1 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: The meeting will come to
 2 order. We all rise for the Pledge of Allegiance to the
 3 Flag and remain standing for silent prayer or reflection.

 7 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Roll call.
 8 MR. BARKER: Mr. Baker?

 38 MR. BARKER: Fourteen (14) members currently
 39 present.
 40 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: 10142-17.
 41 MR. BARKER: A proclamation declaring the week
 42 of Monday, May 15th through Sunday, May 21st, 2017 to be
 43 National Police Week in Allegheny County. Sponsored by
 44 Council Members Means, Ellenbogen, Baker, Catena, DeFazio,

1 The Law Enforcement Officers Memorial is located
 2 on the Pittsburgh's North Shore. It's a monument to
 3 Allegheny County's law enforcement community in honor of
 4 the fallen officers, and retired Donna Best is the
 5 president of the Law Enforcement Officers Memorial.
 6 And I'm joined by all of --- all --- all my
 7 fellow council members in honoring you today. And also
 8 Councilman DeMarco is here. He would like to say a few
 9 words.
 10 MR. DEMARCO: Thank you, Councilwoman Means.
 11 When we stand here today to honor our officers,
 12 this isn't the first time that --- that we have done so
 13 and that other citizens have done so. And Police Week
 14 here started back in 1962 when President John F. Kennedy
 15 designated May 15th to be the National Peace Officers
 16 Memorial Day, and that the week in which May 15th felt ---
 17 or fell, to be National Police Week.
 18 In 1992, President Bill Clinton, as part of
 19 legislation, passed and signed an act which designated
 20 that on May 15th, all government buildings have their U.S.
 21 flags lowered to half staff.
 22 Now, when we gather here today to honor these
 23 folks who represent the police officers who serve us on a
 24 daily basis, we can't forget the police officers who are
 25 no longer here to honor us. And Councilwoman Means and
 26 myself had the honor of being able to attend the Borough
 27 and Township Association Police Memorial Ceremony Friday
 28 evening where two officers were inducted in there.
 29 And those two officers were Canonsburg police
 30 officer Scott Bashioum and Allegheny County police
 31 detective, Koropal, who was known affectionately by the
 32 folks in the Allegheny County Police as P.J.
 33 It is my remarks that I made there that night,
 34 I'll make today. I yearn for the day when we can come
 35 here to honor fallen officers without having to add new
 36 names to the list. So I want to allow Councilwoman Means
 37 to read the proclamation to honor all of our folks here.
 38 But again, I think we should all give thanks to these
 39 folks who protect and serve on a daily basis.
 40 Thank you.
 41 (Applause.)
 42 MS. MEANS: WHEREAS, the week of May 15th
 43 through May 21st, 2017 has been designated as the National
 44 Police Week to honor the memory of the hundreds of police
 45 officers who gave their lives in the line of duty; and

1 DeMarco, Futules, Kirk, Klein, Kress, Macey, Martoni,
 2 Palmiere, Ranalli-Russell and Walton.
 3 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.
 4 MS. MEANS: It's my great honor today to --- to
 5 give a proclamation honoring --- because this, the week of
 6 Monday, May 15th through Sunday, May 21st, 2017,
 7 is National Police Week in Allegheny County.
 8 So we have with us this evening --- I didn't see
 9 Coleman McDonough yet. I --- oh, there he is. Come on
 10 down here. Pick door number two. I'm so sorry.
 11 We have --- we're honored to have Superintendent
 12 Coleman McDonough. The Honorable William Mullen, Sheriff,
 13 is a little under the weather so Kevin Kraus, Chief Deputy
 14 of the Allegheny County Sheriff's Department is here to
 15 honor him. Kimberly Sweeney, a trustee in Law Enforcement
 16 Officers Memorial of Allegheny County, she's a retired
 17 Pittsburgh Police officer. And also, we have William
 18 Kilburn, president of the Borough and Township Police
 19 Association and Jim Wabby, vice president of the Borough
 20 and Township Police Association.
 21 I just feel so humbled today to be in the
 22 presence of my heroes. And not only are you my heroes,
 23 your family is my heroes as well. And we have former
 24 police officers who died in the line of duty for us. And
 25 you think about their jobs when they oversee other people
 26 in their command. Their job is 24-7.
 27 And their families make a sacrifice, and they
 28 have parents, moms and dads, and brothers and sisters, and
 29 children and they all are home praying for their safe
 30 return and they all make a sacrifice because they work
 31 shifts. They can miss a ball game or different
 32 activities, so the police do a wonderful job.
 33 They are --- be commended, and honored, and
 34 respected and it's so --- it's a great honor to be here
 35 today to memorialize those officers who gave their lives
 36 in the line of duty.
 37 And the --- the Borough and Township Police
 38 Association maintains three police monuments within
 39 Allegheny County to pay tribute to the fallen officers.
 40 One is located in the Allegheny County Police Training
 41 Academy in the North Park, and one is on the third floor
 42 of the Allegheny County Courthouse, and one is located to
 43 the --- located next to the Allegheny County Police
 44 Barracks in South Park.

1 WHEREAS, every day across the Commonwealth of
 2 Pennsylvania, Allegheny County, and the City of Pittsburgh
 3 police officers bravely and courageously risk their lives
 4 to protect and serve their communities and preserve the
 5 peace and order to which every citizen is entitled; and
 6 WHEREAS, as Officer Dawn Memorial Page, ODMP,
 7 reports that there have been 921 line of duty deaths in
 8 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, including 12 K9 line of
 9 duty deaths; and
 10 WHEREAS, we join the families, friends,
 11 colleagues and neighbors of these fallen heroes to mourn
 12 their losses and celebrate their memories;
 13 NOW, THEREFORE LET IT BE IT RESOLVED, that
 14 Allegheny County Council does hereby honor the memory of
 15 all of the fallen police officers in the Commonwealth of
 16 Pennsylvania, Allegheny County and the City of Pittsburgh
 17 during the National Police Week and commend those officers
 18 who are still working to give their life to protect and
 19 serve; and
 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Allegheny County
 21 Council does hereby declare the week of Monday, May 15th
 22 through Sunday, May 21st, to be National Police Week in
 23 Allegheny County.
 24 Sponsored by County Council Member Sue Means and
 25 all the members of County Council, this day, the 9th of
 26 May, 2017.
 27 (Applause.)
 28 MS. MEANS: You can come up here and say a few
 29 words.
 30 SUPERINTENDENT MCDONOUGH: I'll be very brief.
 31 On behalf of the men and women of the Allegheny
 32 County Police Department, as well as our municipal, local,
 33 state and federal brothers and sisters who serve here in
 34 the law enforcement of Allegheny County, I want to thank
 35 all the council members for this gesture, your show of
 36 support and the community, as well. We couldn't do our
 37 jobs without that support and this proclamation is --- is
 38 just a wonderful gesture.
 39 Thank you.
 40 (Applause.)
 41 MS. SWEENEY: Yes, again, I couldn't have said
 42 it better myself. I just want to say thank you to
 43 everybody, thank you to everybody here in the audience and
 44 our board. It does mean a great deal to our law
 45 enforcement out there that they are appreciated by the

1 citizens and the Council. We don't hear thank you enough
 2 out there, and it does mean a great deal to each and every
 3 one of us and our families as well, that we are truly
 4 appreciated.
 5 Thank you very much
 6 (Applause.)
 7 MR. WABBY: Thank you
 8 My name is Jim Wabby. I've served with the
 9 county police for 33 years and 18 years with the Attorney
 10 General's Office.
 11 And I want to thank County Council, and Sue, and
 12 Sam for coming out to our --- our plaque the other night
 13 Like she said, we do have three of them. One is in this
 14 building. One's at North Park and South Park and if
 15 you've never seen it, the County helps us maintain it. It
 16 would be appreciated if you see it once in a while, you
 17 know. But it's sad when we got to add the names on it.
 18 We --- we did it in the rain and I want to thank them for
 19 coming. Thank you very much, too
 20 (Applause.)
 21 CHIEF KRAUS: Thank you very much. Appreciate
 22 it. On behalf of Sheriff Bill Mullen and the
 23 Sheriff's Office, we just want to say thank you. He can't
 24 be here today. He's recovering from a knee injury, but
 25 just on behalf of all the men and women of our office, we
 26 sincerely want to thank each one of you for this.
 27 Thank you
 28 (Applause.)
 29 MR. ELLENBOGEN: Mr. President? Mr. President?
 30 Mr. President? Point of personal ---
 31 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Yeah, go ahead.
 32 MR. ELLENBOGEN: As the Public Safety Chair for
 33 Council, I just wanted to say that --- and someone who
 34 comes from a long line of law --- law enforcement, back in
 35 this county since the '20s, I just wanted to say I'm very
 36 proud of the way the county police and the sheriff's
 37 office have reinvented themselves to tackle particularly
 38 this serious opioid crisis that we face. The men and
 39 women of this county are exceptional police officers.
 40 Superintendent McDonough, your addition, I
 41 think, is wonderful. And --- and my old friend who is
 42 kind of shy, the Chief Deputy Sheriff, Kevin Kraus, who
 43 actually, he's too shy to admit, he was the top homicide
 44 cop for the city of Pittsburgh. So to have him over here
 45 is also great for us.

1 invaluable and you make all the difference to --- all of
 2 the citizen in the County at some point in time in their
 3 life. That said, I'd like to read the proclamation.
 4 WHEREAS, National Nurses Week begins May 6th and
 5 ends May 12th each year, in conjunction with Florence
 6 Nightingale's birthday, which is the 12th; and
 7 WHEREAS, there are more than 218,000 registered
 8 nurses in Pennsylvania and over 25,000 licensed nurses in
 9 Allegheny County, which makes nursing the largest licensed
 10 health care profession in our Commonwealth and in our
 11 County; and
 12 WHEREAS, the depth and breadth of the registered
 13 nursing profession meets the different and emerging health
 14 care needs of the American population in a wide range of
 15 settings, and
 16 WHEREAS, this year's theme is Nursing: The
 17 Balance of Mind, Body and Spirit and the designation for
 18 2017 as the Year of the Healthy Nurse; and
 19 WHEREAS, the care provided by nurses in
 20 Pennsylvania and Allegheny County is the primary component
 21 to a successful health care delivery system;
 22 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the
 23 Allegheny County Council does hereby declare the week of
 24 May 6th through May 12th, as Nurses Week in Allegheny
 25 County, and we recognize the selfless service of our
 26 nurses and the overall importance of quality nursing care.
 27 Sponsored by myself and all members of County
 28 Council, presented this 9th day of May 17th.
 29 And just a side, I'm a nurse and so is Sue.
 30 We're both registered nurses also, so we really take this
 31 real personal
 32 That said, I guess we can go by departments
 33 Maybe we can have the Area Aging --- Area Agency on Aging.
 34 Why don't you all come up?
 35 MS. PROFETA: We're here.
 36 MS. KIRK: Oh, are you aging?
 37 MS. PROFETA: Yes.
 38 MS. KIRK: You three?
 39 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: We're aging up here.
 40 MS. KIRK: How about is Keith Emmerling ---?
 41 Okay
 42 Okay. So I'll --- I'll just read off the names.
 43 Kim Hall, is she here? Oh, come on up.
 44 Okay. Then why don't you --- why don't you
 45 introduce your folks and then you can all just come and

1 And the men and women of 91 and of Local 5, I
 2 have the greatest respect for and --- and as this whole
 3 council does. And anything that we could ever do to help
 4 --- and we appreciate everything you do every day.
 5 Thank you. Thank you, Mr. President.
 6 (Applause.)
 7 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: We'll take a picture
 8 Picture ---
 9 (Pictures taken.)
 10 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: 10143-17
 11 MR. BARKER: First, please let the record
 12 reflect that Mr. Kress is now present.
 13 10143-17 is a proclamation naming the week of
 14 Monday, May 8th through Friday, May 12th, 2017 as Nurses
 15 Week in Allegheny County. Sponsored by Council Members
 16 Kirk, Baker, Catena, DeFazio, DeMarco, Ellenbogen,
 17 Futules, Klein, Kress, Macey, Martoni, Means, Palmiere,
 18 Ranalli-Russell and Walton.
 19 MS. KIRK: Hi. Just as we have the police, and
 20 they're wonderful servants and help us all, we also have a
 21 group of nurses who are invaluable to the County and to
 22 society as a whole. So come on up, nurses.
 23 I'll point out that these nurses all work for
 24 Allegheny County, and we're just very proud and so
 25 appreciative of having you here and you taking the time
 26 Hey, details, details.
 27 You know, just an interesting note while they're
 28 coming up. The new acting surgeon general is actually a
 29 nurse. I don't know if any of you knew that. She was an
 30 Army nurse and then she was working for the Public Health
 31 Service and moved up, Sylvia Trent-Adams. I don't know if
 32 she'll be commissioned, but surgeon general really runs,
 33 or speaks and organizes and runs the Public Health
 34 Service, so it doesn't have to be a physician. There have
 35 been nurses before, but now we have a nurse again, which
 36 is very exciting.
 37 And you know, why don't some of you come up over
 38 here? Want to come up over on this side? You can all get
 39 together. Anybody like to come up on the ramp?
 40 So we have --- we have nurses at the Area Agency
 41 for Aging, our Health Department, at the jail, at the
 42 Kanes, all the Kanes, and at the CCAC nursing program
 43 creating more nurses.
 44 So and that said, we'd like to recognize all of
 45 you and thank you for coming because like I said, you're

1 say hi and anything you want to say, your name and where
 2 you work or whatever.
 3 MS. HALL: Hi. My name is Kim Hall. I'm the
 4 division chief for the care coordination division at the
 5 Area Agency on Aging. I'd like to introduce four of our
 6 nurses at the Area Agency on Aging. Jennifer Miceli who
 7 works in Protective Services, Susie Profeta who works in
 8 the assessment unit, Carrie Andros, who works in our
 9 OPTIONS program and Kim Fowles, who also works in our
 10 OPTIONS program. Congratulations.
 11 (Applause.)
 12 MS. KIRK: As we had them the proclamations, on
 13 behalf of County Council, we're giving them a little pin
 14 that says nursing, together we can --- more is
 15 accomplished. Actually, I can't read it real well right
 16 now. It's a little small.
 17 But it says you make a difference through all
 18 the things you do. Every day we're thankful that we can
 19 count on you. Please accept this gift for your efforts
 20 each day. You earn our appreciation each and every day
 21 --- way. And that's from all the members of council just
 22 as a reminder of how much we appreciate you.
 23 (Applause.)
 24 MS. KIRK: Okay. The Health Department. Karen,
 25 do you want to ---?
 26 Okay. We have Karen Hacker who's in charge of
 27 the Health Department, hiding in the back, is showing
 28 support for the nurses who work there.
 29 Are you in the Health Department?
 30 MS. PETTENCE: Yes.
 31 MS. KIRK: Okay. Here, would you like to --- to
 32 --- your director's not coming up. Who would like to ---
 33 someone like to read the names? We knew we'd embarrass
 34 her. Come on.
 35 MS. HACKER: I'm not sure I'm going to have
 36 everybody's names right.
 37 MS. KIRK: Well, here, I think we --- oh, you
 38 have.
 39 MS. HACKER: All right.
 40 So we have --- sorry. Lauren Bungo, Andrew ---
 41 he's not here today. Okay.
 42 Diana Pettence and Charles O'Brien, and he's not
 43 here either. And Benjamin, we have a lot of male nurses
 44 in our department. All right. Anyway, these guys are
 45 great. Thanks.

1 MS. KIRK: Anyone want to say anything else?
 2 Would you like to come up and say anything? You're good?
 3 Okay.
 4 Warden, would you like to come up?
 5 WARDEN WAINWRIGHT: Absolutely.
 6 MS. KIRK: And nurses are very important at the
 7 jail.
 8 WARDEN WAINWRIGHT: How you doing? Good
 9 afternoon, everybody. On behalf of the Allegheny County
 10 Jail's administration, I just want to say thank you to all
 11 of the nurses at the Allegheny County Jail. These guys
 12 and ladies do a remarkable job, and I'm just honored to
 13 sit up here and speak to you and talk to you about the
 14 wonderful job that they're doing.
 15 Today, we have Ms. Jennifer Bentzel, our
 16 assistant director of nursing, here, to accept the award.
 17 And I just wanted to say she is a remarkable supervisor
 18 and I am just honored to be here standing beside her.
 19 Thank you, Ms. Bentzel.
 20 (Applause.)
 21 MS. BENTZEL: Thank you. Thank --- thank you so
 22 much. I'm an honor --- I'm honored to be a member of the
 23 county team and I just wanted to say thank you to all of
 24 you guys for doing what you do. So thanks.
 25 (Applause.)
 26 MS. KIRK: And of course, a little obvious, at
 27 Kane hospitals, we have a few nurses. So if you'd like to
 28 come up and introduce your nurses. And as we said, if you
 29 want to come by and we'll give you a proclamation.
 30 MR. BIONDO: Thanks.
 31 MS. KIRK: If they --- if they --- if anyone of
 32 them want to say anything ---
 33 MR. BIONDO: I'll let them.
 34 MS. KIRK: Okay.
 35 MR. BIONDO: I just want to thank council for
 36 recognizing the nurses that we have. When --- when I was
 37 preparing to come here, I went and checked to see how many
 38 we have. We have over 200 nurses that work for us at the
 39 Kanes in the various capacities from our --- and we have
 40 directors of nursing, assistant directors of nursing,
 41 nurses that work on the floors every day. We have a lot
 42 of them back at work right now. They're 24 hours a day,
 43 as I'm sure you all know.
 44 And I know for myself, I don't say thank you
 45 enough to them and they really are appreciated because I

1 KANE REPRESENTATIVE: First of all, I want to
 2 thank you all for honoring us and we do do a great job,
 3 But most of all, we can't do it without our
 4 residents of Allegheny County, who we care of on an
 5 everyday basis, and take it personally. And they say we
 6 shouldn't, but that's what nurses do. We take it
 7 personally.
 8 But I have one more thing to say, also, is that
 9 my team is great. My executive director, he has a
 10 listening ear and I get --- I know he gets tired of it
 11 sometimes. We've beaten him on it and Nancy Ehrman was
 12 one of the best things that happened to the Kanes. She
 13 oversees us and see that we're on the forefront of moving
 14 things.
 15 And what she talked about is called Teepea Snow,
 16 and we are the college for Teepea Snow and it gives me
 17 great pleasure. And I'm also active faculty for CCAC.
 18 So thank you all for all your wonderful work
 19 that you keep us in. Thank you.
 20 (Applause.)
 21 MS. KIRK: Anybody else from Kane who would like
 22 to speak? You're still a Kane.
 23 And then, to produce more nurses, since we're
 24 always trying to hire them, we have the CCAC nursing
 25 program. And Kathy Mayle --- I used to work with Kathy
 26 100 years ago, 100 years ago way back when. Hey, Kath.
 27 MS. MAYLE: Well, I --- I have some prepared
 28 statements I'd like to make.
 29 MS. KIRK: That's Kathy.
 30 MS. MAYLE: So thank you very much. I'm very
 31 proud to say that I'm one of over 3,000,000 professional
 32 registered nurses in the United States of America and
 33 nursing is what I love.
 34 And I've served as a professional nurse most
 35 happily for 40 years in the hospital setting, in a
 36 creative position as the executive director of the nursing
 37 recruitment coalition for over 12 years, and as nursing
 38 educator for 13 years at Duquesne University School of
 39 Nursing and now, as Dean of Nursing at CCAC.
 40 Our CCAC Associates degree program's mission is
 41 to prepare graduates for entry level practice in the
 42 current and emerging global health care delivery
 43 workforce. I have a great respect for our nurses and our
 44 faculty. At CCAC, we create a dynamic, diverse and
 45 supportive student --- student centered environment for

1 --- I know what they do. I see what they do every day and
 2 it's much appreciated, so I'm glad that there's this
 3 opportunity to recognize them if I can just read out their
 4 names and have them come up. If anybody wants to say
 5 anything, feel free, although I think they've all told me
 6 they don't want to speak.
 7 MS. KIRK: Typical nurses.
 8 MR. BIONDO: I know.
 9 I'm going to save Nancy until last. She's our
 10 chief nursing officer. I'm going to make her say
 11 something.
 12 We have representatives from all four centers
 13 here. We have --- so we're all --- all four centers are
 14 represented. Lisa Shaffer, she's our director of nursing
 15 at Ross. She's off hiding in the back. And Jackie
 16 Diamond is our assistant director of nursing from Ross.
 17 Melissa Barcic is our director of nursing at Glen Hazel
 18 and Lee Saunders is an assistant director of nursing at
 19 Glen Hazel. They're also hiding in the back.
 20 Colleen, are you here? Colleen Rose, Colleen is
 21 our director of nursing at Scott. Linda Ruggieri's
 22 assistant director of nursing at Scott. Alexis Royster is
 23 director of nursing at McKeesport and Shula Alicoria is
 24 assistant director of nursing and Robin Sweeney is also
 25 assistant director of nursing at --- at McKeesport.
 26 Anybody want to say anything before I get Nancy
 27 to come up?
 28 Nancy Ehrman is our chief nursing officer.
 29 She's the one that runs the nursing department and
 30 oversees what they do. Anything you want to say, Nancy?
 31 MS. EHRMAN: Thanks, Dennis. Thank you very
 32 much. I'm so happy to be here and I'm extremely happy to
 33 be the person that represents these very fine nurses.
 34 They work so hard every day. We could not ask for a
 35 greater group of leaders than --- than I have.
 36 Within this last year, we have --- have
 37 completed dementia training to all of the employees at
 38 Kane. We have over 850 employees trained. We have
 39 another, maybe, 300 to go. They will all be trained in
 40 the positive approach to caring for our residents, and it
 41 has been very successful and we're very excited about our
 42 program.
 43 So thank you very much.
 44 (Applause.)
 45 MS. KIRK: Oh, here we go. We got a live one

1 learning and I cannot thank the County Council enough for
 2 your role in making this possible.
 3 And I know our faculty, and our staff and our
 4 students are so very appreciative. We have a great deal
 5 to be proud of. Our nursing program started in 1967 and
 6 has turned 50 years this year. CCAC has a solid
 7 reputation for graduating competent nurses. We have
 8 strong faculty prepared in the classroom, teaching and
 9 clinically.
 10 So currently, all CCAC graduates are excelling
 11 as measured by our in class pass rates. Our board scores
 12 are over 90 percent against the State Board of Nursing
 13 mandated bar of 80 percent.
 14 So once again, I'd like to thank my college
 15 president, Quintin Bullock, my boss who's here, and the
 16 Allegheny County Council for its support of our college
 17 and its rich resources that we are able to offer all
 18 nursing students to ensure academic success. So thank you
 19 all, and thank you for this and thank you for recognizing
 20 us.
 21 (Applause.)
 22 MS. KIRK: What a wonderful group of people.
 23 Once again, thank you. Thank all of you. And you know
 24 everyone in this room is very grateful for everything you
 25 do.
 26 And on that note, we want to memorialize this by
 27 having some photos taken, of which you'll all get copies,

1 And for this reason, they started --- I'm going
 2 to go --- it's in the proclamation, but I just wanted to
 3 fill you in a little bit.
 4 These good people from Brentwood, about six
 5 years ago, they put in one of those hockey --- dek hockey
 6 arenas and what they started to do, was raise money. They
 7 have a --- a nice --- excuse me. It's called Drop the
 8 Puck on Cancer and what they do is from 8:00 a.m. on
 9 Saturday morning --- what was that, about a month, about a
 10 month ago, April? Okay.
 11 8:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. they have these teams,
 12 all comprised of people from all over the area, playing
 13 one another. And they've invited me to play and there's
 14 no way I'm going to play hockey. That's --- I would --- I
 15 would --- they said, well, you're a runner. I said, yeah,
 16 but I'm not a hockey player. So we'll just --- we'll
 17 leave it at that.
 18 But they have the compassion and the motivation
 19 to raise money to help the people from Brentwood who have
 20 been afflicted with this terrible disease of cancer.
 21 And I'm going to read this proclamation and I
 22 hope you appreciate the scope of what's --- what's going
 23 on here on a yearly basis.
 24 WHEREAS, in 2012, a group of friends with
 25 Brentwood, Pennsylvania ties created the Duttine-Cavataio
 26 --- Cavataio Fund in response to the untimely death of two
 27 young Brentwood High School alumni, Julie Andrulonis
 28 Duttine, a 1983 Brentwood High School graduate, and Tom
 29 Cavataio, a 1984 Brentwood High School graduate, and
 30 WHEREAS, the Duttine-Cavataio Fund held its
 31 first Drop the Puck on Cancer dek hockey tournament six
 32 years ago in Brentwood Park to raise money for the
 33 families devastated by the loss of their loved ones; and
 34 WHEREAS, Drop the Puck on Cancer features a full
 35 day of dek hockey tournaments, a 50/50 raffle, Chinese
 36 auction, bake sale, food and drinks, a magician, face
 37 painter and balloon maker and --- and beside that, they
 38 play hockey all day; and
 39 WHEREAS, since its inception, the Drop the Puck
 40 on Cancer tournament has raised over \$185,000 to assist
 41 families from Brentwood that have had cancer or lost a
 42 loved one to cancer;
 43 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the
 44 Allegheny County Council does hereby recognize and thank
 45 the Duttine-Cavataio Fund for its dedication and

1 Fashion Show that was going on. I think that was the ---
 2 the first time that we met.
 3 But I've been involved with the American Heart
 4 Association, just a friend of Leigh Anne Weiss, who is a
 5 dear --- a dear buddy of Erin and I. And she, in her
 6 mid-30s, had a stroke and she's gotten us --- really
 7 opened our eyes to this cause, to this mission and to all
 8 the good work that American Heart Association is going to
 9 --- it is doing here in our community and across the
 10 country.
 11 So Mrs. Allegheny County is going to tell you
 12 about herself in a minute, after we read the proclamation
 13 and all the good work that she is doing to spread
 14 awareness as well. We'll get to the proclamation and then
 15 we'll hear from Mrs. Allegheny County.
 16 WHEREAS, in the United States, heart disease and
 17 stroke cause one in three deaths among women each year,
 18 killing approximately one woman --- one woman in every 80
 19 seconds; and
 20 WHEREAS, Go Red For Women is the American Heart
 21 Association's national movement that inspires women to
 22 make lifestyle changes, mobilize communities and shape
 23 policy to save lives; and
 24 WHEREAS, Go Red For Women has impacted the lives
 25 of thousands of women and families in the Pittsburgh area
 26 by supporting cardiovascular research, professional and
 27 community education and advocacy efforts; and
 28 WHEREAS, themed around sisterhood and
 29 inspiration, the 2017 Pittsburgh Go --- Go Red For Women
 30 Luncheon and Fashion Show will take place on Friday, May
 31 19th, 2017 at the Wyndham Grand Hotel in downtown
 32 Pittsburgh to raise funds for heart disease and stroke
 33 research;
 34 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the
 35 Allegheny County Council does hereby recognize the 2017
 36 Pittsburgh Go Red For Women Luncheon and Fashion Show, and
 37 we thank the Go Red For Women movement for its continued
 38 efforts to fight this epidemic and build a brighter future
 39 for the women and families of Allegheny County.
 40 Sponsored by myself and passed by Allegheny
 41 Council on this 9th day of May, 2017.
 42 Congratulations.
 43 (Applause.)

 10 I compete every year in June for the title of Mrs.
 11 Pennsylvania. So yes, that means I didn't win, but I

 14 So my job as an advocate for heart health
 15 awareness is basically I ask you guys to look around the

 24 This is kind of unusual, but I just wanted to
 25 share something. On April 28th, one of my closest friends
 26 in this life who works in the city county building walked
 27 over to the county office building and literally keeled
 28 over. He was unresponsive, and if not for the efforts of
 29 Jim Reardon, the director of facilities management, who,
 30 back in the day, worked in special and emergency services
 31 with me, administering CPR and Carl Bolden hitting him
 32 with the defibrillator, my dear friend, I don't think
 33 would be with us today.
 34 He's --- for his sake, he's still in the
 35 hospital. I don't want to mention his name yet, but later
 36 on, I --- I probably will. But he's resting comfortably.
 37 He's had heart surgery and --- and for the efforts of
 38 these folks, he's still with us.
 39 Further complicated by --- I guess this thing
 40 was so whatever, that the city paramedics did not download
 41 the information from the defibrillator into the system.
 42 So I got an unusual phone call from his fiancée telling me
 43 that Prusby Hospital did not have the information from the
 44 defibrillator. Was there anything I could do? And they

1 also a --- I think there's a really good dinner at the end
 2 of the game, call Sharon Adams at 412-897-2403
 3 Also, I just wanted to let everyone know, and
 4 I'm going to pass this picture along, that things are
 5 going very well at the South Park Ice Rink and they're on
 6 target to finish by the time ice skating opens in the
 7 fall.
 8 And they're putting in new ice equipment so that
 9 it can make ice when it's a little bit warmer, because it
 10 seems like in Pennsylvania, we're having these warmer
 11 winters. And it's going to have an NHL size hockey rink,
 12 and a junior rink and a new skate path. So I'm going to
 13 pass this around so you could see the picture.
 14 And then I also --- one last thing, I was so
 15 excited and thrilled to attend the Innovations in
 16 Transportation and Technology County Leadership Peer
 17 Exchange here in Pittsburgh. And County Executive Rich
 18 Fitzgerald was the host and emcee, and he did a wonderful
 19 job.
 20 And I just wanted to share with you how we are
 21 so blessed to live in Allegheny County. We have CMU, we
 22 have Google, we have Uber, and CMU is partnering with CCAC
 23 for innovation and job training. And after I attended the
 24 two days of information, I'm ready to ride in an Uber.
 25 But I recently visited my son-in-law and he
 26 said, Mom, soon they're going to have automated trucks
 27 transporting our goods from one part of America to
 28 another. I thought he was not telling me the truth. He
 29 is. It's coming. Technology is coming.
 30 And I was so excited that CMU offered all the
 31 attendees a tour of their facility at CMU, and so I
 32 approached their director and he's going to give Allegheny
 33 Council Members a tour so we can see all the wonderful
 34 innovations there at CMU on driverless cars.
 35 And another great benefit of attending this
 36 workshop was to find out about creative ways that they're
 37 solving public transportation issues in other part of the
 38 country. So Uber did two pilot programs, one in Florida
 39 and one in Georgia. So how --- it could even help us.
 40 And if they have like a main bus line, and then they have
 41 --- you can take an Uber very cheaply from your house,
 42 which is in a low service area, to the main line. And
 43 that would solve our problem when we have areas that used
 44 to have a bus and they no longer have a bus, or the bus

1 needed this information so they could understand what
 2 happened and --- and --- and proceed from there.
 3 There's a whole list of folks from our security
 4 to emergency services, folks that will be recognized later
 5 for what they've done. But one of the real heroes here,
 6 and he'll never in a million years admit it, was when I
 7 called the county manager, William McKain, who without his
 8 efforts, I don't believe that any of this would have been
 9 done because these folks got the defibrillator.
 10 The emergency people took it to Presby Hospital.
 11 They downloaded the information into the system. They
 12 were able to perform his heart surgery four days earlier
 13 than they would have normally done. So Mr McKain, from
 14 the bottom of my heart, personally, as this is a dear
 15 friend of mine I --- I want to thank you publicly for
 16 literally helping to save my friend's life. So thank you
 17 and ---
 18 (Applause)
 19 Not to mention, he did this all on a Sunday
 20 morning when I woke him up, so thank you again.
 21 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay
 22 Let me go down this side and I'll be back to
 23 you. Representative --- who? Oh, yeah, that's right.
 24 Sue, Sue, I'm sorry. Sue Means.
 25 MS MEANS: Hi.
 26 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Someone said Macey, but ---
 27 MS MEANS: Thank you for recognizing me
 28 I just wanted to share that today I had the
 29 honor of attending a memorial service for a police officer
 30 who died in the line of duty in Bethel Park, 30 years ago,
 31 Lynn Sutter, and it was a very moving ceremony at the
 32 Bethel Park Municipal Building.
 33 And I want to thank, again, all the police
 34 officers and law --- law enforcement officers for what
 35 they do, and their families for the sacrifices they make.
 36 And just from the bottom of my heart, all the police
 37 officers, they're our heroes and they would lay down their
 38 lives for us and I just so much appreciate it.
 39 So if you are related to a police officer,
 40 Allegheny County is telling you thank you so much for your
 41 sacrifice. And police, we thank you as well.
 42 I wanted to share that on May the 20th, the
 43 Friends of South Park will be having a golf outing and the
 44 money they make from the golf outing will benefit South
 45 Park. So if you'd like to be in a foursome, and there's

1 doesn't come on the weekend, and that was just very
 2 exciting to learn that information.
 3 Thank you for allowing me to share.
 4 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay
 5 Hold on a minute, we've got to go ---
 6 Representative Kirk, then we'll go down this way
 7 MS. KIRK: On May 3rd, I attended the Department
 8 of Health meeting along with Councilman Klein and
 9 Councilwoman Means. Two main issues, just to update you
 10 on, is the legislation for the hearing --- the hearings
 11 and appeals process, they discussed that and voted on it,
 12 and now it will go to public comment, and then we'll see
 13 it back after that. They make any revisions.
 14 There was also a nice presentation on the
 15 upcoming bill we'll see on mandatory lead testing for
 16 infants, 9 to 12 months, and then 2 years old. They
 17 passed that and that legislation, now, is going to their
 18 solicitor for some fine tuning, and then we may see that
 19 in the very near future.
 20 Thank you.
 21 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay Okay
 22 Representative Macey, and then someone else
 23 after? I'll get you.
 24 MR. MACEY: Thank you, Mr. President and members
 25 of council, and certainly, people in the viewing audience.
 26 We saw a little display of appreciation for our
 27 nurses. We also saw a display of appreciation for law
 28 enforcement, and hopefully, we don't have to use our
 29 volunteer fire companies, or our police office, or our
 30 emergency management services because we know that's
 31 nothing but problems.
 32 However, for these organizations to exist, they
 33 have to be funded. And what I'm appealing to people is to
 34 get involved with your volunteer fire department. There's
 35 about 130 volunteer fire departments in this county and it
 36 doesn't come without an expense.
 37 We're talking \$10,000 just for turnout gear
 38 We're talking \$500,000 for a truck, for a pumper. And of
 39 course, there's other amenities that are needed in the
 40 fire service, hoses, nozzles, things of that nature.
 41 Well, this brings me to my crescendo. The West
 42 Mifflin Number Three Volunteer Fire Company has a car
 43 cruise, and it begins May 17th, and it's every Wednesday
 44 throughout the summer.

1 We have a lot of different makes and models of
 2 vehicles, military vehicles. We also have motorcycles,
 3 Everybody is welcome. And what's really nice about this
 4 is there's a lot of refreshments, and affordable food, and
 5 food specials, as well as raffles and prizes. It's a
 6 great time.
 7 It's from 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. every Wednesday
 8 throughout the summer at 3722 Rodeo Drive in West Mifflin.
 9 Thank you and I hope to see you there.
 10 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Thank you.
 11 Representative Palmiere was next.
 12 MR. PALMIERE: Thank you, Mr. President.
 13 I just wanted to mention a couple of things. I
 14 wanted to just congratulate Baldwin. They had the --- a
 15 --- a real great night a few weeks ago. They had a comedy
 16 night. No politics, a lot of good fun and relaxation. I
 17 just wanted to congratulate everyone that was affiliated
 18 with that.
 19 Whitehall had their --- they honored their ---
 20 their distinguished citizens on Friday. I think it was a
 21 week or so ago and again, it was a --- another lovely
 22 evening.
 23 I also wanted to mention the --- the Labor
 24 Council Banquet. I was --- I was there on Friday and that
 25 was --- that was another nice --- nice event. A lot of
 26 people were there. There was a lot of politicking going
 27 on there, but you know, what else do you expect?
 28 And I also wanted to mention the people that run
 29 the Pittsburgh Marathon, I didn't have the --- I didn't
 30 have the pleasure of --- at running or participating in it
 31 this year, but I watched it and I know they did a
 32 marvelous job again. They had some tough weather at the
 33 beginning of the day, but it didn't --- it didn't dampen
 34 their spirits.
 35 They --- they had 35,000 participants this year.
 36 I just want to congratulate all them. They do a wonderful
 37 job and it's a wonderful, wonderful thing for PR for the
 38 city of Pittsburgh. It's one of our best events all year.
 39 And one last thing for your information,
 40 colleagues, Dr. Bullock, president of the community
 41 college, wants to get together with us at some time. I'm
 42 going to try to do it on a Monday or a Wednesday if you
 43 don't mind. He wants to get together with us and let ---
 44 you know, let us know exactly what's going on at community
 45 college and what the future holds and so on.

1 would like to do joint office hours together, we can do it
 2 at any of the libraries in your community.
 3 So Councilman DeMarco and I had a good time
 4 doing it. Councilwoman Kirk had more fun than anyone at
 5 the library that night. She was really, really good at
