1 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Meeting will come to order
 2 and we all rise for the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag
 3 and remain standing for silent prayer or reflection.

 7 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: We'll have the roll call.

 39 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: 10559-18.
 40 MR. BARKER: Proclamation declaring March 2018
 41 Women's History Month in Allegheny County. Sponsored by
 42 Council Members Kirk, Means, Prizio and Ranalli-Russell.
 43 MS. KIRK: Hi.
 44 So we're here as women of the council to mark
 45 this as Women's History Month. We think it's important,

1 research, publications and conservation efforts helped lay
 2 the ground work for the creation of the United States
 3 Environmental Protection Agency. Also in the 1960s,
 4 Stephanie Kwolek, an Allegheny County native and Carnegie
 5 Melon University graduate, invented Kevlar fabric, a high
 6 strength material that is used today to protect police and
 7 military personnel everywhere; and
 8 WHEREAS, a great progress has been made towards
 9 achieving equality. Women are nearly half of our nation's
 10 workers and they're increasingly among the most skilled.
 11 Women's participation in the US labor force has climbed 24
 12 percent since World War II. The portion of women ---
 13 proportion of women with college degrees in the labor
 14 force has almost quadrupled since 1970. The range of
 15 occupations women workers hold has also expanded with
 16 women making notable gains in professional and managerial
 17 occupations. In 2016, more than one in three lawyers was
 18 a woman, compared to fewer than one in ten in 1974. Women
 19 have made great progress, but there is still more work to
 20 be done.
 21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we,
 22 Allegheny County Council members Cindy Kirk, Councilwoman
 23 Anti Prizio, Sue Means and Denise Ranalli-Russell, do
 24 hereby proclaim March 2018 Women's History Month in
 25 Allegheny County and we recognize the trailblazers of our
 26 past and those dedicated to our future.
 27 Signed by the council, especially the women.
 28 Would you like to say anything?
 29 (Applause.)
 30 MS. MEANS: I did read about the Wright
 31 brothers' sister, and they did get discouraged at one
 32 point and she encouraged them to keep on going. And I
 33 recently was watching the History Channel and I remember
 34 reading to my children that Sacajawea was very
 35 instrumental in helping Lewis and Clark reach the Pacific
 36 coast. So without her, they wouldn't have made it. So we
 37 have a rich history of women helping move our nation
 38 along. So today's just a day to celebrate.
 39 Thank you.
 40 MS. RANALLI-RUSSELL: And now you have all of us
 41 (indicating).
 42 MS. KIRK: And we're all (indicating) on
 43 council.
 44 (Applause.)
 45 MS. KIRK: Thank you. Should we get a ---?

1 for example, and I think it's --- I learned it from Amie
 2 Down's who's at the --- in the Chief's office, little
 3 things like you --- everyone heard of the Wright brothers.
 4 Did you ever hear of the Wright sister? She was very
 5 instrumental to the whole process, and that's what's
 6 important about months like these because people will post
 7 things you'll take an effort to learn that perhaps the
 8 sister was the one --- maybe that's one of the reasons we
 9 fly, because she was right there. And I had never heard
 10 of her until I saw it on Amie's website. So that's one of
 11 the reasons.
 12 And today, you'll notice we don't have anyone in
 13 particular to give this proclamation to. We're doing it
 14 in honor of all the women and all the men who have a
 15 sister, a daughter, a mother. We're all connected. It's
 16 for everyone because women's history is everyone's
 17 history. So that said, I'm going to read the
 18 proclamation.
 19 A proclamation declaring Women's History
 20 Month ---.
 21 WHEREAS, throughout history, women have driven
 22 humanity forward on the path to a more equal and just
 23 society, contributing in countless ways to our character
 24 and progress. In the face of discrimination and undue
 25 hardship, women have never given up on the promise of
 26 America that with hard work and determination, nothing is
 27 out of reach; and
 28 WHEREAS, during this Women's History Month, we
 29 honor the pioneers of the past and we remember their
 30 legacies by carrying forward the valuable lessons learned
 31 from the powerful examples they set. Due to the courage
 32 of so many brave women who dared to prove they were
 33 capable of doing all that a man could do and more,
 34 advances were made, barriers were broken and progress
 35 prevailed; and
 36 WHEREAS, the theme of this year's Women's
 37 History Month is, nevertheless, she persisted; and
 38 WHEREAS, Allegheny County has a rich history of
 39 women trail blaze --- women trailblazers that inspired and
 40 continue to inspire the vision, action, determination of
 41 women. In the early 20th century, the Pittsburgh courier,
 42 Jackie Omes --- Ormes, excuse me --- became the first
 43 successful black woman newspaper cartoonist. In 1962,
 44 Allegheny County native Rachel Carson published her
 45 groundbreaking book, Silent Spring. Rachel Carson's

1 MS. MEANS: What do we do?
 2 MS. KIRK: Do you want to get a picture? Yeah,
 3 a picture of the four women today.
 4 (Pictures taken.)
 5 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: 10560-18.
 6 MR. BARKER: Certificates of Recognition
 7 commending the Pittsburgh Service Summit honorees.
 8 Sponsored by Council Member Baker.
 9 MR. BARKER: All right. Thank you, Mr.
 10 President.
 11 If we can have all of the honorees for the
 12 Service Summit this year come on up. So --- I see you all
 13 hiding in the back row there, a lot of you. So Jackie,
 14 Trisha Vince, Andréa --- yeah, you're here for double
 15 purpose.
 16 MR. FUTULES: Sorry to interfere, but Nick
 17 Futules is on the phone.
 18 MR. BAKER: That is good timing because we're
 19 about to share some great information. Next Tuesday is
 20 the 9th Annual Pittsburgh Service Summit. This morning,
 21 it was declared Service Summit Day in the City of
 22 Pittsburgh by City Council, which was great. A lot of our
 23 friends here got to share in that celebration this
 24 morning. We have some absolutely incredible honorees this
 25 year.
 26 And for those of you that don't know too much
 27 about the Service Summit, Get Involved! is a 501(c)(3)
 28 nonprofit that my wife and I started about a decade ago.
 29 Every year, we have the Service Summit where we have
 30 incredible honorees, great speakers.
 31 The keynotes this year, our Chief, Scott
 32 Schubert, who is the --- the Police Chief in the City of
 33 Pittsburgh. He's a --- he's a very good chief. He's a
 34 great person. He's been involved with Special Olympics.
 35 For many, many years, we served on the State Board
 36 together. He's going to be a wonderful keynote. And then
 37 Mayor Marita Garret, who is everywhere right now and doing
 38 incredible things. So she is the --- the other keynote
 39 for the event.
 40 My co-emcee --- this is going to put a little
 41 pressure on all the honorees. My co-emcee this year is
 42 Natalie Bencivenga. She is the Editor of SEEN, so we'll
 43 all have to look really nice, look really fancy for the
 44 Service Summit. I know it's about giving --- making a

1 difference in the community, but she'll be there to make
 2 sure that we're all dressed to the nines as well
 3 Most importantly with the Service Summit other
 4 than the honorees, we have vendor tables in the back of
 5 the room where people can learn how to get involved in our
 6 region, how to get involved in our city, in our county to
 7 make a difference, not to be bored but to be on a board of
 8 directors, a young professional board, be on a committee,
 9 volunteer with something that they care about.
 10 With our terrific honorees here tonight, this is
 11 exactly what they're doing. That's why the committee and
 12 the board selected these amazing folks to be honorees for
 13 the Service Summit this year. And I think I'm going to
 14 actually have Jackie Dixon go last because we had her do
 15 it this --- this morning and it was --- it was pretty
 16 incredible.
 17 So some of our honorees that are here today,
 18 we've got Keyva Clark. Maybe for each one, we'll have
 19 them say their name, where they work and their favorite
 20 thing to be involved with. Does that sound good, Keyva
 21 Clark? Okay. All right. Sounds good.
 22 MS. CLARK: Do I have to do a ---?
 23 MR. BAKER: Yeah --- yeah. Come on.
 24 MS. CLARK: My name's Keyva Clark. I'm a
 25 Communications Analyst for the City of Pittsburgh, office
 26 of Mayor William Peduto. And my favorite thing is to work
 27 with the county and the city every day to make this a more
 28 livable and inclusive city.
 29 MR. BAKER: Okay. Very good. That was your
 30 second excellent answer of the day. All right. All
 31 right. Timothy Jones, congratulations.
 32 MR. JONES: My name is Timothy Jones, I work
 33 for the Veterans Leadership Program of Western
 34 Pennsylvania. I'm also a navy veteran, and my passion is
 35 serving my brothers and sisters and helping them navigate
 36 the transitions of their life.
 37 MR. BAKER: All right. Our award winner for
 38 child advocacy this year is Patricia Vince of Zachary's
 39 Mission. Congratulations.
 40 MS. VINCE: Thank you. My name is Patricia
 41 Vince and I started Zachary's Mission and we help families
 42 with medically fragile children in the community. We help
 43 them through the most difficult times, with the most basic
 44 needs, to make it a little bit easier for them to stay at
 45 their child's bedside.

1 MS. TANG: Thank you.
 2 MR. BAKER: And the nice thing is, for some of
 3 the people, I'm meeting them for the first time tonight.
 4 So Anna Tang, tell us about you.
 5 MS. TANG: I work at Duquesne University and I
 6 also work for Bike Pittsburgh, and I'm on the Board of the
 7 Friendship Community Group.
 8 And what I enjoy doing the most, day to day, is
 9 bike commuting to work and I like to also help other
 10 people enjoy the outdoors, recreation and the environment
 11 and what --- you know, what you can do in your down time
 12 and/or incorporate into your daily life.
 13 MR. BAKER: All right. Thanks, Anna. And so
 14 every year, we have a man and a woman of the year. The
 15 man of the year this year is Greg Behr and the woman of
 16 the year --- and honestly, I was saying it this morning,
 17 when we --- when we looked at the list of the award, of
 18 the people that were nominated for man and woman of the
 19 year, it was a who's who of our region, just some of the
 20 most incredible people you've ever met in your life. And
 21 I was so proud that at the end of the --- a very long
 22 discussion, that none other than Jackie Dixon was selected
 23 as our woman of the year. She is a true blessing to this
 24 region and does so much good in all of her career. She
 25 does more retired than most of us do working.
 26 So Jackie Dixon, congratulations on being woman
 27 of the year.
 28 MS. DIXON: Thank you. I want to thank County
 29 Council and I want to thank Tom for this award. And I
 30 want to thank all of you for being here. If I told you
 31 all of the things that I am involved in, we would be here
 32 until midnight.
 33 But --- but I also want to thank --- if you want
 34 to know who I work for, I guess I work for God. And I
 35 think the second person I work for is Rich (indicating)
 36 Fitzgerald. And I say that because he nominated me, maybe
 37 about four years ago, to the regional asset district, and
 38 we have about \$100,000,000. And there are seven people
 39 who serve on that board and I've made it my business to
 40 try to visit all 100 of the organizations that we service.
 41 So I am a very, very business person.
 42 But today I want to acknowledge these young
 43 people because they are young and gifted and diverse and
 44 they are talented. I grew up in Alabama, and you may can

1 MR. BAKER: All right. Very good, Andréa
 2 Stanford who's here double purpose, so Andréa ---
 3 MS. STANFORD: Thank you, Councilman Baker.
 4 Good evening. I know most of you. I'm the Assistant
 5 County Manager.
 6 My name's Andréa Stanford and what I love doing
 7 here in this city on a volunteer basis is mentorship for
 8 young women, particularly for the organization Strong
 9 Women Strong Girls which mentors elementary school girls
 10 who in turn, are mentored by undergraduate students, who
 11 in turn are mentored by professional women in the larger
 12 community. So thank you for this honor.
 13 MR. BAKER: Thanks, Andréa. Very glad that ---
 14 Willy, everything's going well with Andréa?
 15 MR. MCKAIN: Understatement.
 16 MR. BAKER: Arthur Pang --- congratulations,
 17 Arthur.
 18 MR. PANG: Thank you, Tom. My name's Arthur
 19 Pang. I'm the Government Affairs Representative for PPG.
 20 I guess my favorite thing to do around the city is really
 21 engaging with all of the people in our community from a
 22 leadership perspective, whether it's community leaders to
 23 city, county, federal, to advanced public policy that
 24 includes all of the residents of Pittsburgh. Thank you.
 25 MR. BAKER: And a fun fact about Arthur and I is
 26 I was the Chair of the PUMP Board ten years ago. So he's
 27 like my decade anniversary, I guess. He's the --- the ---
 28 the Chair of the PUMP Board, Pittsburgh Urban Magnet
 29 Project which is --- which is great. Jordan Ball,
 30 congratulations.
 31 MR. BALL: Thank you. I'm Jordan Ball. I serve
 32 as a Southwestern Regional Representative for our United
 33 States Senator Bob Casey.
 34 Something that I really enjoy doing is working
 35 with leaders from all walks of life at the local, state
 36 and federal government, including County Executive Rich
 37 Fitzgerald, to really find the common ground, bridge the
 38 urban and rural divide and amplify voices of the forgotten
 39 men and women in small town and rural America.
 40 MR. BAKER: Thanks, Jordan. Is it Anna?
 41 MS. TANG: Yes.
 42 MR. BAKER: Anna Tang? Hi Anna,
 43 congratulations.
 44 MS. TANG: Thank you.
 45 MR. BAKER: Here you go. Congratulations.

1 hear it in my accent. I've been in here --- been here a
 2 long time.
 3 But I --- I always think of something that Maya
 4 Angelou said, and she said that segregation shaped me, but
 5 education liberated me. So these people don't have to be
 6 shaped, they're already educated and already liberated.
 7 So I'm just so proud of them for --- because they are our
 8 future, you know. I can only go so long. I'm getting
 9 older now, but I --- but Rich Fitzgerald keeps me real
 10 busy.
 11 But thank you so much. Thank you so very,
 12 much.
 13 (Applause.)
 14 MR. BAKER: What a wonderful group. Again, next
 15 Tuesday night 5:00 to 8:00 at Carlow. It's just going to
 16 be wonderful, the 9th annual. Congrats to our honorees.
 17 And --- and like Jackie said, Rich has gotten
 18 you involved. I would challenge all of our rising stars
 19 and Patricia, keep getting other people involved in our
 20 community. That's what this organization's all about.
 21 You're getting involved and make sure that you're also
 22 passing it --- paying it forward and getting other people
 23 involved in the community. And keep up all of the great
 24 work.
 25 But now we'll take a group picture.
 26 Congratulations to all of our honorees.
 27 MS. DIXON: Thank you.
 28 (Applause.)
 29 (Pictures taken.)
 30 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: 10561-18, and the rest of
 31 the proclamations will be read into the record.
 32 MR. BARKER: 10561-18. Certificate of
 33 Recognition awarded to the Borough & Township Police
 34 Association awardees. Sponsored by Council Members Macey,
 35 Means and all Members of Council.
 36 10562-18. Proclamation congratulating the
 37 Bethel Park High School's student team for winning the
 38 Police Data Challenge. Sponsored by Council Member Means.
 39 And 10563-18. Proclamation honoring the life,
 40 memory and legacy of Sylvina "Vina" March. Sponsored by
 41 Council Member Macey.
 42 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. At this time, we'll
 43 have the Chief Executive Quarterly Address.
 44 (Applause.)

1 CHIEF EXECUTIVE FITZGERALD: Thank you, Mr.
 2 President and members of council.
 3 And also, congratulations on two wonderful
 4 proclamations. I've gone to the event in Carlow a number
 5 of years, it's great. And to see such dedicated young
 6 people doing such work, and Jackie Dixon who has been
 7 doing work in this community for years and years and
 8 continues to, and I think you said it right. She probably
 9 does more in retirement than most people do in their work.
 10 And National US History Month, also something
 11 we're putting out every day. Amie Downs is putting out
 12 two people of distinguished valor and service who have
 13 done work in this county every day. So that's two great
 14 things.
 15 I also want to highlight for us, looking out,
 16 it's been a rough winter. And I want to start with our
 17 Public Works Department who have really done a yeoman's
 18 duty over the last couple of months. I can't remember a
 19 winter in which one day it would be five degrees, the next
 20 day it would be 50 degrees and there would be ice storms
 21 and snow and everything in between, as we're seeing on,
 22 what, the first day of spring tomorrow. Right?
 23 So Director Shanley and his team have really
 24 been doing a terrific job and I think they made us all
 25 look good. We know the challenges that occur, whether
 26 it's in the middle of the night on a weekend, rush hour,
 27 all the things that we have to do, they've really done a
 28 good job. They were getting ready to start paving and
 29 milling, but I think that might be delayed probably a
 30 little bit. And we know the great work they've done the
 31 last couple of years and we want to make sure we can keep
 32 up that type of schedule where we can do 50 plus miles of
 33 paving and milling of our county roads, and we've
 34 certainly heard that.
 35 I also want to single out our emergency
 36 services. We've had more mud and landslides, hillsides
 37 that have come down this year, flooding earlier on. And
 38 Matt Brown and his team, emergency services really, again,
 39 doing yeoman's work out in some of our communities that
 40 suffer from this every year. I know Councilman Macey,
 41 Elizabeth seems to always be one of those areas that gets
 42 hit at that time. And the work that they've done, we can
 43 be very proud of.
 44 And then the third one I want to put out for
 45 distinction is our elections department. We've had three

1 100 years --- started over 100 years ago and is being
 2 converted with our continuing along those lines.
 3 And McGee Women's Research Institute announced a
 4 couple of weeks ago that they will be hosting a worldwide
 5 summit in October --- October 9th and 10th in which they
 6 will be awarding a \$1,000,000 prize to the most innovative
 7 women's health initiatives that are out there. And we're
 8 going to see some of the foremost researchers come to our
 9 town. McGee Women's Research Institute is the leading
 10 research institute in the country, right here in our back
 11 yard. Again, something we can be --- we can be very proud
 12 of.
 13 We did get the announcement --- not the
 14 announcement --- but an announcement from Amazon that they
 15 were going to add --- be adding 125 jobs to their cloud
 16 based research facility over on the South Side as they
 17 continue to add more employment here in our region. And
 18 obviously, we are hoping for the --- the announcement, but
 19 that's probably some time into the future when they pick
 20 one of those cities.
 21 The school district of Montour really stands
 22 out. And I know (indicating) Councilman Catena was there
 23 with us, I guess two weeks ago. We were there with the
 24 Lego decided to make Montour School District their
 25 national model of a maker space. We all know Legos, our
 26 kids have played with them. We played with them as kids.
 27 But what --- what's going on and what they're doing in
 28 manufacturing and making innovative products, starting at
 29 our --- you know, starting with our young kids that ---
 30 that are really the future of where this is going, is ---
 31 is again, really exciting and we're very proud of Montour
 32 School District and that they were awarded that --- that
 33 distinction.
 34 Back to healthcare, I want to give a shot out to
 35 West Penn Hospital. West Penn Hospital earned the Magnet
 36 Accreditation, which is the highest accreditation for
 37 nursing that you can get in this country. They were the
 38 first one in the state to get this a number of years ago,
 39 and they have gotten it now three times. And they really
 40 --- it's something to be really proud of. Again, right in
 41 our back yard that we have such distinction of --- of ---
 42 of medical professionals that --- that are occurring right
 43 here.
 44 Over at the Nova Place, the old --- most of us
 45 know it as the Allegheny --- Allegheny Center Mall, but

1 special elections already this year before the primary has
 2 even begun, including last week's election in which the
 3 nation and maybe the world had its eyes on Western
 4 Pennsylvania. And I've got to tell you, what Mark Wolosik
 5 and his team have done was just tremendous.
 6 Over the last couple of days as --- as people
 7 want to monitor and what has gone on, I know Amie Downs
 8 has been over there with a number of our election
 9 officials. And I can tell you on both sides --- on all
 10 sides who have looked at it have really commented on the
 11 fact that our folks have really done a great job, the
 12 monitoring of the machines, the absentee ballots, the
 13 military ballots, the overseas ballots, the provisional
 14 ballots really have gone very smoothly.
 15 And we know how elections can be very difficult.
 16 And I think --- you know, I'm privileged to serve on the
 17 board along with President DeFazio and Councilman DeMarco,
 18 and we know the work that they do. We get to see it up
 19 close. And again, I wanted to single out those folks and
 20 some of the work that they've done.
 21 So it's --- again, it's something we can be
 22 proud of and we saw what went on last week and, you know,
 23 I won't --- enough said on that.
 24 You know, economic development, I'd like to
 25 start on that because I think most of us are focused on
 26 jobs and economic opportunities for the folks in our
 27 community, particularly young people. And the
 28 announcements that have happened over the last couple
 29 months continue the great momentum that we have had
 30 We were at a groundbreaking just last week where
 31 Allegheny Health Network announced an \$80,000,000 cancer
 32 academic partnership with Johns Hopkins University that's
 33 going to take place right here, where they will be hiring
 34 over 200 oncology professionals to be working in that
 35 facility.
 36 One of our great medical institutions that's
 37 been on the North Side for many years on the heels of the
 38 fact that UPMC and the University of Pittsburgh announced
 39 a \$200,000,000 immunotherapy research and development
 40 facility over in the Bloomfield neighborhood, called 5000
 41 Baum, on the corner of Baum and Millvale Avenue ---
 42 Morewood Avenue. Again, going to have probably a couple
 43 thousand jobs that will be there. It's an old Ford Motor
 44 plant, an old Ford assembly plant for that made cars over

1 it's now called Nova Place. CoLab 18 opened up, ribbon
 2 cutting on that, which is a collaboration with the Buhl
 3 Foundation and the BNY Mellon Foundation, to deal with
 4 workplace development and worker space. Again, upscaling
 5 our workers so that they're able to get into the 21st
 6 century. It's a really innovative facility that they have
 7 over there, and that continues to move forward.
 8 And then Google awarded their \$50,000 award to
 9 the most impactful nonprofit. Again, what our companies
 10 are doing, continuing to grow and continuing to add
 11 vitality and just it's exciting. It's an exciting place
 12 for us to be.
 13 I'm going to move over to facilities. You've
 14 seen the work on the roof, probably, and dodged some of
 15 the scaffolding that's going on with it. They're now
 16 working on the Ross Street side of the towers. The
 17 repointing of the towers on the front side, on the Grant
 18 Street side, is now done. And they're nearing completion
 19 on the rear side.
 20 And to watch those workers if you've ever taken
 21 a look at that, I certainly don't envy being up there
 22 either in this weather, or just in general. But they're
 23 doing some great work. And we're excited that this great
 24 building that's 130 years old is really getting the tender
 25 loving care that it really deserves that we can be very
 26 proud of.
 27 Moving on to the Health Department, we opened a
 28 new STD clinic up in the Hill District, well needed. Our
 29 old facility on Forbes Avenue in Oakland was not worthy, I
 30 don't think, of the citizens that we serve and the nice
 31 facility that they opened up up there is going to be
 32 improvement for the entire community.
 33 We opened up new food establishments, 12 of them
 34 in January, 13 in February, new restaurants. It just
 35 shows the economic vitality that continues to happen as
 36 that industry continues to move well. I want to thank Dr.
 37 Hacker, the live well operation now has 52 municipalities
 38 that are part of it, 14 school districts, 45 restaurants
 39 and 16 work places that are continuing to encourage good
 40 health.
 41 And I can tell you, you know, one of the health
 42 monitors that Dr. Hacker talked about when she came to the
 43 county a number of years ago, was our smoking rates were
 44 pretty high. And we've seen them drop from about 26
 45 percent of our citizens down to 19 percent. It's a huge

1 drop and I want to --- we want to continue to congratulate
2 her and continue to work on the work that they continue to
3 do.

4 Human services, we were lucky to be awarded a
5 \$17,800,000 HUD grant to fight homelessness, Director
6 Cherna actually had somebody here from the Casey
7 Foundation and they've been terrific partners and we're
8 glad that they're here. We're sorry that they got snowed
9 in, but we're glad that they're here anyway --- to be
10 here.

11 And I also want to give them big kudos on the
12 national attention and reputation that they've really
13 gained with the predictive analytics that they've been
14 able to do to make their department more effective and
15 more efficient in reaching the kids that we need to get
16 to. So I really appreciate and want to congratulate them.

17 National accreditations, a number of our
18 organizations and departments got national accreditations
19 over the last coming months. The jail was one --- only
20 the second one in the state to receive the accreditation.
21 We also had the Health Department receive accreditation,
22 our county police, our medical examiner, Department of
23 Human Services and Public Works all receiving national
24 accreditations which I think is something we can be very,
25 very proud of.

26 On to the --- I want to talk a little bit about
27 the legal aspect of something that I think this council
28 talked about in the last year, doing a sense of council to
29 take a look at how can we fight the opioid addiction on a
30 legal basis. And the county solicitor and his team worked
31 to go through a number of law firms that we could take a
32 look at. We decided to hire Motley Rice, a national firm
33 that was instrumental --- one of the lead litigators in
34 winning the tobacco settlement about a decade or so ago.

35 So like many counties around the Commonwealth
36 and around the country, we're going to take a look and try
37 to recapture some of the costs that we have incurred as
38 taxpayers, whether it be in public safety, human services,
39 health, jail, et cetera, to try to, you know, get some of
40 those funds back. And --- but more importantly, to make
41 sure that these companies do a better job and a more
42 responsible job in how they are dealing in the medical
43 industry, whether it's around prescriptions or servicing,
44 et cetera. So that's something we want to continue to
45 work on.

1 As a member of the Board of Elections, I was
2 very proud to see the organization and the structure that
3 Mark brought to that and this entire process which is
4 still ongoing. And I also want to commend your
5 Communications Director, Amie Downs, who has done a
6 phenomenal job of keeping us informed which has allowed me
7 to keep the public informed throughout this entire
8 process.

9 And I can tell you since this thing has started,
10 not a single person has come to me with a complaint or a
11 problem or an issue. And when you have things like this
12 that can typically be contentious, I mean that's a
13 testament to the work that he's doing. So just want to
14 commend you, the Elections Department, you know, on that.
15 It was a great job.

16 CHIEF EXECUTIVE FITZGERALD: Thanks, Councilman,
17 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Any other questions,
18 comments?

19 Seeing none, thank you very much.
20 CHIEF EXECUTIVE FITZGERALD: Thank you, Mr.
21 President. All right.
22 (Applause)

23 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Public comment on
24 agenda items.

25 MR. BARKER: We have only one individual signed
26 up, Gary English.

27 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. You can call him up.
28 MR. BARKER: Might want to wait until ---

29 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Give us a minute.
30 MR. ENGLISH: Gee, they're all leaving.

31 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: We lost our crowd.
32 MR. ENGLISH: So much for my fan club.

33 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. I guess you can
34 start.

35 MR. ENGLISH: My name is Gary English, 119
36 Ashley Drive, Verona, PA 15147.

37 Ballot questions --- ballot questions --- on May
38 19th, 1998, a ballot question was approved, changing our
39 form of governance from three county commissioners to a
40 county executive and council. A preamble and home rule
41 charter transferred substantial power to the citizens of
42 Allegheny County with ballot initiative and referendum.
43 However, County Council crafted an
44 administrative code that followed, stripping our ballot

1 And then the last thing I was going to hit on
2 --- one of our departments was parks. Many of you were
3 with me a couple of months ago when the Heinz History
4 Center hosted the 90th anniversary of our county parks.
5 Again, the parks are really moving forward in a very, very
6 positive way. I know many of you spend a lot of time in
7 your parks. It's a passion I think we all have. The
8 citizens that we represent very much care about it.

9 I will put out one public service announcement.
10 We're looking for lifeguards. It's always a shortage of
11 what we have. We're paying \$11 to \$13 an hour this summer
12 for the swim season of 2018. And that --- also added to
13 that are some bonuses and incentives that we're willing to
14 work on. And I know the county manager is trying to get
15 the word out and recruit, so if you've got any folks in
16 your community that might be interested this summer, those
17 lifeguard positions will be available and we'll be
18 certainly taking applications for those.

19 And with that, Mr. President, I open up to any
20 questions any members may have.

21 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Anyone have a question or
22 comment?

23 Move to the right --- Pat, Representative
24 Catena?

25 MR. CATENA: Thank you.

26 Mr. Executive, this is just a comment about the
27 Elections Department. It really made me proud to see our
28 Elections Department run that 18th Congressional District
29 as smoothly as they did and have CNN reporting on
30 everything. It was really --- like I was watching it from
31 --- watching it. And Allegheny County had everything
32 together, and it was just a proud moment for me.

33 So thank you, Mr. Executive. Thank you,
34 Elections Department.

35 CHIEF EXECUTIVE FITZGERALD: Yeah. You can
36 thank Mr. Wolosik and his team. They were there and were
37 willing to stay as long as they needed to stay to get the
38 results. And yeah, it's something again, the county
39 manager and the work ethic he's instilled in our
40 departments, it just showed that night on a national
41 stage.

42 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Representative DeMarco?

43 MR. DEMARCO: Executive Fitzgerald, I would like
44 to echo what you said about the Elections Department and
45 also what Councilman Catena said.

1 powers to repeal the county sales tax. I can see Grant
2 Street still rules.

3 This charter also included a resign to run
4 provision to limit career politicians we all loathe. In
5 2003, County Council tried to repeal that provision with a
6 ballot question and placed a county-wide political sign
7 campaign urging a yes vote. This is the sign from 15
8 years ago. The signage disclaimer on it read, paid for by
9 Democrat and Republican council members

10 I found no political committee, after contacting
11 the elections department, was formed by this disclaimer
12 and no financial reports were ever filed. These illegal
13 signs tried to influence the outcome of an election, but
14 it was defeated. I contacted state and county officials
15 for over a year, which finally resulted in two wrist slap
16 fines of \$250 each. Council was desperate.

17 Now, Councilman Macey is looking for this self-
18 serving fairness with other elected officials placing a
19 November 6th ballot to let the voters decide. We, the
20 people thought the charter was fair in 1998 when we
21 adopted it. We don't want career politicians and we voted
22 down the ballot question repeal in 2003.

23 I pleaded for fairness, requesting a ballot on
24 the fate of the Civic Arena. Council remained stiff
25 lipped and silent. We lost a historic landmark.

26 What a corrupt and self-serving council this
27 council body politic is. You should all be a disgrace.

28 And Mr. Macey, you shouldn't even enter that
29 ballot question. We've already made that decision twice
30 in 1998 and 2003.

31 Thank you for your attention,
32 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Approval of minutes?

1 County Fire Marshal's Office in fire and explosion
 2 investigations and by the Allegheny County Emergency

 5 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Now Representative Chuck
 6 Palmosina?
 7 MR. PALMOSINA: Thank you, Mr. President.
 8 On March 13th, the Public Safety Committee met
 9 to review this legislation. The committee voted to
 10 affirmatively recommend this legislation to full council.
 11 Now, let me also take this opportunity to share
 12 with all the members more about the legislation. This
 13 legislation will allow the county to receive a drone for
 14 its use. The drone is being donated a no cost to the
 15 county by a third party insurance fraud group. The drone
 16 will be used by the Allegheny County Fire Marshal's Office
 17 in fire and explosion investigations and by the Allegheny
 18 County Emergency Management Agency in emergency and
 19 disaster response when necessary. It will most likely be
 20 used in circumstances in which an aerial view is required.
 21 All images and video shot by the drone will be stored in
 22 digital media.
 23 While the county currently has one drone, there
 24 will be training provided specifically to the new drone.
 25 FAA pilot training is completed in accordance to training
 26 schedules in addition to the done specific training. The
 27 cost of the training is also being provided by the drone --
 28 -- by the donor of the drone. I believe that this is a
 29 wonderful tool for the county to have at its disposal and
 30 ask for an affirmative vote by all members of council.
 31 Thank you, Mr. President.
 32 MR. CATENA: Second.
 33 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Second. Under remarks?

 40 of Allegheny to acquire by condemnation certain right-of-
 41 way and temporary construction easement areas from a
 42 parcel required to reconstruct Jacks Run Bridge Number 4
 43 carrying Jacks Run Road over Jacks Run in Ross Township,
 44 and to take such further action as may be necessary under

1 MR. CATENA: Mr. President, I don't think a roll
 2 call is necessary.
 3 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: We don't --- does anyone
 4 disagree? Seeing --- okay. We'll let it go, then.
 5 All right. Let's see. Anymore liaison reports?
 6 Liaison reports?
 7 MR. BAKER: Sure.
 8 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Great.
 9 Representative Baker?
 10 MR. BAKER: All right. Thanks, Mr. President.
 11 Just a couple of --- I wanted to thank Mr.
 12 Catena and our staff, Ken Varhola, and everyone that was
 13 part of the Saint Patrick's Day Parade on Saturday.
 14 Thanks to everyone who organized. I know we honored them
 15 at the last meeting, the planning team, but I thought ---
 16 I think it's a really nice annual event that we all do ---
 17 or a lot of us do together from council. So thanks to ---
 18 to Pat for organizing and Ken for organizing and thanks to
 19 everyone that participated.
 20 Our Visit Pittsburgh Board Meeting --- our
 21 annual meeting went well last week. So many good reasons
 22 to be proud about, people putting their heads in beds in
 23 our region, people spending money by coming to visit and
 24 stay here. Obviously, March madness is --- is helping
 25 with that. Sporting events help with that, but there's a
 26 lot of conventions, a lot of good things going on in our
 27 region that --- that we should all be proud of.
 28 I know that any time Craig Davis gets up at that
 29 dinner or that lunch to speak, the administration, the
 30 County Executive's always mentioned, we as county
 31 government always mentioned as being good to work with,
 32 and that is very much appreciated.
 33 The local government academy newly elected
 34 officials dinner is Thursday night. I know a lot of you
 35 have been to that in the past. They asked me to say a
 36 couple words. I would love to share the microphone and
 37 the stage with any of you if you want to congratulate
 38 everyone together. If anyone's going to that, I'd love to
 39 do that with you.
 40 Again, next Tuesday is the Service Summit so
 41 please some on out, and thanks everybody. I think that's
 42 good.
 43 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Seeing no more hands, we'll
 44 go on to 10556-18.

1 MR. BARKER: An Ordinance of the County of
 2 Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, authorizing
 3 Highlands Area Soccer Club, Incorporated to use a soccer
 4 complex near Oak Manor Drive, in the County's Harrison
 5 Hills Park. Sponsored by the Chief Executive.
 6 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: That'll be referred to the
 7 Committee on Parks.
 8 1057-18.
 9 MR. BARKER: An Ordinance of the County of
 10 Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, ratifying
 11 amendments to the Allegheny County Health Department's
 12 Rules and Regulations, Article IX, "Lifeguards, Bathing
 13 Places, Bathing Beaches, Hot Tubs, and Spas." Sponsored
 14 by the Chief Executive.
 15 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: That'll be referred to the
 16 Committee on Health and Human Services.
 17 10564-18.
 18 MR. BARKER: An ordinance of the County of
 19 Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, directing that a
 20 referendum question regarding the amendment of Article
 21 III, §6 of the Home Rule Charter of Allegheny County,
 22 which places restrictions on the ability of certain
 23 persons to run for federal, state, county and local
 24 elected office, be placed on the November 6th, 2018
 25 General Election ballot. Sponsored by Council Member
 26 Macey.
 27 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: That'll be --- that will go
 28 to the Committee on Government Reform.
 29 New business motions, notification of contracts,
 30 10558-18.
 31 MR. BARKER: Communication summarizing approved
 32 executive actions from February 1st, 2018 through February
 33 28th, 2018.
 34 MR. MACEY: Receive and file, please.
 35 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Is there a second?
 36 DR. MARTONI: Second.
 37 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: All those in favor signify
 38 by saying aye.
 39 (Chorus of ayes.)
 40 Opposed?
 41 The ayes have it.
 42 Public comment on general items?
 43 MR. BARKER: We actually have two. The first
 44 individual to sign up is Eric Stoltenberg.
 45 MR. STOLTENBERG: Hello,

1 willing volunteers must be filled with mandated overtime.
 2 There's just simply too few officers to fill the number of
 3 vacancies with volunteers.
 4 Now our labor agreement prohibits the jail from
 5 forcing an officer to work overtime more than once in a
 6 two week period, but the jail routinely violates that
 7 restriction. There have been many occasions where
 8 officers have been mandated four times in a two week
 9 period. It's a practice that is unsafe, unfair and
 10 unacceptable. All of this overtime puts an unnecessary
 11 strain on the county's coffers as well, and the jail is
 12 spending millions of dollars in overtime per year.
 13 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Give it one more sentence or
 14 so.
 15 Okay?
 16 MR. STOLTENBERG: Thank you very much. In a
 17 three month period of last year, the jail spent more than
 18 \$2,000,000 just on overtime. And there's --- it's just
 19 something that --- that has to be addressed because the
 20 safety of our members in working these mandated shifts,
 21 they're spending far too much time in a very, very
 22 demanding job. And --- and they --- we need some relief,
 23 and that relief can only come with hiring.
 24 And I think you have the remainder of my remarks
 25 that I presented to you dealing with the K2 situation. I
 26 thank you for the opportunity to speak to you tonight and
 27 if you have any questions, I'd be happy to answer those
 28 and we'd certainly be happy to meet with you at any time
 29 to discuss these issues further.
 30 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Thank you.
 31 Someone want to make a motion to adjourn?
 32 MR. BARKER: We actually have one more ---
 33 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Oh, you got another one?
 34 MR. BARKER: --- one more public commenter,
 35 David Tessitor.
 36 MR. TESSITOR: My name is David Tessitor, Chair
 37 of Open Pittsburgh and 240 Chesterfield Road in the City
 38 of Pittsburgh.
 39 I hope you've been listening to the news and may
 40 be well then aware of the fact that the 2016 election had
 41 interference from foreign governments efforts to break in
 42 to our election systems, our registration systems, et
 43 cetera, even into our atomic power plants. With all of
 44 this effort happening, we continue in Allegheny County to
 45 utilize an obsolete, insecure voting system where the

1 President DeFazio, Vice President Futles and
 2 Members of Council, thank you for allowing me the
 3 opportunity to speak to you on behalf of the members of
 4 the Allegheny County Prison Employees Independent Union.
 5 That's the labor organization that represents the
 6 corrections officers at the Allegheny County Jail.
 7 My name's Eric Stoltenberg, I'm the Union
 8 Counsel and I'm here to share with you several concerns
 9 that our members have with regard to staffing and safety
 10 issues at the jail.
 11 Our main concern involves the lack of adequate
 12 staffing. Not only does this have an immediate adverse
 13 effect on the health and the safety of our members, but it
 14 also costs the county millions of dollars in overtime
 15 payments to the officers.
 16 Now the jail currently employs 410 full-time
 17 corrections officers and 18 part-time officers. I think
 18 there might have been some slight movement of some part-
 19 time officers to full-time officers just a day or two ago,
 20 but I'm not exactly sure about that. Our review indicates
 21 that the ideal staffing at the jail is 430 full-time
 22 officers and 43 part-time officers. When the jail has
 23 previously kept staffing at that level around, you know,
 24 430 --- around the 470, 473 mark, the overtime has been
 25 drastically reduced and the working conditions are
 26 dramatically safer.
 27 Now the cause of the current overtime problem is
 28 readily apparent. When the jail produces its weekly work
 29 schedule, it takes into account those officers on vacation
 30 and those absent for training, but it does not include any
 31 potential absences due to sick leave or officers that may
 32 be off on family and medical leave, nor does it factor in
 33 hospital runs. So if you have inmates that become ill and
 34 they have to be taken to the hospital, two officers must
 35 accompany that inmate to the hospital. And that happens
 36 just on a daily basis. It's not foreseen.
 37 But even before you have a single call off for
 38 sick time or for FMLA or any hospital runs, the --- the
 39 jail is beginning its shifts below staffing. They're ---
 40 they're less than the required number of officers. There
 41 are times when the jail is short as many as 20 officers
 42 per shift. And the final weekly work schedules produced
 43 by the jail administration confirm these staffing
 44 shortfalls. Because jail operations require a full staff
 45 for each shift, those vacancies that cannot be filled by

1 panels of which have to be recalibrated the same way the
 2 old palm pilot was, and that's been obsolete and out of
 3 most people's thinking for a long time.
 4 I proposed an ordinance which we submitted
 5 through the agenda initiative process which your Solicitor
 6 has forbidden you to see, and I've distributed that to you
 7 today. Also with that is the Judge's Decision upholding
 8 the Solicitor's opinion. And if you'll look through that,
 9 you'll see that basically what he has said, there's one
 10 part of the ordinance which gives an expert review
 11 commission the direction to look at the entire voting
 12 process and make comment and recommendations, not to
 13 control it or anything else. He has objections with that.
 14 If you excuse out that, what you have is
 15 effectively the ordinance that was put in place in 2006 by
 16 unanimous vote, including the County Executive's vote when
 17 he was President of Council. So what we have now, though,
 18 is a situation where dereliction of managerial
 19 responsibilities at the administration at the highest
 20 levels by keeping us back from a budgeting conference that
 21 needs to be moving forward on the capital budgeting
 22 because that takes time. It's claimed there's not a money
 23 --- there's not enough money, but that is not true. It is
 24 not an operating budget issue. This is a capital budget
 25 issue which would be bonded on the approval of the
 26 election of the electorate.
 27 You need to be moving on this. You need to be
 28 looking at this. If the governor passes what is now being
 29 put forward to, in two year, to disallow the current
 30 machines, we would not be able to move fast enough to have
 31 something for the 2020 election. And right now,
 32 supposedly, we are told in the back rooms, they're looking
 33 at different machines, but not an open process. We need
 34 to be having an open process where the public is involved
 35 and where experts can be making their contribution to
 36 this.
 37 So I urge you to start acting upon this now.
 38 You do not need to wait for me to come back to you, which
 39 I will, with another agenda initiative excising out those
 40 sections which the Judge objected to.
 41 Thank you.
 42 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Thank you.
 43 That it for speakers?
 44 Someone want to make a motion to adjourn?
 45 MR. MACEY: So moved.

1 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Second?
2 All those in favor signify by saying aye.
3 (Chorus of ayes.)
4 Opposed?
5 The ayes have it. Meeting adjourned.
