1 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: The meeting will come to
 2 order. Will you all rise for the Pledge of Allegiance to
 3 the flag and remain standing for silent prayer or
 4 reflection?
 5 After me ---.
 6 (Pledge of Allegiance.)
 7 (Silent prayer or reflection.)
 8 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Can we have the roll call?
 9 MR. BARKER: Mr. Baker?
 10 MR. BAKER: Here.

 42 MR. BARKER: A Proclamation declaring December
 43 2nd, 2018 as Child Loss Awareness Day in Allegheny County.
 44 Sponsored by Council Member Baker, Council Member Kirk and
 45 all other Members of Council.

1 Now, of all things, I'm not a big Facebook
 2 person. Okay? I don't do social media, but a friend from
 3 high school shares a post with me today, of all days from
 4 the Ugly Shoe Club. Are any of you familiar with that?
 5 The Ugly Shoe Club. I just wanted to read what's on their
 6 Facebook page and clarify things for me.
 7 It says I am wearing a pair of shoes. They are
 8 ugly shoes, uncomfortable shoes, I hate my shoes. Every
 9 day I wear them and each day I wish I had another pair.
 10 Some days, my shoes hurt so bad that I do not think I can
 11 take another step, yet I continue to wear them. I get
 12 funny looks wearing these shoes. They are looks of
 13 sympathy. I can tell in the other's eyes they are glad
 14 they are my shoes and not theirs.
 15 They never talk about my shoes. They never
 16 learn how awful --- my shoes might make them
 17 uncomfortable. I truly understand these shoes, you might
 18 never walk in them --- never want to walk in them, but
 19 once you put them on, you can never take them off. I now
 20 realize that I am not the only one who wears these shoes.
 21 There are many pairs in the world. Some women are like me
 22 and ache daily as they try and walk in them, some have
 23 learned how to walk in them so they don't hurt quite as
 24 much. Some have worn the shoes so long that days will go
 25 by before they think about how much they hurt.
 26 No woman deserves to wear these shoes, yet
 27 because of these shoes, I'm a stronger woman. These shoes
 28 have given me the strength to face anything. They have
 29 made me who I am. I will forever walk in the shoes of a
 30 woman who has lost a child.
 31 It's gender specific but we know that fits for
 32 any parent. It's author unknown but that --- that is a
 33 --- it's called Ugly Shoe Club, and it was full of a lot
 34 of information, tips for holidays and things like that and
 35 it just --- I never get a post from this woman and today
 36 this shows up on my Facebook page.
 37 I haven't seen her in 40 years. So I just
 38 thought that was fortuitous. So I'd like to read the
 39 Proclamation as we proclaim an awareness day so we can all
 40 learn to acknowledge what half of us or how many of us are
 41 going through that we don't know how to acknowledge, but
 42 we only learn by having to face things and doing it. Tom,
 43 do you want to read the proclamation?
 44 MR. BAKER: Sure. The --- the only thing I
 45 wanted to add was, Jamie, although it's a terrible reason

1 MS. KIRK: Could I welcome everyone who is here
 2 for the Child Loss Awareness to come up and stand
 3 together? We'll make room. Yeah, come on up.
 4 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Put some on the other side.
 5 MS. KIRK: Over here?
 6 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Yeah.
 7 MS. KIRK: Some people can step over here, too,
 8 or over here. Either way, we can go around. Okay. I
 9 just wanted to welcome everyone here tonight. It's a sort
 10 of a bittersweet night. We're all so happy you were able
 11 to come and come downtown and experience being here in the
 12 Gold Room. And I think it's nice for the kids, but at the
 13 same time, it's --- we have to just say we're proud that
 14 you all came and you could make it and you felt strong to
 15 come, so we can all stand together and make child loss
 16 awareness something we all understand better and we all
 17 become comfortable and we learn to acknowledge.
 18 We need to acknowledge people because for
 19 example, there was --- several years ago, I don't know if
 20 you remember the little girl who died in the --- when the
 21 slide fell on her in Ross, it was tragic. It was one of
 22 the neighbors I grew up with. And he told me about a year
 23 later, he felt people were walking across the street to
 24 avoid him because they didn't know what to say, didn't
 25 know what to do. Somehow, like someone would make him
 26 remember about Gillian, and as I'm sure you can attest,
 27 it's on your --- your child is on your mind 24/7.
 28 So it's important for us to learn to acknowledge
 29 and to visit and to call people and be aware. And the
 30 problem is, those of us on the outside, we can't even
 31 imagine --- imagine what you're going through and --- and
 32 unfortunately, you all on the inside can't explain it
 33 because I don't know if that's something you can explain.
 34 And so that --- that's what makes it so tough and we just
 35 have to learn to visit, to call, to acknowledge people
 36 because anyone who has lost a child, I --- I just can't
 37 imagine. I just can't imagine it.
 38 And I had someone tell me one time --- they
 39 described what grief was and they said, grief is love that
 40 has nowhere to go. And so when you have so much love and
 41 you can't share it and express it, it builds up and that's
 42 grief. And I thought that was an interesting way for
 43 those of us who haven't experienced this to maybe try and
 44 understand it just a little bit better.

1 that we're all together, I want to thank you for having
 2 --- and I seen this on your Facebook. I want to thank you
 3 for having the bravery to come to our last meeting. I
 4 know that took a lot to --- to come to our meeting and say
 5 that --- that we should all be working together, obviously
 6 on this. I want to thank you for bringing everyone
 7 together.
 8 The person I know out of this group is Darlene
 9 O'Laughlin, where's --- there's Darlene. Darlene and I
 10 have been friends for 15 or so years, and she started a
 11 movement out of the worst thing that ever happened in her
 12 life and that's Adeline's Angels. They have a 5K every
 13 year that is inspiring, sad, it's everything all in one,
 14 but Darlene does such a great job bringing the community
 15 together, and I'm so proud of Darlene as a resident of
 16 District 1, but more importantly as a friend.
 17 Jamie, you're bringing friends here together
 18 tonight to share in something terrible but together and
 19 through this community you can all be stronger and I think
 20 Cindy and I are proud to be your friend. I will say,
 21 Cindy said she's not going to be on Facebook but the three
 22 of us chat all day now it feels like.
 23 MS. KIRK: Messenger.
 24 MR. BAKER: Yeah, on Facebook messenger so Cindy
 25 --- and it's one of those conversations where there's
 26 three people and you feel like they've become best friends
 27 and you're the third wheel, but they talk all the time
 28 which is really, really nice. So we're happy to be here
 29 with you. Even though were not --- we wish we weren't
 30 with you. So I'll read the Proclamation.
 31 WHEREAS, in 2016, 42,723 children, ages birth to
 32 19, in the United States pass away. In Allegheny County
 33 alone, there were 1,258 children that died in 2014 and;
 34 WHEREAS, after the sudden and tragic loss of her
 35 daughter Mary Claire on December 2nd, 2017 at the age of
 36 10 years old, Jamie became an advocate for Child Loss
 37 Awareness and developed organizations and foundations in
 38 memory and honor of her daughter's sudden passing and;
 39 WHEREAS, the Mary Claire Foundation was
 40 established by Jamie to promote the advancement of
 41 pediatric medicine and organ donation by supporting
 42 research, building awareness and assisting families who
 43 have experienced child loss. During this tragic and
 44 troubling time, the community rallied behind Mary Claire's
 45 family and created the Mary's Christmas Project which

1 provides stuffed animals to children who are hospitalized
2 for the holidays;

3 WHEREAS, the Mary Claire Foundation grows. It
4 works to promote not only pediatric organ donation, a
5 decision Mary Claire's family made because they wanted to
6 help others and keep her strength and kindness alive. The
7 Mary Claire Foundation actively works to support
8 children's wellness and aid families who have experienced
9 child loss and Cindy, you've been leading this so I want
10 you to --- if you don't mind, read the last part.

11 MS. KIRK: NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That
12 we, Allegheny County Council Members Tom Baker, Cindy Kirk
13 and all Members of Council do hereby declare December 2nd,
14 2018 as Child Loss Awareness Day in Allegheny County, and
15 we recognize the Friedl family and Mary Claire Foundation
16 for raising the profile of Child Loss Awareness. WE
17 encourage all residents of Allegheny County to educate
18 themselves on pediatric medicine and organ donation

19 So there we have it. It's --- we tried to ---
20 actually, I tried to order pins to mark this day. They
21 did not arrive but the --- some of the kids here have ---
22 it's sort of like an Irish thing, you know, to have a
23 stone in your pocket and you rub it and you get stress ---
24 and it --- years ago, they used to do it until these stone
25 became actually smooth.

26 So we have a symbolic measure of this that the
27 children will pass out to everyone here and that's it.
28 Jamie, would you like to say a couple words?

29 MR. BAKER: Could we give Jamie a round of
30 applause for being so brave?
31 (Applause.)

32 MS. FRIEDL: Hello. I want to thank you all for
33 declaring December 2nd Child Loss Awareness Day. I
34 appreciate all the hard work, love and valuable time that
35 Council Member Cindy Kirk and Council Member Tom Baker and
36 Michelle McAndrews, as well as others that are behind the
37 scenes that I'm not aware of, have done to help dedicate
38 this to child loss awareness over the last few weeks in
39 order to make this Proclamation happen.

40 What I've come to realize is it does not matter
41 whether it's been an hour, a week, a month or 25 years
42 since you are told that your child died. There isn't a
43 moment in life once you lose your child that you do not
44 have them on your mind. The constant stream of what ifs,
45 the should bes and the would bes and the would've beens

1 MS. KOVACIC: We lost our son Michael Harvey
2 Kovacic, October 25th, 2015, Calvin's dad and Josie's dad.
3 MS. FERGUSON: Hi, everyone. First, I want to
4 say thank you to Jame for doing this really. I know
5 Jame through my --- through my son, so my son is Colin
6 Ferguson. He died when he was 23 back in 2008, and I know
7 some of these people, their kids have been lost just
8 recently but I will tell you that it's been going on 11
9 years, and there isn't a day that goes by that I've not
10 thought about my son and I miss him deeply.

11 BRIAN'S MOM: This is my son Brian. I lost him
12 10 years ago when he was 23, I miss him dearly.

13 MS. CAVANAUGH: Hi, this is my son. His name's
14 Killian Cavanaugh. He was 20 and he just died --- it will
15 be a year this December 9th.

16 MS. WALLS: This is our son, Billy Walls. He's
17 been gone 14 years now. He died January 29th, 2004 and
18 I've known Jamie's for a number of years but I wanted to
19 be here to support her and the rest of the parents to let
20 them know that your children want you to go on. And I'm
21 here to show you that you can and I just give Jamie so
22 much credit for having the strength to bring this
23 awareness to be able to help educate people because people
24 want to help. They just don't know how. Thank you,
25 Jamie.

1 never stop. The fear of them being forgotten become one
2 of the scariest thoughts that you now have because
3 realistically, you've already lived through the worst.

4 The past 356 days have been very difficult for
5 me. Mary was my life, she was my everything, the center
6 of my universe. Everything that I ever did for Mary Bear
7 --- everything that I ever did was for Mary Bear, and I'm
8 lost without her. My hope is that this Proclamation will
9 become a national day of recognition. I do not expect for
10 this day to cause any relief on parents' hearts that have
11 lost their children. I do hope it will bring an awareness
12 to others around us as a reminder that our children were
13 here and do exist, a day to recognize their lives and the
14 love that they brought to this world. Do you have
15 anything you want to say? Yeah, go ahead? This is
16 Taylor.

17 MS. KIRK: Would you like to say the name of the
18 person you lost?

19 TAYLOR: Mary Claire Friedl, my best friend.

20 MS. KIRK: She was your best friend?

21 TAYLOR: Yeah.

22 MS. KIRK: Yeah. You're a good friend, a good
23 friend. And now if we could have maybe --- I see all of
24 these beautiful pictures. If you'd like to come and just
25 say your child's name and then maybe we'll go up and get a
26 picture of this.

27 MS. FRIEDL: Yeah. Do you want to walk over
28 there with me?

29 TAYLOR: Yeah. Thank you.

30 MS. NOBBS: We lost Aiden Tanner Nobbs December
31 17th, just a couple weeks after Mary. He was 14.

32 MARTY'S MOTHER: My husband and I lost our son
33 Marty, he was stillborn.

34 MS. SUCCI: Marlena Succi, she was eight years
35 old.

36 MS. MCCALLUM: Victoria Gladys McCallum and she
37 passed away September 28th of 2001.

38 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Thank you.

39 MS. KING: Christopher King died at age 19 and
40 was an organ donor.

41 MS. O'LAUGHLIN: Adeline Margaret O'Laughlin.
42 She's forever 14 months, died October 18th, 2012.

43 MS. SUTEK: Greg --- Gregory Sutek. He was 19.
44 June 14th, 2017.

 36 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Under remarks? Seeing none,
 37 we'll take the roll call.
 38 MR. BARKER: Mr. Baker?
 39 MR. BAKER: Yes.
 40 MR. BARKER: Mr. Catena?
 41 MR. CATENA: Yes.
 42 MR. BARKER: Mr. DeMarco?
 43 MR. DEMARCO: Yes.
 44 MR. BARKER: Mr. Futules?
 45 MR. FUTULES: Yes.

1 I also want a copy of the Sunshine Act passed
 2 out at the same time. I don't know if you can get Sara or
 3 somebody else to help you. I attended the meeting here in
 4 this room and I was really upset because they took a vote
 5 that wasn't posted on the agenda. There was a --- on a
 6 --- on a policy change regarding the HP vaccine. Now,
 7 members of the citizenry came before us two years ago,
 8 County Council, when the Board of Health took a similar
 9 action, and we were sympathetic at that time to their
 10 cause.
 11 But what happened was they --- it's obvious to
 12 me, but I'm not an attorney --- that they violated the
 13 Sunshine Act when they took this vote on this resolution
 14 because they didn't post it ahead of time on the agenda.
 15 The public was not able to see what it --- what the words
 16 of the resolution were. They --- they just said okay, now
 17 we're --- you know, they had a presentation of --- a
 18 general presentation of vaccines in the County and then
 19 Dr. Harrison said, okay, did everyone have their packet?
 20 Does everyone have the resolution? And they didn't --- he
 21 said well, it's a page and a half long so I'm not going to
 22 read it and --- and then, they voted for it.
 23 So we have no idea why they supported the
 24 resolution, and again, the discussion should be
 25 transparent and open. That's why we have the Sunshine
 26 Act. If it didn't violate the Sunshine Act, it at least
 27 violated the spirit of the Sunshine Act, which is to do
 28 everything in open and everything transparent as we are
 29 elected officials and we appoint the Board of Health.
 30 The vaccine that was in question is discussed
 31 and I also have --- sorry to make you walk again, Mr.
 32 Barker --- was the resolution was about the HPV vaccine
 33 which I won't belabor the point. And I know that there's
 34 people here tonight to share their concerns about this
 35 very controversial vaccine that's been banned in Japan and
 36 India. And two years ago, again, the citizens came before
 37 us and shared their concerns about this vaccine.
 38 I personally have met two women because ---
 39 after the vaccine was administered to them, they suffered
 40 an adolescent premature ovarian insufficiency. In other
 41 words, all their eggs prematurely crystallized. They will
 42 never have a child as a result of the vaccine. So I just
 43 --- I wanted to share that, and I wanted to thank the
 44 citizens that are here tonight, all of them that are
 45 coming before this Council. And they come and exercise

1 their right as citizens to be involved and to speak to us
 2 and to come to us with their concerns. And I thank you
 3 all for participating in a democratic process in coming to
 4 us tonight with your concerns. Thank you very much, Mr
 5 President, for allowing me to speak.
 6 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay
 7 Representative Russell?
 8 MS. RANALLI-RUSSELL: Thank you, Mr. President.
 9 I also wanted to take this time to wish everyone a happy
 10 and blessed Thanksgiving. And not only am I thankful for
 11 my family and loved ones, but I am also thankful for each
 12 and every one of my colleagues here and our wonderful
 13 staff and administration that helps to make Allegheny
 14 County a wonderful place to live.
 15 So that is what Thanksgiving about, to be
 16 thankful for what you have and I'm thankful for each and
 17 every one of you. Thank you, Mr. President.
 18 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay
 19 Representative Baker?
 20 MR. BAKER: Oh, thanks. Right back at you, by
 21 the way, Councilwoman Ranalli-Russell. A couple quick
 22 updates. We filmed episode number 11 of get involved in
 23 Moon Township which did not win best talk show at the
 24 Greater Pittsburgh Community Awards, we came in second
 25 place, but that's okay but we had a good episode 11. If
 26 anyone ever wants to be on my public access show, please
 27 always let me know.
 28 I know former Councilman Gastgeb was really
 29 involved in public access as well during his time on
 30 Council. I represented Council at the NAOP panel last
 31 week. I was joined by Representative Austin Davis,
 32 Councilwoman Strassburger from City Council. And I think
 33 the one message that I often share and shared at that ---
 34 that --- is that --- many of you have probably heard this
 35 story before but --- but I run marathons. I run them very
 36 slowly.
 37 At marathons you always see signs that say,
 38 you're running better than our government. And what I
 39 always want to jog over and say is well, you haven't been
 40 to Allegheny County Council lately, because while we
 41 aren't perfect things run pretty well at the County level.
 42 I was reminded of that by five or six people on Friday
 43 night at light up night how well things are going within
 44 the County.

1 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Someone want to make a
 2 motion to receive and file?
 3 MR. MACEY: Receive and file.
 4 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Is there a second?
 5 MS. RANALLI-RUSSELL: Second.
 6 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Under remarks? Seeing none,
 7 all those in favor signify by saying aye.
 8 (Chorus of ayes)
 9 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Opposed? The ayes have it.
 10 Public comment?
 11 MR. BARKER: We have several. First up is Fawn
 12 Walker Montgomery.
 13 MS. MONTGOMERY: Good evening, County Council.
 14 I'm here to talk about my support for the Allegheny County
 15 Police Review Board. I've come to you several times just
 16 to show you my support. I want to thank Councilman Klein
 17 and Councilman Walton, as well as all the other Council
 18 people who voted in support of --- to move the Board
 19 forward.
 20 So I wanted to bring you all a letter that we
 21 have over --- over 30 businesses, community leaders and
 22 representatives who signed the letter. We also have an
 23 online petition with about over 250 and counting
 24 signatures now, so we'll start to bring those down to you
 25 monthly. I also have a support letter from State
 26 Representative Austin Davis, so I'll submit that ---
 27 submit that here for the record. I won't read the letter
 28 because I only have three minutes.
 29 If I could leave you all with anything, I think
 30 it's ironic that I came here today on a day that is child
 31 --- I guess, Child Loss Awareness Day. So as I sat there,
 32 I thought of Antwon Rose Jr., and he is noted here in this
 33 letter. He was a child 17 years old. His mother is
 34 grieving. There is a lot of children with Antwon, there's
 35 Mike Brown's mother or Trayvon Martin's mother. There's
 36 so many mothers that are grieving. We just want that same
 37 empathy for our children when our children die.
 38 If I could leave you with anything, please just
 39 note that regardless if they were in a gang, if they were
 40 not in a gang or what you think about them doesn't really
 41 matter. It's a child and a child is dead. So that same
 42 empathy that I clearly seen when I walked in that room, we
 43 just want that same empathy. And we should not have to
 44 put our lives on the line protesting in the streets,
 45 risking getting hit by cars to get it.

1 So like Councilwoman Ranalli-Russell, I'm also
 2 thankful for my colleagues. A couple nice awards updates
 3 from District 1. Three Rivers Champions awards which was
 4 given by Pittsburgh magazine, Art Hazen won that award and
 5 then Pittsburgh Botanic Garden which Councilman Catena and
 6 I share --- Nancy Zapalla, who's actually the first big
 7 sister in BBBS history. She won an award at that for all
 8 of her service with the botanic garden.
 9 And finally, I'd like to put a challenge out to
 10 my colleagues especially Councilwoman Kirk but everyone is
 11 invited. The second annual District 1 Ross Westview
 12 trivia night will be on December 5th at Stoke's in Ross
 13 Township. So, if you know things about Ross and Westview
 14 or the North Hills in general, John Schalecosky, who is the
 15 number one trivia guy in town and history guy in town is
 16 my co-host for the event so ---
 17 MS. KIRK: I've loved it, Tom.
 18 MR. BAKER: I feel like you --- yeah, you've got
 19 to come and participate, so yeah. So December 5th, mark
 20 it on that calendar please, Councilwoman Kirk. And Mr.
 21 President, that is it. Happy Thanksgiving.
 22 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Moving right along
 23 here, we'll go to 10875-18.
 24 MR. BARKER: A Resolution approving a project
 25 for the benefit of Carnegie Mellon University to be
 26 financed by the Allegheny County Higher Education Building
 27 Authority by the issuance of the Authority's tax-exempt
 28 revenue bonds in two or more series to be designated to
 29 Allegheny County Higher Education Building Authority,
 30 Carnegie Mellon University Revenue Bonds, Series A of 2019
 31 and Allegheny County Higher Education Building Authority,
 32 Carnegie Mellon University Revenue Bonds, Series B of
 33 2019, or such other designations as may be determined by
 34 the Authority and the University, in an aggregate
 35 principal amount not to exceed \$125 million, provided that
 36 the taxing power of the County of Allegheny, Pennsylvania
 37 shall not be obligated in any way with respect to the
 38 Bonds, and declaring the financing of such project as
 39 desirable for the health, safety and welfare of the people
 40 in the County. Sponsored by the Chief Executive.
 41 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: That'll be referred to the
 42 Committee on Economic Development and Housing. 10876-18.
 43 MR. BARKER: A Communication summarizing
 44 approved executive actions from October 1st through
 45 October 31st, 2018.

1 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Next?
 2 MR. BARKER: Next up is Khalid Raheem.
 3 MR. RAHEEM: Good evening, everyone. I want to
 4 thank Council for an opportunity to once again just
 5 address you all, and just to remind Council and to remind
 6 the audience as well as the viewing audience who will
 7 probably see this now or at some other point that it is
 8 very, very important that we move forward with passing
 9 this Civilian Police Review Board for Allegheny County.
 10 We certainly want to move our County in a more
 11 progressive direction when it comes to 21st century
 12 policing. When it comes to making sure that the various
 13 municipalities and the accompanying police departments and
 14 districts all fall under one general umbrella and employ
 15 the best practices possible when it comes to policing the
 16 residents of our great County.
 17 So I want to thank all of you who voted in
 18 support of it, and I want to encourage those of you who
 19 didn't support it to seriously reconsider. We need to
 20 move this County forward. This is not the Wild West.
 21 This is not the 19th century. This is the 21st century.
 22 Again, thank you again for your support.
 23 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Next?
 24 MR. BARKER: Next up is James Lyons Weiler.
 25 MR. LYONS-WEILER: Thank you, Mr. President and
 26 the Council for hearing us today on some troubling issues.
 27 My name is Dr. James Lyons-Weiler. I'm a resident of
 28 Allegheny County in Hampton Township. I'm lucky enough to
 29 have raised both of my children in this great area. I'm a
 30 lifelong biomedical researcher, having brought over 27 and
 31 a half million dollars in collaborative funding to the
 32 University of Pittsburgh Cancer Institute. I have had
 33 academic appointments in the department of pathology, full
 34 faculty at UPCL under Dr. Ron Herberman, and I cofounded
 35 the University of Pittsburgh bioinformatics analysis corps
 36 with Drs. Art Levine and Dr. Michelle Brodo. And where I
 37 and my staff analyzed and completed over 100 research
 38 studies with faculty from nearly every department in the
 39 School of Medicine, including the Graduate School of
 40 Public Health. As a citizen of Allegheny County, I have
 41 helped raise funds with concerts for various families who
 42 have had family members with terminal cancer to help keep
 43 those families out of debt. I volunteer as a cancer
 44 patient advocate helping people around the county
 45 facilitate a communication between families and their

1 doctors. One of the families I helped is a local family
 2 who needed a van so the wife could come and go to the
 3 hospital because she's paralyzed --- and to her husband's
 4 amazing musical performances. The reason why she's
 5 paralyzed is to be able to enter this country she had to
 6 take a full suite of vaccines. Now, this family has
 7 watched the mom and the wife spend decades in a wheelchair
 8 as a result. Not once has this family ever stepped
 9 forward to say to anybody else that they suspect that her
 10 MS was caused by the vaccines. I, along with other
 11 citizens of Allegheny County, have repeatedly communicated
 12 the widespread scientific and medical real concerns over
 13 the HPV vaccine to the Board of Health in the tiniest
 14 three minute segments, all of which they have ignored.
 15 And they allot themselves 45 minute presentations. The
 16 entire country of Japan, as you've heard, does not
 17 recommend the vaccine for the population. And Dr. Sin
 18 Hang Lee and other M.D.s and Ph.D.s have communicated
 19 concerns over fraud in the Merck safety trials leading up
 20 to FDA approval. All of you have received a book courtesy
 21 of public donations by a faculty member of the School of
 22 Law at New York University outlining the grave reality of
 23 those concerns. At the time, Merck had 32 instances of
 24 misconduct and was on probation by the HHS. These
 25 concerns have been communicated to the Board of Health,
 26 but to no avail. And I'm not here to debate vaccines.
 27 I'm here to say that there appear to have been serious
 28 procedural maneuverings by the Board of Health that may
 29 have violated both civil and criminal law to achieve their
 30 latest action on the vaccine, the HPV vaccine, a
 31 nonbinding, I repeat, nonbinding resolution of a
 32 recommendation for HPV vaccine for children. They have
 33 been tracking this vaccine uptake in school districts with
 34 potential violations of medical privacy for students.
 35 There has been insufficient public oversight of the Board
 36 of Health's actions, and thus, the public is keeping all
 37 of our options open at this time. I am sorry to have to
 38 report that an independent investigation has thus far
 39 revealed that at least one of the Board of Health members
 40 has for two years failed to report serious financial
 41 conflicts of interest. The pending complaint provides
 42 evidence ---

43 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Finish it up.
 44 DR LYONS-WEILER --- of longstanding repeated
 45 personal and professional financial ties between this

1 come to light showing multiple massive deception in
 2 Gardasil pre-licensing and testing. Do you understand how
 3 serious a problem this is? If this were any other product
 4 it would have been pulled from the market by now. Imagine
 5 an infant car seat with this kind of history. Two weeks
 6 ago, I wrote a letter to the Allegheny County Board of
 7 Health, a letter specifically addressed to them from Emily
 8 Tarsell, whose daughter's death was acknowledged by the US
 9 government as a Gardasil-induced death. But after hearing
 10 all this information, the Board of Health suddenly
 11 introduced a resolution that was not on the agenda to
 12 recommend this vaccine to every child in Allegheny County
 13 unless their doctors counseled otherwise. The full
 14 resolution was never read out loud in the public meeting,
 15 but they voted on it. When Dr. James Lyons-Weiler asked
 16 if he could ask a question on procedure, he was shouted
 17 down by Dr. Hacker, who never addressed his question but
 18 kept repeating this is not a question and answer period.
 19 There was no transparency here, and the only thing that is
 20 clear is that the Board of Health is engaged in product
 21 marketing for a very expensive invasive medical
 22 intervention that has nothing to do with public health.
 23 Thank you for the opportunity to address you, and I have
 24 some packets.

25 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Next?
 26 MR BARKER: Next up is Jessica Fitzgerald.
 27 MS FITZGERALD: Hi, my name is Jessica
 28 Fitzgerald, and I just want to thank you for allowing me
 29 to be here today to speak to you all. The Allegheny
 30 County Board of Health has told the public that the HPV
 31 vaccine is safe. However, there is a lot of evidence that
 32 states otherwise as you have heard here today.
 33 I would also like to address or express my
 34 concerns regarding the Allegheny County Board of Health.
 35 On November 7th, a few of us attended an Allegheny County
 36 Board of Health because we had seen on the agenda that two
 37 citizens were to comment on, quote, HPV vaccine. There
 38 was no indication on the agenda about HPV vaccine. The
 39 only thing it stated under new business was a vaccine
 40 update by Kris --- by Dr. Kristen Mertz. Nothing
 41 specifically about the HPV vaccine.
 42 One of us actually even e-mailed to ask if HPV
 43 was going to be spoken on, and the answer was I don't
 44 think so because it's not on the agenda. However, at the
 45 meeting after Dr. Mertz's vaccine update, the chairman

1 member and vaccine manufacturers not reported to the
 2 County as required.
 3 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Would you please finish it
 4 up?
 5 DR LYONS-WEILER: I will, sir. Thank you. The
 6 Board of Health has no business advertising or promoting
 7 specific commercial products or specific healthcare
 8 services and the entire enterprise, including a failed
 9 attempt to push a mandate two years ago, smacks of fascism
 10 in Allegheny County and in the US in 2018. Thank you.

11 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Next?
 12 MR BARKER: Next up is Alison Fujito.
 13 MS FUJITO: Two and a half years ago the
 14 Allegheny County Board of Health attempted to push a
 15 mandate for Gardasil HPV vaccine, and since then I've
 16 appeared before them eight times to make public comments.
 17 This is a vaccine with enormous discrepancies between the
 18 actual data and the claims of necessity, safety and
 19 efficacy. Ninety-five (95) percent of women infected with
 20 HPV clear it with no treatment, no cancer, no
 21 complications whatsoever. And of the remaining five
 22 percent only a fraction of those go on to possibly develop
 23 cervical cancer. The vast majority of those cases can be
 24 caught by yearly PAP testing and successfully treated in a
 25 pre-cancerous stage, no chemo, no radiation, minimal
 26 surgery. We also know that HPV on its own doesn't cause
 27 cancer. It requires the presence of other risk factors,
 28 such as smoking, drug use, multiple sexual partners or
 29 other STDs. And as for penile, anal and especially mouth
 30 and throat cancers, the CDC states that testing has never
 31 been done to show that the vaccine would prevent those
 32 cancers. In fact, there's no data showing this vaccine
 33 prevents cancer at all, only that it triggers antibodies,
 34 and for only nine out of over 100 HPV types. In the
 35 initial studies, 30 percent of the women tested had no
 36 measurable immunity after less than five years, so
 37 efficacy doesn't look good. A few weeks ago, Dr. Hacker,
 38 the vice chair of the Board of Health, was on KDKA's
 39 morning radio show where she joined Mary Griffin in
 40 aggressively recommending this vaccine and in completely
 41 misrepresenting the serious safety concerns which many of
 42 us have presented to the Board of Health. There have been
 43 438 reported deaths associated with HPV vaccines. Merck's
 44 own data shows a shockingly high number of new autoimmune
 45 conditions following vaccination. Recent evidence has

1 proposed a vote on a resolution on HPV vaccine. We were
 2 blindsided. We had no idea what they were doing or what
 3 they were voting on because it was not on the agenda. It
 4 also looked as though some of the Board members were
 5 puzzled because one asked to see the document, and the
 6 other asked what exactly they were voting on, but I
 7 couldn't really hear her comment because her microphone
 8 was turned off but it's all in the video.

9 At this point, Dr. Lyons-Weiler, an Allegheny
 10 citizen in the audience, stood up to ask a procedural
 11 question about this motion to vote on a resolution which
 12 was not read out loud nor posted on the website nor shared
 13 at a previous meeting. He was told to sit down and stop
 14 talking, or they would ask him to be removed. So we were
 15 shocked and the public was kept in the dark about this and
 16 not permitted to give comment.

17 All we ask is for our government officials to be
 18 transparent to the people they serve. We would like your
 19 help in rescinding this resolution. Also, when I signed
 20 up to speak here today, it is stating --- it stated at the
 21 top of the request form, quote, Act 20 of the General
 22 Assembly of Pennsylvania provides for reasonable
 23 opportunity for residents of or taxpayers of Allegheny
 24 County to comment on governmental matters, official
 25 actions or deliberations which are or may be before the
 26 Allegheny County Council prior to the taking of official
 27 action.

28 The term official action is defined in the
 29 Sunshine law to include a vote on a proposal, a
 30 resolution, a rule, a regulation, ordinance, report or
 31 order. So I believe that the Allegheny County Board of
 32 Health, their actions on November 7th, were in violation
 33 of this. Thank you for your time.

34 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Next?
 35 MR BARKER: Last up is Michael Fitzgerald.
 36 MR FITZGERALD: First of all, I'd just like to
 37 thank everybody for allowing me to speak today. I am a
 38 citizen of Allegheny County and a concerned father. As
 39 you've heard many times already, in 2016, the Allegheny
 40 County Board of Health tried to institute a mandate for
 41 HPV vaccine, and it was discussed how to get more parents
 42 to agree to give the vaccine to their children, even if
 43 their parents didn't want their children to receive it ---
 44 or I'm sorry, that their children didn't want to receive
 45 it.

1 At their last meeting, they voted on a
 2 resolution without public notification to recommend a
 3 vaccine for all children in the County, unless their
 4 physicians advised otherwise. Why is the Allegheny County
 5 Board of Health imposing to take away the parents' role
 6 here. This is not a disease that you can get from going
 7 to school or from being out and about in the community.
 8 This is --- this is not in any way a true public health
 9 issue.
 10 If our County Health Department is permitted to
 11 take this decision away from parents, from the parents'
 12 hands, what other controversial position will they attempt
 13 to mandate. I'm concerned because the controversial
 14 vaccine needs to be studied more before it is recommended
 15 to be given to our precious beloved children. This
 16 vaccine has by far the worst safety record of any vaccine
 17 on the market. Their claims are that it is safe but we
 18 know more deaths have been reported associated with
 19 Gardasil than any other vaccine.
 20 The vaccine adverse event report system, VAERS,
 21 has over 59,000 reports of injury and over 400 deaths from
 22 this vaccine alone. And that's not --- and that's only
 23 with about 50 percent of the children receiving the
 24 vaccine. Consider those rates when it becomes mandated,
 25 that these will go up and thousands more will be injured
 26 or die. Consider Japan has banned their health --- health
 27 professionals from recommending the HPC vaccine because of
 28 the many horrific side effects it is causing their
 29 children. This vaccine clearly is not safe. Please refer
 30 to SaneVax.org to read more --- many more stories about
 31 HPV vaccine injuries that are not a rare and isolated side
 32 effect. Remember, Gardasil is --- is manufactured by the
 33 same pharmaceutical company who gave us Vioxx that killed
 34 thousands upon thousands of people, even though their
 35 studies had shown that it was safe. Thank you for your
 36 time.
 37 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Does someone want to make a
 38 motion to adjourn?
 39 MR. WALTON: So moved.
 40 MR. PALMIERE: Second.
 41 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: All those in favor, signify
 42 by saying aye.
 43 (Chorus of ayes.)
 44 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Opposed? The ayes have it.
 45 Meeting adjourned. Happy Thanksgiving to everybody.
