And this is Susanne Cole. She's the
 17 president and CEO. And Jesse over here, is the Western
 18 Pennsylvania executive director. And then Ron is the
 19 director of development. And Lisa Kahle, where is she at?
 20 Oh, there she is. And she is the manager and --- of
 21 marketing and development.
 22 So I am going to read the proclamation.
 23 WHEREAS, since 1832, Pressley Ridge has worked
 24 tirelessly to create success for children, adults and
 25 families who are facing difficult challenges and complex
 26 situations; and
 27 WHEREAS, located in Pittsburgh's North Side,
 28 Pressley Ridge began as the Protestant Home for Children
 29 and the Pittsburgh and Allegheny Home for the Friendless,
 30 two of Pittsburgh's oldest child care agencies; and
 31 WHEREAS, in 1969, the Protestant Home for
 32 Children and the Home for the Friendless merged and the
 33 combined program was named Pressley Ridge School. In
 34 1985, Pressley Ridge School was renamed Pressley Ridge
 35 Schools to reflect the organization's diverse programs and
 36 locations; and
 37 WHEREAS, today, Pressley Ridge serves
 38 communities in six states including Delaware, Maryland,
 39 Ohio and Pennsylvania, Virginia and West Virginia, and
 40 internationally in Hungary and Portugal; and
 41 WHEREAS, from mental health and foster care
 42 services to residential treatment facilities and education
 43 for children with special needs, including autism and
 44 deafness, Pressley Ridge empowers more than 6,800 children

1 MR. CATENA: Good evening, everyone. It's a
 2 pleasure to be here today and honor Autism Awareness
 3 Month.
 4 Eleven (11) years ago, if you would have asked
 5 me personally what I knew about autism, I would have told
 6 you honestly, very little. Since then, it's affected my
 7 family, and I've become not only very educated on the
 8 subject of autism, but become an advocate for autistic
 9 individuals.
 10 Today, I would like to ask you one simple thing.
 11 In order to raise public awareness and understand autism a
 12 little bit more, I challenge you to look and understand to
 13 see what autism actually is, because so many people don't
 14 understand the disorder and what it affects and what it
 15 is. And there's no one thing that clearly identifies it.
 16 Each autistic individual is highly different and highly
 17 --- highly individualistic.
 18 And we need to challenge ourselves to learn more
 19 about it, and then basically hand that education down to
 20 our children, our grandchildren, nieces, nephews, whoever.
 21 Because the more education we can provide about the
 22 subject, the better off and the easier it is for the
 23 individuals that have it, autism, on a daily basis.
 24 So again, thank you for coming this evening, and
 25 I'd like to now read the proclamation. And Mr. Kleppick
 26 is here, Joe Kleppick. He's a board member of Autism
 27 Speaks for the Greater Pittsburgh Chapter. For the
 28 Allegheny County Council proclamation ---.
 29 WHEREAS, autism is a developmental disability
 30 impacting one in 68 children in the United States; and
 31 WHEREAS, autism, for which there is no cure, is
 32 the result of a neurological disorder that affects the
 33 normal functioning of the human brain, and can affect
 34 anyone, regardless of race, ethnicity, gender, or
 35 socioeconomic background; and
 36 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania became the seventh state
 37 to pass Autism Insurance Reform through proactive
 38 advocacy; and
 39 WHEREAS, over 375,000 people have walked to
 40 raise funds and awareness for autism in western
 41 Pennsylvania since 2005; and
 42 WHEREAS, over 45,000 online resources have been
 43 provided to western Pennsylvania residents impacted by
 44 autism; and

1 WHEREAS, Pittsburgh is in the Autism Treatment
 2 Network, one of 14 cutting-edge medical centers in the
 3 country; and
 4 WHEREAS, Allegheny County is honored to take
 5 part in the annual observance of Autism Awareness Month in
 6 the hope that it will lead to a better understanding of
 7 the disorder in our community and beyond,
 8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Allegheny
 9 County Council hereby asks for all County residents to
 10 help raise public awareness of autism and the many issues
 11 surrounding the disorder, and does hereby declare April
 12 2017 to be "Autism Awareness Month" in Allegheny County.
 13 Thank you.
 14 (Applause.)
 15 MR. KLEPPICK: I just wanted to say a special
 16 thanks to all members of Council, but especially,
 17 Councilmen Catena, Baker and Martoni, and all members of
 18 Council for their support for this proclamation. And it
 19 affects all residents of Allegheny County who are affected
 20 as autism as well. They appreciate the support. Thank
 21 you very much.
 22 (Applause.)
 23 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: I'd like to be added by name
 24 on there.
 25 MR. BARKER: Good enough.
 26 MR. WALTON: We're all on there
 27 MR. BARKER: Uh-huh (yes). Actually, yes. You
 28 already are on.
 29 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.
 30 (Pictures taken.)
 31 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. We're going --- we'll
 32 go back to 10112-17.
 33 MR. BARKER: A proclamation congratulating RyKai
 34 Wright, a Community College of Allegheny County student,
 35 for being selected as one of only six Achieving the Dream
 36 2017 DREAM Scholars nationwide. Sponsored by Council
 37 Members Palmiere, Martoni, Baker, Catena, DeFazio,
 38 DeMarco, Ellenbogen, Futules, Kirk, Klein, Kress, Macey,
 39 Means, Ranalli-Russell and Walton.
 40 MR. PALMIERE, Thank you, Mr. President,
 41 Members of Council, ladies and gentleman, it's a pleasure
 42 today for me to --- to be up here standing with RyKai.
 43 She achieved something that has a --- brought a real honor
 44 to CCAC and the community. She's become a DREAM Scholar
 45 nationwide. Nationwide for --- this --- for 2017. And I

1 well as in her community, and wishes her much success in
 2 all of her future endeavors.
 3 Now let RyKai have a --- have the stage.
 4 Congratulations.
 5 MS. WRIGHT: Thank you.
 6 (Applause.)
 7 MS. WRIGHT: I just want to share a funny story.
 8 When I applied for DREAM, I actually thought that it was
 9 one of six out of CCAC, not out of the country. So when I
 10 found out about it, I was extremely happy and it was a
 11 really great experience.
 12 Flying to San Francisco was actually my first
 13 time on the west coast of the --- of America, so that was
 14 great. And I just want to thank CCAC, Achieving the
 15 Dream, Best of the Batch Foundation and my family for
 16 coming out here tonight to congratulate me, and thank you
 17 for this recognition.
 18 MR. PALMIERE: You're quite welcome.
 19 (Applause.)
 20 MS. WRIGHT: Thank you.
 21 MS. MAXWELL: I'll just say that I had the ---
 22 I've had the pleasure of getting to know RyKai and
 23 traveling with her to San Francisco. And on behalf of
 24 everyone at CCAC, we're just so proud of her and her
 25 accomplishments and thank you very much for recognizing
 26 her this evening.
 27 MR. PALMIERE: All right. Thank you for coming.
 28 (Applause.)
 29 MR. PALMIERE: I want you to hold this up very
 30 proudly in the middle there. Okay? Come right over.
 31 (Pictures taken.)
 32 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: 10114-17.
 33 MR. BARKER: A proclamation naming April 2017 as
 34 "Sarcoidosis Awareness Month" in Allegheny County,
 35 Sponsored by Council Members Kirk, Baker, Catena, DeFazio,
 36 DeMarco, Ellenbogen, Futules, Klein, Kress, Macey,
 37 Martoni, Means, Palmiere, Ranalli-Russell and Walton.
 38 MS. KIRK: Hi, I'm --- I'm Cindy Kirk and I'd
 39 like to introduce you to the following people.
 40 This is Paul Dickerson and Laura Henderson, who
 41 are both patient ambassadors for the Foundation for
 42 Sarcoidosis Research.
 43 And on the end, we have our prominent doctor
 44 here, Dr. Kevin Gibson. He's the medical director of the
 45 University of Pittsburgh, Dorothy P. and Richard P.

1 wanted to have her come up because I think this is one of
 2 the important things about, during proclamations, that we
 3 have people that come up here that really have achieved
 4 something really great and to bring --- and to bring
 5 recognition to Allegheny County, and this young lady has
 6 certainly done that. So I just want to introduce
 7 everybody. This is RyKai and this is Dr. Maxwell from
 8 CCAC. Just welcome them, everybody, please.
 9 (Applause.)
 10 MR. PALMIERE: I'm going to let RyKai have the
 11 stage here, in a minute, but I want to read the
 12 proclamation. Okay?
 13 WHEREAS, RyKai Wright, a student at Community
 14 College of Allegheny County, CCAC, has been selected as
 15 one of only six Achieving the Dream 2017 DREAM Scholars
 16 nationwide and, as such, will have the opportunity to
 17 attend the annual DREAM conference where she will engage
 18 with other community college leaders to bring about
 19 powerful change for student success; and
 20 WHEREAS, Ms. Wright has excelled in her studies
 21 and will graduate this spring with an Associate of Science
 22 in Engineering Technology-Mechanical and earn an
 23 additional Associate degree in Mathematics and Sciences
 24 this summer with plans to transfer to a four-year
 25 university in the fall to earn her Bachelor's degree in
 26 Mechanical Engineering; and
 27 WHEREAS, Ms. Wright has demonstrated leadership
 28 as a member and an officer of Phi Theta Kappa Honor
 29 Society, Alpha Iota Eta chapter, as an ambassador for the
 30 CCAC Honors Program, and she's also Student Ambassador
 31 Program, and as a tutor for high school students. I don't
 32 know how she has time to do all this. God bless her.
 33 That's just wonderful; and
 34 WHEREAS, Ms. Wright has provided outstanding
 35 community service through her work for the Best of the
 36 Batch Foundation, where, as a program intern, she works as
 37 the foundation's volunteer coordinator and performs many
 38 other duties that promote the great work of the foundation
 39 to benefit thousands of unserved children in Southwestern
 40 Pennsylvania;
 41 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the County
 42 of Allegheny County Council enthusiastically recognizes
 43 RyKai Wright's achievements as an outstanding student
 44 leader at the Community College of Allegheny County, as

1 Simmons Center for Interstitial Lung Disease. He's the
 2 Associate Professor of medicine in the Division of
 3 Pulmonary, Allergy and Critical Care Medicine and
 4 Assistant Professor in the Department of Neurobiology,
 5 Anatomy and Cell Sciences at the University of Pittsburgh
 6 School of Medicine.
 7 And they're here to help promote the awareness
 8 of sarcoidosis.
 9 So I'm going to start with the proclamation and
 10 then, perhaps you can say a few words.
 11 WHEREAS, sarcoidosis is an inflammatory disease
 12 that can affect almost any organ in the body. While a
 13 person's immune system normally protects the body from
 14 infection and disease, those with sarcoidosis have
 15 overactive immune systems that result in damage to the
 16 body's own tissues. While the cause of this disease is
 17 currently unknown, research suggests that there's --- that
 18 bacteria, viruses or chemicals may trigger its onset; and
 19 WHEREAS, once thought rare, sarcoidosis is now
 20 known to be common and affects people worldwide. The
 21 disease can affect people of any age, race and gender.
 22 However, it is most common among adults between the ages
 23 of 20 and 40 and in certain ethnic groups; and
 24 WHEREAS, in the United States, sarcoidosis most
 25 commonly targets the lungs and the lymph nodes, but the
 26 disease can and usually does affect other organs as well,
 27 including the skin, eyes, liver, salivary glands, sinuses,
 28 kidneys, heart, bones, muscles, brain and nervous system.
 29 You can see how it can be a very serious illness; and
 30 WHEREAS, the nationally and internationally
 31 recognized University of Pittsburgh Simmons Center has ---
 32 for Interstitial Lung Disease at UPMC is one of three
 33 centers in the nation, alongside the Cleveland Clinic and
 34 the Mayo Clinic, providing management of the disease and
 35 translating the latest scientific findings into improved
 36 patient care; and
 37 WHEREAS, we recognize Dr. Kevin F. Gibson, a
 38 pulmonary physician with the University of Pittsburgh, for
 39 his work with patients and for leading studies on the
 40 etiology, diagnosis and treatment of sarcoidosis. We also
 41 salute the victims of sarcoidosis who demonstrate great
 42 courage and determination in their efforts to cope with
 43 the disease, and we pay tribute to their family members
 44 who are engaged in efforts to promote awareness of

1 sarcoidosis, as well as improved treatment and support for
 2 its victims;
 3 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the
 4 Allegheny County Council does hereby proclaim April 2017
 5 as "Sarcoidosis Awareness Month" in Allegheny County, and
 6 we urge the citizens of Allegheny County to increase their
 7 understanding of this potentially fatal disease.
 8 Sponsored by myself and all the members of Council,
 9 presented this 19th day of April, 2017.
 10 (Applause.)
 11 MS. KIRK: So would you like to say a
 12 couple ---?
 13 MR. DICKERSON: Good evening. I just wanted to
 14 thank the Council, especially Councilwoman Kirk, for
 15 allowing this proclamation to happen.
 16 I've been a sufferer of the disease since 1999.
 17 It was probably --- am now understanding I was --- I was
 18 exposed in the first Trade Center bombing back in '93, and
 19 that's probably where it originated from. So with that in
 20 mind, it's really outstanding to get more recognition,
 21 more awareness and more research dollars going into
 22 funding what can be very devastating for some people and I
 23 thank you very much.
 24 (Applause.)
 25 MS. HENDERSON: Good afternoon. As I am not an
 26 Allegheny County resident, I'm coming from Aliquippa,
 27 Pennsylvania, which is Beaver County, I'm presenting their
 28 support as well. It's from the proclamation given to me
 29 by our Mayor and also supporting them, declaring April
 30 Sarcoidosis Awareness Month.
 31 This is going on my fifth year of my diagnosis.
 32 My sarcoidosis is systemic. It affects nearly all of my
 33 organ systems, my eyes, my larynx. Sometimes I can't talk
 34 over a whisper --- my lungs, my skin, down to my bones.
 35 I just thank you all for being present and being
 36 here to acknowledge Sarcoidosis Awareness, and I challenge
 37 you guys to do your own research. Google it. Look it up.
 38 See how it affects us, and thank you for your support.
 39 Thank you.
 40 (Applause.)
 41 DR. GIBSON: Well, thank you very much. I can't
 42 express enough how proud I am to be here.
 43 You know, when I --- when I talk about this
 44 disease to my patients, I always Google sarcoidosis. And
 45 there's a --- there's actually a presidential

1 WHEREAS, April 27th, 2017 is Fair Housing Month
 2 and marks the 49th anniversary of the passage of the Fair
 3 Housing Act signed by U.S. President Lyndon Baines Johnson
 4 on April 11th, 1968; and
 5 WHEREAS, the federal Fair Housing Act prohibits
 6 discrimination because of race, color, religion, national
 7 origin, sex, familial status or disability; and
 8 WHEREAS, Allegheny County includes the bases
 9 under the Fair Housing Act and also prohibits
 10 discrimination because of age, ancestry or place of birth,
 11 marital status, sexual orientation, gender --- gender
 12 identity, expression and status as a user or trainer of a
 13 guide or support animals; and
 14 WHEREAS, Allegheny County Council recognizes the
 15 work of the Department of Housing and Urban Development,
 16 the Allegheny County Human Relations Commission, the
 17 Pittsburgh Commission on Human Relations, and the Fair
 18 Housing Partnership of Greater Pittsburgh, which ensures
 19 the protection of fair housing rights; and
 20 WHEREAS, the --- Allegheny County supports equal
 21 housing opportunity and housing choice in accordance with
 22 the Fair Housing Act, not only during Fair Housing Month
 23 in April, but throughout the entire year;
 24 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the
 25 Allegheny County Council hereby proclaims April 2017 as
 26 "Fair Housing Month" in Allegheny County and encourages
 27 all Allegheny County individuals and organizations, public
 28 and private, to join and work together in this observance
 29 for free and equal housing treatment and opportunity for
 30 all. Sponsored by Allegheny County Council and attested
 31 to by John DeFazio, President of Council. Thank you.
 32 (Applause.)
 33 MR. WALTON: Cassie, do you want --- you want to
 34 say something?
 35 MS. COLLINGE: Thank you, everyone. Thank you
 36 for your kind words, Councilman Walton. I want to thank
 37 all of County Council for this proclamation, and your
 38 support and recognition of Fair Housing Month and the work
 39 that we at Allegheny County Economic Development do to
 40 create and preserve affordable housing and also to promote
 41 fair housing.
 42 In 2016, we financed the creation of 141 new
 43 affordable housing opportunities and financed the repairs
 44 of the --- of 25 existing homes. We have some great
 45 activities underway for 2017, including the creation of

1 proclamation, back in 1991, from George Hiram Bush,
 2 proclaiming a National Sarcoidosis Awareness Day. And
 3 unfortunately, it didn't get much traction because most
 4 people are still not aware of it.
 5 This is a disease that's actually being
 6 diagnosed more often, and the mortality rate is actually
 7 rising, and this is despite effective therapies. They're
 8 sometimes difficult therapies to get.
 9 And so this is a --- this is really a timely
 10 event to call attention to this disease, and I hope that
 11 this time, we'll get a lot more traction. Certainly,
 12 we're looking to do that in Allegheny County and beyond.
 13 And again, I want to thank you all for helping
 14 us to accomplish this. Thank you.
 15 (Applause.)
 16 (Pictures taken.)

 19 MR. BARKER: A proclamation naming April 2017 as
 20 "Fair Housing Month" in Allegheny County. Sponsored by
 21 Council Members Walton, Baker, Catena, DeFazio, DeMarco,
 22 Ellenbogen, Futules, Kirk, Klein, Kress, Macey, Martoni,
 23 Means, Palmiere and Ranalli-Russell.
 24 MR. WALTON: Good afternoon. Here with me is
 25 Ms. Cassandra Collinge, the Assistant Director of Housing
 26 and Human Services for the Allegheny County Economic
 27 Development Department. It is an extreme privilege for me
 28 to be here with Cathy. I have had the opportunity to work
 29 with her very --- on a regular basis over the last 16
 30 months and --- on various projects. And I find her to be
 31 a truly competent and committed individual and a great
 32 reflection of what the --- the Allegheny County employees
 33 are doing. So to you, Cassie, it's a privilege for me to
 34 be here with you again.
 35 But April is Fair Housing Month. There is an
 36 incredible challenge for fair housing and affordable
 37 housing in Allegheny County. And we have to find a way to
 38 ensure that as we continue to develop projects in this
 39 County that we don't unreasonably displace individuals who
 40 have real troubles and challenges finding fair and
 41 affordable housing as development continues. And to that
 42 end, we have a lot of work to do. And we on the County
 43 Council, and the County Executive and his staff, are
 44 committed to making sure that that takes place.
 45 So with that ---

1 new affordable housing communities in Glassport, Mount
 2 Lebanon and Forest Hills.
 3 Again, I want to thank you for your support in
 4 recognition of our efforts and your support of Fair
 5 Housing Month. Thanks.
 6 (Applause.)
 7 (Pictures taken.)
 8 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: 10116-17.
 9 MR. BARKER: A proclamation commending the
 10 Allegheny County Department of Public Works for achieving
 11 their second reaccreditation by the American Public Works
 12 Association. Sponsored by Council Members Macey, Baker,
 13 Catena, DeFazio, DeMarco, Ellenbogen, Futules, Kirk,
 14 Klein, Kress, Martoni, Means, Palmiere, Ranalli-Russell
 15 and Walton.
 16 MR. MACEY: Good afternoon, members of Council
 17 and residents of Allegheny County.
 18 I'm blessed to be here for the third time for
 19 this second accreditation from the American Public Works
 20 Association, and that's a good thing. It's even better
 21 for the fact that we're the only Public Works in the State
 22 of Pennsylvania that has received this accreditation.
 23 And it gets even more exciting when we think
 24 about Act 89 and the money that's coming in for the
 25 infrastructure, and for the roads and bridges in our
 26 community. I can't tell you the last time I've received a
 27 complaint about a road or a bridge in my district. Things
 28 are being done. They're being done quickly and they're
 29 --- and as Rich Fitzgerald said last meeting, 50 miles of
 30 roads were done in Allegheny County, and we're hoping to
 31 do that again.
 32 We have another interesting project that has
 33 received some, you know, concerns, and that is the
 34 Mon-Fayette Expressway. And the reason why I bring this
 35 up is because the more people who understand what that
 36 Mon-Fayette Expressway, the completion of it, will do for
 37 the Turtle Creek Valley and the Mon Valley, needs to be
 38 addressed and stated over and over again.
 39 You're looking at 20,000 jobs, not to mention
 40 the jobs that will be created from the construction and
 41 the infrastructure. It will bring those communities back
 42 to prosperity. It hopefully will bring more people to our
 43 communities and open up all of Southwestern Pennsylvania
 44 for --- for businesses and residents.

1 But now that I've taken a little literary
 2 license to say my speech, I'd like to invite Steve
 3 Shanley, the Director of Public Works; Harry L. Weed,
 4 Director of Region Two, American Public Works Association;
 5 Mike Dillon, Deputy Director of the Allegheny County
 6 Department of Public works; George Thompson, Deputy
 7 Director of Maintenance Operations; Jill Budny, Financial
 8 Manager of Allegheny County Public Works; and last but not
 9 least, Cathy Trexler, Manager Analyst, Accreditation
 10 Manager of the Allegheny County Public Works.
 11 I've said, on many occasion that our Public
 12 Works Department has done more with less. And I think
 13 that --- and I think across the County Council districts,
 14 we're getting more and more work done, and we're having
 15 those type of concerns, roads, potholes. We don't just
 16 fix potholes anymore. We take a whole lane out and repair
 17 it. We have our new equipment that our people use.
 18 And what's nice, if you watch these guys work,
 19 these ladies and men work, they're like a well-oiled
 20 machine, no pun intended. But they do a great, great job.
 21 And you can see the excitement in their eyes when they get
 22 on the job, and how they try to do the best they can with
 23 what they got.
 24 Well, enough of me. Let's talk about what's
 25 going on here, and that is a proclamation for Public
 26 Works.
 27 WHEREAS, the Allegheny County Department of
 28 Public Works is responsible for the administration of all
 29 contracts involving the construction, reconstruction,
 30 alteration, repair and involvement of County roads and
 31 bridges; and
 32 WHEREAS, the Allegheny County Department of
 33 Public Works maintains and improves more than 340 miles of
 34 roads and over 550 bridges and culverts; and
 35 WHEREAS, the Allegheny County Department of
 36 Public Works ensures the safety and reliability of the
 37 County's vehicle fleet; and
 38 WHEREAS, the Allegheny County Department of
 39 Public Works has made a commitment to continuous
 40 improvement in the delivery of Public Works' operations
 41 and services in the communities; and
 42 WHEREAS, accreditation through the American
 43 Public Works Association recognizes that an agency's
 44 policies, procedures and practices have been evaluated
 45 against nationally recognized, recommended practices; and

1 well-managed, able to demonstrate compliance with the
 2 recommended practices and dedicated to continuous
 3 improvement of the Public Works' facilities and services.
 4 Agencies first complete a self-assessment. They
 5 make improvements to their operations and management
 6 policies, practices and procedures, to comply with the
 7 recommended practices established in the Public Works
 8 Management Practices Manual. The accreditation process
 9 involves a review of the goals established by the agency
 10 and an onsite accreditation visit.
 11 During the accreditation visit, a team of
 12 reviewers examine the agency's documentation and conducts
 13 interviews with selected agency staff. The accreditation
 14 visit may also include interviews with the agency's chief
 15 elected or appointed official and members of the
 16 community.
 17 The Allegheny County Department of Public Works
 18 formally applied for and received accreditation in
 19 November of 2007. Since then, first --- since first
 20 achieving this, the initial accreditation, the agency was
 21 reaccrredited in 2012. And for the agency's second
 22 reaccrreditation, an APWA sanctioned team completed the
 23 evaluation site visit December 2016. The evaluation team
 24 members traveled from Glenview, Illinois; Fishers,
 25 Indiana; Kansas City, Missouri. The APWA Accreditation
 26 Council awarded full reaccrreditation to the Department of
 27 Public Works on December 29th, 2016.
 28 Accreditation is a program of continuous
 29 improvement and the designation is awarded for a four-year
 30 period. We will anticipate a visit again in 2020, as your
 31 agency and district applies for reaccrreditation. A total
 32 of 121 practices were reviewed with all meeting full
 33 compliance standards. This is an outstanding record, and
 34 director Stephen Shanley, accreditation manager Cathy
 35 Trexler and the entire staff in the department are to be
 36 commended for their efforts.
 37 On behalf of the American Public Works
 38 Association, it's my pleasure to award the formal
 39 reaccrreditation plaque to the Allegheny County Department
 40 of Public Works. Agencies have found this program
 41 valuable by the overwhelming benefit, is the department
 42 having reviewed every aspect of their operation and better
 43 yet, developing well-documented procedures which allow
 44 every employee to easily determine how to perform their
 45 job to the best of their ability.

1 WHEREAS, the Allegheny County Department of
 2 Public Works first received accreditation status in
 3 November 2007 and was awarded the first reaccrreditation in
 4 2012, and their second reaccrreditation on December 29th,
 5 2016;
 6 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, Allegheny County
 7 Council, the employees of the Allegheny County Department
 8 of Public Works are to be recognized for administrating
 9 their commitment to excellence by achieving their second
 10 reaccrreditation through the American Public Works
 11 Association. Congratulations.
 12 (Applause.)
 13 MR. MACEY: Everybody, come on.
 14 MR. WEED: Good evening, Mr. President, members
 15 of the Council. My name is Harry Weed. I'm the region
 16 two director. Region two is New York, New Jersey,
 17 Pennsylvania and Delaware for the American Public Works
 18 Association.
 19 Public Works accreditation for Allegheny County
 20 is probably one of the best bang for the buck you're going
 21 to get. The money spent affects every resident that has
 22 --- that comes in contact every day.
 23 Unlike police or fire, some people may never
 24 come in contact with a --- have anything to do with police
 25 or fire in all the years of living there. Yet every day,
 26 whether it's your garbage, your water, your sewer, you
 27 flush the toilet, no matter what happens --- you turn on
 28 that light switch, that's Public Works. The roads that
 29 --- the potholes, the curbs, streetlights, you know, I can
 30 go on and on, but everyone is affected by Public Works
 31 every day. So this is an accreditation that is well worth
 32 what it --- what it is.
 33 Accreditation is a mark of professionalism,
 34 including indicating that a Public Works agency has made
 35 the commitment to continuous improvement in the delivery
 36 of Public Works operation and services in the community.
 37 Accreditation recognizes an agency's policies, procedures
 38 and practices, which have been evaluated against
 39 nationally recognized management practices determined to
 40 be appropriate for the specific agency.
 41 The accreditation program, which began in 1995,
 42 the city of Greeley, Colorado became the first agency to
 43 receive this designation in 1997.
 44 This program is important to the agencies
 45 seeking a method to demonstrate the agency is

1 Cost-saving of manpower is demonstrated through
 2 careful review of procedures to ensure efforts are not
 3 being duplicated in several divisions within the same
 4 department. The purchasing of materials is often
 5 consolidated, which allows for a reduction of costs as
 6 well. And several agencies have experienced dramatic
 7 savings in paid-out insurance claims by instituting new
 8 policies, procedures that have reduced their liability.
 9 Insurance pools are recognizing the benefit of agencies
 10 being accredited and offering discounts.
 11 Today there are 121 agencies accredited in North
 12 America. Allegheny County Department of Public Works
 13 became the 46th agency to complete the self-assessment
 14 process and achieve accreditation, and remains the only
 15 agency in the State of Pennsylvania.
 16 Congratulations on a job well done, and this is
 17 truly my honor to be here tonight to present this to this
 18 fine group. Thank you.
 19 (Applause.)
 20 MR. MACEY: Go ahead, Steve, please.
 21 MR. SHANLEY: I just wanted to thank my staff.
 22 None of the work is done without a great staff, and they
 23 work hard all the time.
 24 121 practices with managing over 500 bridges,
 25 400 miles of road and over 700 vehicles. A lot of work
 26 with putting capital projects out and maintaining the
 27 structure throughout the year. Our operations, staff has
 28 always done an excellent job. Staff in our office
 29 downtown here have great support and great support in the
 30 field, too --- our laborers, drivers, the operators, so we
 31 have great staff.
 32 And even the staff, County Executive and the
 33 County Manager, they're backing us up with equipment.
 34 We're getting new vactor machines and the milling and
 35 paving machines. You can all see that in your districts,
 36 that we're trying to improve everything we're doing. So
 37 hopefully, it's working out.
 38 We seem to see a light at the end of the tunnel
 39 with a lot of work we're doing. We're working on 7th
 40 Street downtown, here. 10th Street will be under
 41 construction pretty soon, too. So a lot of work going on,
 42 and the dedicated staff do a lot of work, so I appreciate
 43 all their support.
 44 I want to keep moving forward and keep moving
 45 the County forward, and we appreciate this honor with this

1 award. I'll be one tool in our toolbox that'll help us
 2 improve --- keep moving forward.
 3 Thank you, Council President and Council for
 4 your support also. So we can't do it without your support
 5 and the funding, so I appreciate that. So thank you.
 6 (Applause.)
 7 MR. MACEY: Anybody else?
 8 MR. ELLENBOGEN: Mr. President?
 9 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Yeah. Go ahead.
 10 MR. ELLENBOGEN: Point of personal privilege.
 11 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Go ahead.
 12 MR. ELLENBOGEN: You know, 20-some years ago,
 13 long before there was Public Works in Allegheny County,
 14 there was Special and Emergency Services. We were the
 15 folks that --- and actually, I had the pleasure of being
 16 the chief of operations then, and we were the folks that
 17 people used to say when everybody else was running away
 18 from something, we were the ones running to it.
 19 When I was chief, I had a young cowboy that
 20 worked for me that I always say is responsible for me
 21 turning my hair gray at a young age, and I used to say
 22 that he had a tremendous amount of talent.
 23 And we dealt with things like 427, when it
 24 crashed, the Pitcairn flood, the Mount Washington tornado.
 25 Anything that was really bad, our guys were the guys that
 26 were out there.
 27 And I used to tell this youngster that one of
 28 these days just keep the talent that --- I think that if
 29 he keeps out of trouble, which --- believe me when I tell
 30 you he turned my hair white --- that he had a great career
 31 ahead of him. And I'm so proud to see him here tonight,
 32 Mr. George Thompson, among this fine crew of folks that
 33 have done a wonderful job. And George, I'm proud of you.
 34 I'm just glad I lived to see you.
 35 MR. THOMPSON: Thank you.
 36 (Applause.)
 37 (Pictures taken.)
 38 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: 10117-17.
 39 MR. BARKER: A proclamation congratulating Mr.
 40 Tom Duer for being named Pennsylvania Big Brother of the
 41 Year and Ms. Lauren Schieb for being named Pennsylvania
 42 Big Sister of the Year. Sponsored by Council Members
 43 Ranalli-Russell, Walton and Baker.
 44 MR. BAKER: All right. Thanks, Mr. President.

1 Kirk, I see that. And Samir, I was wondering if you could
 2 sign one for Council President Defazio here. We've got a
 3 black Sharpie there for you. So we'll get one to
 4 Councilman Defazio and we'll put that up in the Council
 5 office.
 6 And Councilwoman Ranalli-Russell, do you have a
 7 word or two to say?
 8 MS. RANALLI-RUSSELL: Yes. Just for Tom and
 9 Lauren, just having somebody to be there and listen to
 10 them, that's what makes it, you know, so special, and
 11 thank you for everything that you do for the --- for your
 12 little brothers and little sisters.
 13 MR. BAKER: Okay. I will read the proclamation
 14 now, then.
 15 WHEREAS, Allegheny County is fortunate to have a
 16 number of teachers, community volunteers and individuals
 17 who support the mentoring movement and who work selflessly
 18 to improve our children's odds for success in overcoming
 19 adversity; and
 20 WHEREAS, each year Big Brothers Big Sisters of
 21 Pennsylvania selects a deserving Big Brother and a Big
 22 Sister who exemplify the best of one-to-one mentoring; and
 23 WHEREAS, Big Brothers Big Sisters of PA has
 24 selected Mr. Tom Duer and Ms. Lauren Schieb as the 2017
 25 Big Brother and Big Sister of the Year; and
 26 WHEREAS, Mr. Tom Duer, an entrepreneur from
 27 Stanton Heights, has served as a Big Brother to Little
 28 Brother Samir for over four years. Ms. Lauren Schieb of
 29 Highland Park is a special education teacher at Woodland
 30 Hills, and has served as a Big Sister for six years to
 31 Shyae, a student at Pittsburgh Obama Academy, and
 32 WHEREAS, Mr. Duer and Samir and Ms. Schieb and
 33 Shyae have enjoyed a variety of fun and worthwhile
 34 experiences and created a lifetime of memories;
 35 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the
 36 Allegheny County Council does hereby congratulate Mr. Tom
 37 Duer and Ms. Lauren Schieb for being named the 2017 Big
 38 Brother and Big Sister of the Year, and we thank each of
 39 them for serving as a positive role model, to children
 40 here in our community, to helping Samir and our other
 41 great littles succeed.
 42 Sponsored by myself, Councilwoman
 43 Ranalli-Russell and Councilman Walton, and presented this
 44 19th day of April, 2017.
 45 **Congratulations.**

1 We're going to call up Big Brother of the Year
 2 for Pennsylvania, Tom Duer, Big Sister of the Year for
 3 Pennsylvania, Lauren Schieb and Little Brother of the Year
 4 for Pennsylvania, Mr. Samir. So thanks very much to all
 5 three of you for being here tonight.
 6 I'm proud to sponsor this with Councilman Walton
 7 and Councilwoman Denise Ranalli-Russell, who are the
 8 Council members where these two fine folks live in
 9 Allegheny County.
 10 Out of Pittsburgh, there are 1,483 bigs. So Tom
 11 and Lauren, to become the bigs of the year in Greater
 12 Pittsburgh, that was out of 1,483 when they got --- they
 13 won for Pittsburgh. Then they got nominated statewide.
 14 Out of Pennsylvania, there are over 10,000 bigs in our
 15 state. So Tom and Lauren had a one out of 10,000 odds of
 16 being the best bigs in Pennsylvania, and we're very happy
 17 that, as the City of Champions, that Tom and Lauren are
 18 representing us at the national level as well. So we're
 19 very proud of them.
 20 I will say we spent --- I spent the day up in
 21 Harrisburg yesterday with our CEO Jan Glick, and we were
 22 talking about special moments with legislators. And when
 23 Jan was asked her favorite moment over her ten years as
 24 the CEO, she actually reminisced on an experience with Tom
 25 and Samir, and I think Samir jumping into a pool together
 26 with Tom, and just the bravery and just how amazing it was
 27 when they said that Samir trusted Tom.
 28 So these are great people. Tom and Lauren both
 29 serve on the big recruitment board which does a lot of
 30 great work to get the word out about Big Brothers, Big
 31 Sisters. Lauren is the current co-chair of that group and
 32 Tom does a great job recruiting right at his gym, the
 33 Pittsburgh Fitness Project. And as the person that does
 34 the volunteer trainings, we always talk about how people
 35 decide to get involved with Big Brothers, Big Sisters.

 37 go there to train, but they're like, oh, Tom Duer told me

1 (Applause.)
 2 MR. BAKER: Oh, okay.
 3 MR. DUER: I want to thank you guys for this
 4 honor. This is the first time I've been in a courthouse
 5 for a good reason, so that's a little nervous. Bear with
 6 me.
 7 Mentorship is really important. I lost my dad
 8 when I was Samir's age, actually, and --- I'll let Samir
 9 talk for a second.
 10 SAMIR: All I wanted to say is hello and thank
 11 you.
 12 (Applause.)
 13 MS. SCHIEB: I just want to say thank you to all
 14 of you for this honor. I've been really blessed to be
 15 matched with my little sister for six and a half years,
 16 and I've been on the board for two years. And I'm really
 17 excited to be here with Tom and Samir today. I feel like
 18 we are receiving this honor on behalf of all of the bigs
 19 in the organization that give their time every day to

 44 Sponsored by the Chief Executive and Council Member Means

1 MS MEANS Well, I am really excited today to
2 honor an employee that worked for the Public Defender's
3 Office for 44 years, and his name is Stephen Swem.
4 Think about how important the Public Defender's
5 Office is. You find yourself in a bad situation and then
6 someone comes to the rescue to give you legal help and
7 support in your need

8 And we have today the honor --- and it's my ---
9 it's our great heartfelt appreciation that we give this
10 proclamation for Stephen Swem. And when I read this
11 proclamation, you're going to fall in love with him. And
12 we are just so honored today to have the public defender,
13 Elliot Howsie, with us today, to accept this award for Mr.
14 Swem because he's feeling a little under the weather
15 today. So we have him here, so ---

16 And who else do you have with us?
17 MR. HOWSIE: We have a supervisor from our trial
18 division, Deputy Stacy Steiner, and our Deputy Director
19 Turahn Jenkins.

20 MS. MEANS: Well, thank you for coming. Thank
21 you. Thank you.

22 I'm going to read the proclamation and then you
23 can say a few words. And I share this proclamation with
24 the County Executive, Rich Fitzgerald, in honoring Mr.
25 Swem.

26 WHEREAS, after having graduated in 1968 from The
27 George Washington University with a Bachelor's degree in
28 International Affairs, Stephen P. Swem pursued his law
29 degree from Duquesne University School of Law. After
30 graduating in 1972 with his Juris Doctorate, he was
31 subsequently licensed to practice law in the Commonwealth
32 of Pennsylvania on October 2nd, 1972, and

33 WHEREAS, while pursuing his law degree, Stephen
34 spent his summers working for the Public Defender's
35 Office. On July 17th, 1973, he joined the Allegheny
36 County Office of the Public Defender as Assistant Public
37 Defender/Trial Defender where he has worked ever since;
38 and

39 WHEREAS, Steve is known among his colleagues and
40 members of the Court of Common Pleas as the advocate whose
41 success is based upon his wit and charm, just as much as
42 his legal acumen. He is fluent in three different
43 languages due to his love of history and culture; and

44 WHEREAS, Steve's understanding of human nature
45 and amusing storytelling capabilities both inspired and

1 with Allegheny --- or not retirement, not yet --- of work
2 with the Public Defender's Office, I can tell you that he
3 would have stood here and said he was thoroughly
4 undeserving, even though that is absolutely untrue. And
5 even though he will never admit it, I can tell you that
6 our office will be a lot dimmer without his presence. And
7 the clients, we are very lucky to --- he is lucky to have
8 served, will remember him and his memory will remain on in
9 our office for decades to come.

10 MR. HOWSIE: Thank you.
11 (Applause.)

12 MS. MEANS: Go get your picture taken.

1 entertained hundreds of college students at the Community
2 College of Allegheny County and Point Park University
3 where he taught for decades as part of the Humanities and
4 Human Science faculty; and

5 WHEREAS, during his 44-year career at the Office
6 of the Public Defender, he has successfully represented,
7 think about it, thousands of indigent clients with zeal,
8 compassion, humor and even when, as his eyesight
9 deteriorated over the years, Steve refused to let his
10 condition force him to leave the courtroom, office and the
11 clients that he loved so much; and

12 WHEREAS, Stephen P. Swem has announced his
13 retirement effective May 10th, 2017. Throughout his
14 career in the Public Defender's Office, he has embodied
15 the mission of providing competent and effective legal
16 counsel and has done so with his entire being. His
17 dedication to his office is unparalleled and his
18 commitment to his craft and his career has earned both the
19 esteem and the respect of his co-workers, fellow employees
20 and the residents of Allegheny County.

 22 Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, authorizing
 23 Townsquare Live Events, LLC to use the outdoor space
 24 adjacent to and behind the structure known as the
 25 Amphitheatre in the County's Hartwood Acres Park to
 26 conduct an event entitled The Glow Jack-O-Lantern
 27 Experience. Sponsored by the Chief Executive.
 28 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Representative Palmiere?
 29 MR. PALMIERE: Thank you, Mr. President. Mr.
 30 Baechle is here and I'd like him to come up and explain
 31 what this is about, please. This is for the benefit of
 32 those who weren't at the committee meeting.
 33 MR. BAECHLE: A group from New York has
 34 approached us to run a special event. It's around
 35 Halloween. It's not a scary event. It's mostly pumpkins.
 36 We've chosen to rent them a space at Hartwood, that does
 37 not interfere with anything else for approximately eight
 38 weeks, and they're going to have live and fake carved
 39 pumpkins.
 40 It's about a half a mile to a --- a two thirds
 41 of a mile walk, and their --- and they'll walk through one
 42 of the loops at Hartwood and experience the glow, the
 43 pumpkins.
 44 MR. PALMIERE: And Mr. McKain, do you want to
 45 fill us in ---?

1 MR. MCKAIN: Now, as we described it, the
 2 committee meeting, this is the first time that we've had
 3 this. We have a one year contract with them to evaluate
 4 it. They're national. Some of the committee members
 5 actually did some research at your meeting and said it
 6 looked like a fun family event.
 7 We think it will compliment a lot of the
 8 activities going in the park and we'll report back to
 9 Council to see how it goes. If it goes well, we'll
 10 probably ask to extend it and have some more time with
 11 them. But we think it's another nice activity that
 12 Council is approving for our visitors and our --- our
 13 residents.
 14 MR. PALMIERE: Thank you, gentlemen. And Mr.
 15 President, this was --- I want to send this back up here
 16 with an affirmative recommendation and move for approval.
 17 MR. MACEY: Second.
 18 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Under remarks?
 19 Representative Catena?
 20 MR. CATENA: Yes, Mr. President. I did some
 21 research on this. This is a very family-oriented event.
 22 For those of us that have children ten and under, there's
 23 so many haunted houses and stuff, but there's not a lot of
 24 family events out there around Halloween and fall, and
 25 this is a nice family event. It's a walk through. It's
 26 displays of pumpkins, basically.
 27 It's a great use of the area at Hartwood Acres
 28 and it's reminiscent --- it reminds me of the time that we
 29 had the lights, obviously, at Hartwood. So I'm glad that
 30 this is being done. So thank you, Mr. Manager.
 31 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Representative Kress?
 32 MR. KRESS: Thank you, Mr. President. Since
 33 this is Hartwood Acres in my district, I say it's a great
 34 event. In regards to the contract, though, aren't we
 35 receiving a monetary amount?
 36 MR. MCKAIN: \$20,000.
 37 MR. KRESS: Yeah, that makes it even better that
 38 we're getting --- no, I'm saying we're getting revenue ---
 39 MR. MCKAIN: We are.
 40 MR. KRESS: --- from other sources. I mean,
 41 we're always worried about raising property taxes. But
 42 the goal is to try to bring revenue into our County
 43 through other sources besides taxes.
 44 MR. MCKAIN: Absolutely, and that was discussed
 45 at committee. And again, after we measure it, if it is a

1 success, and I think we'll come back with maybe a higher
 2 number next time. But we are bringing revenues to the
 3 County.
 4 MR. KRESS: The only thing is I think Councilman
 5 Futules wants to carve some of the pumpkins.
 6 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Representative Futules?
 7 MR. FUTULES: That's not true. I am assuming
 8 that there will be a monetary charge for the event because
 9 if they're paying us, they must be taking something in?
 10 MR. BAECHLE: That's correct.
 11 MR. FUTULES: Okay.
 12 MR. BAECHLE: It will be around \$19, I believe.
 13 MR. FUTULES: Okay. I thought so. Thank you.
 14 MR. BAECHLE: They're paying all the insurance
 15 They're paying the police separately, all of the bills.
 16 MR. MCKAIN: It will be all of the insurance
 17 like we talked about. It's \$18 to \$20, like Andy said.
 18 They're probably going to settle at \$19. If we have any
 19 out-of-pocket with labors, trades or police, they're going
 20 to pay that. The \$20,000 is free and clear of any
 21 out-of-pocket.
 22 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Did someone --- did you ---?
 23 MR. ELLENBOGEN: Are they going to do like a
 24 carving right there for the people, or ---?
 25 MR. BAECHLE: They will have a demonstration of
 26 that, also, how to carve them and things like that.
 27 MR. ELLENBOGEN: Well, can you get us any seeds?
 28 MR. MCKAIN: I'll work on that.
 29 MR. BAECHLE: We'll get back to you on that.
 30 MR. MCKAIN: I only brought one of these. These
 31 were at the committee meetings, but I'll give it to Mr.
 32 Baker. Maybe he can just pass it down. I apologize,
 33 because we passed this out at committee.
 34 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Was this --- go
 35 ahead. Representative Means? Hold up. Hold up. Hold
 36 up. Means?
 37 MS. MEANS: So if they do any damage to the
 38 property, have they committed to --- I mean, I don't
 39 anticipate they will, but say there were some ruts or
 40 something, would they repair it? Would they be
 41 responsible to make the repairs?
 42 MR. BAECHLE: There's a provision in the
 43 contract that they are --- even if the parking messes up
 44 the grass, they will help pay for the seed and fix ---
 45 they are responsible for that.

1 MS. MEANS: And it's my understanding that
 2 usually it's a three year contract, but you're doing just
 3 a one year to see how it goes type of thing?
 4 MR. BAECHLE: Correct.
 5 MS. MEANS: And I guess the last comment was I
 6 guess I'm not familiar with the park, so I don't know how
 7 close this is to like private homes. And will there be
 8 noise pollution, light pollution type of thing, or --- and
 9 there's --- and it's behind the amphitheater, so is there
 10 any competition for the space, parking or anything like
 11 that?
 12 MR. BAECHLE: I see no conflict with where we
 13 put it. The closest neighbor is a school. This event
 14 only happens at night.
 15 MS. MEANS: Okay.
 16 MR. BAECHLE: So we see no conflict.
 17 MS. MEANS: Okay. Thank you.
 18 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.
 19 MR. BAECHLE: And the concert season will be
 20 over.
 21 MR. MCKAIN: The concert series will be over, so
 22 we think it's the perfect timing for the park.
 23 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Was that motion
 24 properly seconded?
 25 (Chorus of ayes.)
 26 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Second? Okay. Let's take a

 11 MR. BARKER President DeFazio?
 12 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Yes.
 13 MR. BARKER Ayes 15, no's zero. The bill
 14 passes.
 15 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Liaison reports? Okay
 16 We'll start with Representative Baker first. We'll ---
 17 MR. BAKER Okay. Thanks, Mr. President. Just
 18 a couple quick ones.
 19 We had a wonderful celebration last Thursday
 20 afternoon. Senator Vulakovich sponsored the Vietnam
 21 Veterans' Recognition Ceremony. There was over 200 people
 22 there, over 100 veterans. Vietnam veteran era veterans
 23 were --- were honored. There was --- it was literally
 24 incredible. Councilwoman Kirk was there, Councilman
 25 Kress, Councilman DeMarco. It was just an amazing,
 26 inspiring --- it was one of those days where I got to
 27 emcee and I just felt so blessed and lucky to get to emcee
 28 that event. It was really incredible.
 29 We also did the airport tour last week. That
 30 went well. That was Councilwoman Kirk, Councilman DeMarco
 31 and I. We had a good morning there at the, not just the
 32 best airport in the region, not the best airport in the
 33 state, but the whole --- the best airport in the world,
 34 the 2017 Airport of the Year. So we enjoyed that tour.
 35 We learned a lot, and it was a great tour.
 36 I thought that the ALOM --- I know there's
 37 different feelings on this one, but we did meet your
 38 Council member up at ALOM, Allegheny League of
 39 Municipalities, to mixed reviews. I thought Councilman
 40 DeFazio and I had a real good morning together, though,
 41 with Councilman Futules. And I liked the format. I don't
 42 know that it will stay that way. We might go back to a
 43 panel at some point. But I felt like we had a good flow
 44 of people stopping by our tables, our table from our

1 district, and I hope that all of our Council colleagues
 2 also enjoyed their shifts.
 3 I know there was a --- Councilman Kress in the
 4 crew, and Councilman DeMarco, Catena were out on Friday.
 5 Councilman Martoni and, of course, Mrs. Martoni were there
 6 with us for the weekend as well. It was just a really
 7 nice experience.
 8 And I will say thanks to Councilman DeMarco, we
 9 did our first joint office hours together at the Western
 10 Allegheny Community Library last Thursday. We were up
 11 against the Penguins game, but we still had a steady flow
 12 of folks at our table. Senator Reschenthaler's office
 13 also was part of that event. And Councilwoman Kirk and I
 14 will be doing our first joint office hours at Northland
 15 Public Library this Monday.
 16 So a lot of good things going on.
 17 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Moving down the line, who
 18 had their hand up next? Representative Ellenbogen?
 19 MR. ELLENBOGEN: Thank you, Mr. President. As
 20 everyone is aware, we are inundated with a huge opioid
 21 problem which has resulted in, this year, over 600 deaths.
 22 As your Public Safety chair, with the help of
 23 the County manager, Mr. McKain, he has made available to
 24 us the appropriate police, medical examiners and medical
 25 people to discuss this tomorrow in my public safety
 26 meeting which begins at five o'clock. Hopefully everyone
 27 can make it. It will give you an opportunity to ask some
 28 of the questions and be able to understand some of the
 29 things that the County are doing to try to curb this.
 30 Thank you, Mr. President.
 31 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Representative Kirk, and
 32 then we'll come down there.
 33 MS. KIRK: Just a follow-up on what Councilman
 34 Ellenbogen said. In the North Hills at CCAC, there was an
 35 opioid seminar, and I'd like to thank CCAC because they
 36 provided the setting without cost. And we had the local
 37 police, and paramedics and --- and families who had
 38 suffered through addiction and maybe had lost children and
 39 whatnot, and it was very powerful.
 40 The DEA was there. And I think they have it
 41 online. And the one thing they mentioned, if you have any
 42 kids or any interest, on the FBI website, there's a movie
 43 called Chasing the Dragon. Very powerful. They suggest
 44 anybody 15 and older watch it. Then they have a ---

1 they're coming out with like a PG model for the 10, 11
 2 year olds.
 3 They said what they're trying to reach is kids
 4 before they have their wisdom teeth out, which is like
 5 about, usually around 15, 16, because that's when they are
 6 handed a prescription for pain medication, and they're
 7 trying --- and that's when --- some kids, that's their
 8 first exposure and it's downhill from then for some of
 9 them.
 10 So I encourage you to watch the movie, if --- if
 11 it's appropriate for your family. Thank you.
 12 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: We'll go down this way.
 13 MR. ELLENBOGEN: No, this is still regarding
 14 this, if I may?
 15 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Well, go ahead.
 16 MR. ELLENBOGEN: I just wanted to say that, you
 17 know, these kinds of things, what the County's doing ---
 18 these are things that you folks are going to vote on in
 19 terms of the budget. You know, in trying to curb this,
 20 everything costs money. So I would encourage folks to
 21 come and understand some of the things we're going to be
 22 voting for as these budgets come in front of us.
 23 Thank you.
 24 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Representative Means,
 25 I think, was next?
 26 MS. MEANS: Thank you for recognizing me, Mr.
 27 President. Councilman Ellenbogen, your meeting starts at
 28 4:30 tomorrow, at least according to my calendar. So I
 29 just wanted to make sure everybody showed up at the right
 30 time. That's all. I think it's important, too.
 31 MR. ELLENBOGEN: My staff knows more than I do,
 32 obviously. Thank you. I appreciate that.
 33 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Seeing ---
 34 Representative Kress?
 35 MR. KRESS: Just real quick, this Saturday was
 36 the opening day for trout season, so Nick Futules, myself
 37 and the Chief Executive toured Deer Lakes Park. And I
 38 have to say that the improvements to Deer Lakes Park were
 39 remarkable.
 40 I know --- I can't say enough good things about
 41 what's going on in the park, and there was plenty of
 42 people out there fishing. There's three lakes. All the
 43 lakes were clean, clear. People were enjoying themselves.
 44 I just have to say the improvements to the park have been
 45 remarkable.

1 And I know I used to go up there as a child, you
 2 know, back in the '70s and the '80s. And the --- the
 3 lakes were choked with like all kinds of plant material
 4 and weed and --- plus the lake itself, the --- all the ---
 5 the --- I guess the vegetation was cut back so people
 6 actually can fish there, now, too. I mean before, you
 7 weren't able to actually cast into the lake.
 8 So I mean, the lake's looking beautiful. The
 9 park's looking beautiful and I'd just like to thank the
 10 administration, too, for keeping the park up the way it
 11 is. So thank you.
 12 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Representative Futules?
 13 MR. FUTULES: Yeah, I'd like to add to that. I
 14 was lucky enough to catch the first person catching a fish
 15 at the lake that day and it --- yeah, I did. He was ---
 16 No, it wasn't you, Ed. You didn't catch
 17 nothing. I actually caught the first guy catching a fish
 18 and I filmed him, and it was pretty great.
 19 And as I walked around the lake with everybody,
 20 I was asking everybody where they were from. And quite
 21 frankly, there were people from all over Allegheny County
 22 and Westmoreland County. People from South Hills came to
 23 Deer Lakes Park, people from Laurel Borough, I mean,
 24 places all over, Penn Hills, you name it. I was surprised
 25 to see the amount of people that were not local because
 26 they wanted to come out to the park area and the
 27 atmosphere. And the people were telling me the one
 28 particular lake they liked on top of the hill because it
 29 looked more scenic and into the woods. And they were
 30 really appreciative of that the fact that the lake has
 31 been cleaned up and they're very happy about it. Thank
 32 you.
 33 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. We're going down to
 34 10130-17.
 35 MR. BARKER: An Ordinance of the Council of the
 36 County of Allegheny ratifying amendments to Allegheny
 37 County Health Department Rules and Regulations pursuant to
 38 Section 12011 of the Local Health Administration Law.
 39 Sponsored by the Chief Executive.
 40 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Representative Palmiere, you
 41 want to say something there?
 42 MR. PALMIERE: We're going to just refer that
 43 back to committee.
 44 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. 10131-17

1 MR. BARKER: A Resolution of the Council of the
 2 County of Allegheny amending Resolution 11-15-RE,
 3 establishing an annual Countywide Cleanup Day and
 4 encouraging County residents to volunteer to assist in
 5 beautifying the County. Sponsored by Council Member
 6 Palmiere.
 7 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Representative Palmiere?
 8 MR. PALMIERE: The reason we reintroduced this,
 9 we're trying to get the --- to deal with this problem we
 10 have in Allegheny County with all this clutter and I ---
 11 I'm trying to think of the organization. Help me out,
 12 here. What organization were we trying to partner with
 13 here?
 14 MR. MCKAIN: Keeping Pennsylvania Beautiful.
 15 MR. PALMIERE: Keeping Pennsylvania Beautiful,
 16 yes. And so that's what inspired this to be reintroduced,
 17 so we can work together on a collaborative effort with the
 18 state in trying to clean up Allegheny County. And also,
 19 we're also going to try to do this with the individual
 20 cleaning-up days in the nine parks in conjunction with all
 21 this.
 22 And anything further, Mr. President, we'll let
 23 you know.
 24 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.
 25 MR. PALMIERE: Thank you.
 26 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: What did you --- you want to
 27 --- we'll put it in the --- in the committee, in your
 28 committee in parks.
 29 MR. KLEIN: Parks.

 32 Allegheny amending the Grants and Special Accounts Budget

 37 I left it out.

 3 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.
 4 MR. BARKER: Second is Melissa Hall and third is
 5 Suzanne Ezzo.
 6 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Being that they're
 7 not here, next we're --- we're going to have --- we're
 8 going to have a recess and go into executive committee on
 9 personnel issues. So we'll take a recess and come back.
 10 Okay?
 11 (Meeting adjourned for executive session.)
 12 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. We're back in
 13 session. Does someone want to make a motion to adjourn?
 14 MR. KRESS: I'd like to make a motion to
 15 adjourn.
 16 MR. CATENA: Second.
 17 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: All those in favor, signify
 18 by saying aye.
 19 (Chorus of ayes.)
 20 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Opposed? The ayes have it.
