 2 order. Will you all rise for the Pledge of Allegiance to  
 3 the Flag and remain standing for silent prayer or  
 4 reflection.  
 5 After me ---.

 7 (Silent prayer or reflection.)  
 8 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Can we have the roll call?  
 9 MR. WALTON: Mr. President?  
 10 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Yeah?  
 11 MR. WALTON: We can't start. We don't have ---  
 12 we don't have a stenographer and we don't keep that. We  
 13 don't have anything.  
 14 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: No, we're going to  
 15 reconstruct them from the video.  
 16 MR. BARKER: Mr. Baker?  
 17 MR. BAKER: Here.  
 18 MR. BARKER: Mr. Catena?  
 19 MR. CATENA: Here.  
 20 MR. BARKER: Mr. DeMarco?  
 21 MR. DEMARCO: Here.  
 22 MR. BARKER: Mr. Futules?  
 23 MR. FUTULES: Here.

1 Mikayla has written, directed and produced four more plays  
 2 over the years, A Murder on 34th Street, Paradise, Misfits  
 3 and Lost and Found and;  
 4 WHEREAS, this year's show, Lost and Found,  
 5 brought in \$22,751 and counting as online donations are  
 6 continuing breaking the previous record for a show of  
 7 \$13,500. Mikayla's five year fundraising goal of \$50,000.  
 8 How --- however, she ended up raising just --- she ended  
 9 up raising just over \$68,000 with all the proceeds going  
 10 to Make-A-Wish and;  
 11 WHEREAS, as a senior, Mikayla is in the process  
 12 of writing a feature-length film about a high school  
 13 senior suffering from addiction. One day, she dreams of  
 14 being a director and a screenwriter and hopes that her  
 15 films address issues people don't talk about.  
 16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That I,  
 17 Councilman John Palmiere do hereby commend and recognize  
 18 Mikayla Davic upon writing, directing and producing a show  
 19 for five years in a row to help raise money for  
 20 Make-A-Wish Greater Pennsylvania and West Virginia. And  
 21 we congratulate her for her dedicating time, leadership,  
 22 creativity and effort in making her community better.  
 23 Thank you, Mikayla.  
 24 (Applause.)  
 25 MS. DAVIC: So I just wanted to say thank you,  
 26 first of all, for having me here. It's a great honor.  
 27 And I just wanted to say that when I was in 7th grade I  
 28 had a crazy idea and as --- as much as people supported  
 29 me, I knew that a lot of them didn't think that I was  
 30 going to succeed. Not because they didn't want me to, but  
 31 because I was just a kid. But lo and behold, here I am.  
 32 \$68,000 for Make-A-Wish, five shows in, and I've really  
 33 learned a lot from my experiences. And it wouldn't be  
 34 possible without everyone who has supported me, and that  
 35 includes all the kids who have been in my shows.  
 36 The performers are kindergarten through 12th  
 37 grade students in my district, and each of them adds their  
 38 own special element to my show. And something that I  
 39 never realized an impact that I had, was on the kids  
 40 themselves. I always knew that I was helping kids for  
 41 Make-A-Wish. But a couple years ago, some of the parents  
 42 came up to me after one of our shows and told me that  
 43 their children had been scouring the house the entire day  
 44 prior to the show, turning over couch cushions, raiding  
 45 desk doors trying to find coins.

1 MR. BARKER: We have 13 members present.  
 2 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: 10910-18 (sic).  
 3 MR. BARKER: A Proclamation recognizing Luke  
 4 Lipowcan upon receiving upon receiving the Eagle Scout  
 5 Award. Sponsored by Council Member Palmiere.  
 6 MR. PALMIERE: We're going to pass on that one  
 7 and go to the next one, please, Mr. President.  
 8 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.  
 9 We'll go to the next one. We'll go to 10911-18  
 10 --- 19.  
 11 MR. BARKER: A Proclamation recognizing Mikayla  
 12 Davic upon writing, directing and producing a show for  
 13 five years in a row to help raise money for Make-A-Wish.  
 14 Sponsored by Council Member Palmiere.  
 15 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.  
 16 MR. PALMIERE: Thank you, Mr. President and  
 17 Members of Council. I --- I don't do this very often, as  
 18 you know, but I have two young people here today I thought  
 19 really deserved some recognition for some of the wonderful  
 20 things that they have accomplished over their time in  
 21 school. And I have Mikayla Davic here today and I'm going  
 22 to read the Proclamation because it'll pretty much fill  
 23 you in on why Mikayla is here. Okay. And this is her  
 24 father Mike, Mr. Davic, here. So bear with me, please.  
 25 WHEREAS, Baldwin High School Senior Mikayla  
 26 Davic, for the fifth year in a row has written, directed  
 27 and produced a show starring her Baldwin-Whitehall  
 28 classmates to raise money for Make-A-Wish Greater  
 29 Pennsylvania and West Virginia. Mikayla even performed in  
 30 four to five shows and;  
 31 WHEREAS, Mikayla has an impressive past in the  
 32 theatre. In second grade, she fell in love with theatre  
 33 and had a chance to perform as a little munchkin, and I  
 34 remember that, in Baldwin --- at Baldwin High School show,  
 35 the Wizard of Oz. In fourth grade, she was invited back  
 36 to the high school to perform in a production the Children  
 37 of Eden and;  
 38 WHEREAS, then came seventh grade and an  
 39 assignment to do a yearlong project in a gifted program at  
 40 Harrison Middle School. Mikayla chose to write, direct  
 41 and cast her own show. Her first --- her first show  
 42 titled, a Not So Magical Story, brought in \$8,000 for  
 43 Make-A-Wish from the show --- from that show alone;  
 44 WHEREAS, determined to raise more for  
 45 Make-A-Wish and fulfill her passion for writing plays,

1 And when they asked them what they were doing,  
 2 the kids responded that they wanted to raise as much money  
 3 as they could for Make-A-Wish so that they could make me  
 4 proud. So I am really grateful that I have had the  
 5 opportunity to make that impact on my community and I just  
 6 want to leave you with this thought that no matter how  
 7 young someone is, they're never too young to change the  
 8 world. And that, the next time a kid comes to you and  
 9 tells you that they have a crazy idea like mine and that  
 10 they want to change the world, not to ask them why they  
 11 want to but how they can get it done. Thank you.  
 12 (Applause.)  
 13 MR. PALMIERE: Take this and you can hold that  
 14 and we'll go right over here; okay? And they said that  
 15 there aren't any good kids out there, come again.  
 16 (Pictures taken.)  
 17 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: All right. We're going down  
 18 to 10913-19 and the rest will be read into the record.  
 19 MR. BARKER: I'm sorry, 10913 or 10912?  
 20 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: It's 10913. Hey, the other  
 21 one, they're not here yet?  
 22 MR. KIRK: Were the Big Brothers Big Sisters,  
 23 BBBS.  
 24 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Oh, are you --- are you 02?  
 25 MR. KIRK: I think I'm two.  
 26 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay. Go ahead.  
 27 MR. BARKER: Twelve (12), I believe, yeah.  
 28 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Go ahead, yeah.  
 29 MR. BARKER: 10912-19. A Proclamation  
 30 congratulating the 2018 Celebrate Coalitions Awardees.  
 31 Sponsored by Council Members Baker and Kirk.  
 32 MS. KIRK: Hi. We're here to recognize some  
 33 people who, even within the Big Brother, Big Sister  
 34 organization have gone above, believe it or not, that. So  
 35 if you guys could come up. I think I had the honor to  
 36 meet them the other day. Although, now there is pictures  
 37 of me hanging in a bar because of that event, but ---.  
 38 So this group, you know Big Brothers Big Sisters  
 39 is volunteers and I --- and I tried to impress upon them  
 40 the other day just being a Big, not only are they  
 41 impacting that one child, but they're impacting that  
 42 child's sibling, that child's brother, cousin,  
 43 grandmother. And when you start adding it all up, it's  
 44 estimated that every time someone mentees one of these

1 kids, it impacts 100 people, 100 people in our community.  
 2 That's a regular BBBs volunteer.  
 3 Now these folks have done a lot to even help  
 4 grow the organization even bigger. So I think the city  
 5 paper listed you as the best nonprofit, BBBs. And what is  
 6 it, second?  
 7 MR. BAKER: Two of the last six years, but ---  
 8 MS. KIRK: Two of the six years, yes, in the  
 9 country. So this is a very active organization here and  
 10 these are the best of the best for 2018. So let's give  
 11 them a round of applause right now.  
 12 (Applause.)  
 13 MS. KIRK: And --- and thank you all for showing  
 14 up and coming here. I know it's never quite easy to get  
 15 here, but we wanted to take the opportunity to make sure  
 16 you were recognized and it goes into the County records  
 17 forever, okay. So your names are there, and when you're  
 18 old you can come and see it. So with that said ---  
 19 MR. BAKER: Yeah. So it's a great group this  
 20 year. I've --- I've said to the group a couple times. We  
 21 were down at City Council last week. We had the event  
 22 last Wednesday which was phenomenal. It was at --- it was  
 23 at a bar. It was at Hough's in Greenfield but it was a  
 24 great time and a great celebration and the County  
 25 Executive was there to share with all of our honorees.  
 26 City Councilman Corey O'Connor attended to pass on his  
 27 best wishes, along with City Councilwoman Strassburger who  
 28 had this group down to City Council. And we had State  
 29 Representative and our good mutual friend Pat Catena,  
 30 Anita Kulik, State Representative, was there as well.  
 31 So it was a great event. And just from a Big  
 32 Brother's, Big Sisters perspective, we're so proud of this  
 33 group of amazing volunteers and incredible honorees. Some  
 34 of you might recognize Nancy Griffith, who was here last  
 35 year as the Big of the year in Pennsylvania. She did have  
 36 to pass the crown around, but ---. Actually, the new  
 37 person has not been named yet so she still is the --- the  
 38 reigning Big of the year in --- in Pennsylvania.  
 39 But it's a wonderful group and the folks that  
 40 Willy --- Willy knew Officer Wade, the County manager knew  
 41 Officer Wade. That's the Brashear security team who go  
 42 above, way above and beyond. Almost 20 percent of all of  
 43 our matches are at Brashear, and this security team over  
 44 the last five years has done just an incredible job  
 45 keeping kids safe but also partnering and making sure of

1 And with that, we'd like to have each of you  
 2 come up and we'll give you your own Proclamation.  
 3 (Applause.)  
 4 MS. KIRK: Oh, we can introduce them first.  
 5 MR. BAKER: Oh, no, that's Nancy.  
 6 MS. KIRK: Oh, Nancy. I'm sorry, I'm sorry.  
 7 MR. BAKER: That's okay.  
 8 MS. KIRK: Okay.  
 9 MR. BAKER: So Vanessa, do you want to start or  
 10 Nancy?  
 11 MS. SWICKLINE: It doesn't matter. Thank you  
 12 everybody. Thank you for having us tonight. I could not  
 13 be more honored, more proud to serve on the Big Brothers,  
 14 Big Sisters Young Professional Organization. I'm more  
 15 proud to serve the Pittsburgh community and I'm grateful  
 16 for all the support that we have from all of you. So I'm  
 17 excited to see what 2019 brings. It seems like we're off  
 18 to a good start. We had a cycle ride last Saturday and  
 19 raised about \$500 there, so off to a great stop. Thank  
 20 you again.  
 21 (Applause.)  
 22 MS. GRIFFITH: So my name is Nancy Griffith and  
 23 I'm one of the Big Sisters. I've had my Little Sister  
 24 with me for seven years. I met her when she was 7, she's  
 25 now 14 and we have done all kinds of things around the  
 26 city of Pittsburgh, a lot of things that she probably  
 27 never would have had the opportunity to do. But more than  
 28 that, I just met an amazing kid and I really think that  
 29 she's going to have a great future.  
 30 She has an amazing mother. I've learned so much  
 31 from her mom, just when I see her each time that I pick my  
 32 Little Sister up. But I also want to say, this is very  
 33 important to me, that I am so impressed with this  
 34 organization and what they do. I just --- the people that  
 35 work for them are so dedicated and have such passion and  
 36 such energy that it's been a real joy and honor for me to  
 37 be affiliated with Big Brothers and Big Sisters. So I  
 38 want to say it's been great. Thank you.  
 39 (Applause.)  
 40 MR. BAKER: Carla?  
 41 MS. DUNLAP: Hi. I am Carla Dunlap from  
 42 Washington County and I continue to feel blessed and be  
 43 amazed and honored and blown away. This is the third  
 44 event and I'm just --- I am just thankful for this because  
 45 this is something that I enjoy doing and just am in awe

1 that mentor 2.0. The BBS Pittsburgh one is one of the  
 2 best mentored 2.0 programs in the country. So a great  
 3 group and I could speak about each of them for 10 minutes  
 4 but with that, we'll probably give it to Councilwoman Kirk  
 5 and she can read your Proclamation and put you guys in the  
 6 public record for --- for forever.  
 7 MS. KIRK: Forever. Okay.  
 8 WHEREAS, each year, Big Brothers, Big Sisters of  
 9 Greater Pittsburgh, presents deserving volunteers and  
 10 partners with awards at the Annual Celebrate Coalitions  
 11 Event. Recognize --- recognizing the importance of team  
 12 work and cooperation to their vital community services  
 13 and;  
 14 WHEREAS, in recognition of their praiseworthy  
 15 work furthering the charitable mission and goals of Big  
 16 Brothers, Big Sisters, the 2018 award honorees will be  
 17 recognized at the 9th Annual Celebrate Coalition Award  
 18 Event which was just held on January 9th at Hough's for  
 19 their efforts on behalf of the agency. We have Endia  
 20 Vereen, a Young Professional Outreach Board Member, along  
 21 with Vanessa Swickline, also a Young Professional Outreach  
 22 Board Member of the Year. Nancy Griffith was a Big  
 23 Recruitment Board Member, Marsha Cassel and Carla Dunlap  
 24 from Washington County. Marsha is the County Advisory  
 25 Board Member of the Year and Carla was the Washington  
 26 County Big Recruitment Board Member of the year. Mark  
 27 Rogalsky, who is here of Pittsburgh Mercy was a Youth  
 28 Outcomes Advisory Board Member of the Year. The  
 29 Pittsburgh --- there's four partnerships who also did a  
 30 lot to support the re-give resources to the organization,  
 31 WHEREAS, they're giving their time and talent,  
 32 we have community resources that support them in this  
 33 mission and we're honoring this year four organizations.  
 34 One, the Pittsburgh Promise, which is a Big community Big  
 35 Partner of the Year, Tickets for Kids Charities which  
 36 provides tickets so that these kids, they can take them to  
 37 a lot of events where they might not ever get to see.  
 38 Brashear High School Security Team is a Big Community  
 39 Partner of the Year and Kari Shaffer from the Pittsburgh  
 40 Cultural Trust was the other partner of the year.  
 41 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we,  
 42 Allegheny County Council Members Tom Baker and Cindy Kirk,  
 43 do hereby congratulate the 2018 Celebrate Coalition  
 44 Honorees, and we thank them for their dedicated service to  
 45 Big Brothers, Big Sisters of Greater Pittsburgh.

1 that I'm even being honored for something, just to be  
 2 around young people who I feel are wonderful, and I'm  
 3 learning a lot from them because they're just amazing.  
 4 And I do want to say, as I'm listening to Mikayla, I'm  
 5 thinking, wow, I'm just blown away by what you do and I'm  
 6 thinking, wow, she could be a Little, you know because  
 7 that's what we do with our Littles because are --- our  
 8 Littles are amazing. So again, thank you Council for  
 9 having us and for doing this. And knowing that even when  
 10 I'm old, I'll be on the record books, so thank you. Thank  
 11 you.  
 12 (Applause.)  
 13 MR. BAKER: Thanks, Carla. Congratulations to  
 14 Carla. I agree with you. Mikayla, we got to get you  
 15 involved in BBS in college and afterwards for sure. So up  
 16 next is Mark Rogalsky, who I think knows every person that  
 17 lives in Paul Klein's District as possible. One of the  
 18 most ---  
 19 MR. ROGALSKY: I don't know about that. Maybe  
 20 in Nick Futules's.  
 21 MR. BAKER: You live in Nick's --- yeah.  
 22 MR. ROGALSKY: Our sons and daughters graduated  
 23 together, so --- but --- but Tom was one of the young kids  
 24 that I worked with years ago when I worked years when I  
 25 used to work for the Jewish Community Center, a different  
 26 life, and he drags me into these things and makes me help  
 27 out --- but it's an honor. Yeah. It's great  
 28 collaborating with everyone, and I can't say anything that  
 29 can top what Mikayla said. So thank you all very much.  
 30 (Applause.)  
 31 MR. BAKER: Congratulations. And last but not  
 32 least, you got to get hype for these people, this is the  
 33 Brashear High School Security Team, the award-winning best  
 34 security team in Pittsburgh, right?  
 35 (Applause.)  
 36 MS. INGRAM: My name is Officer Nikkia Ingram  
 37 and I just want to thank you to everyone and thank you to  
 38 Tom and BBS. They come into our school and everyone is  
 39 always pleasant and the smile of all the Bigs, all the  
 40 workers. So they make our environment really wonderful  
 41 and the kids there love them. And we've grown to love  
 42 them and have a great relationship with them. So we  
 43 appreciate it. This is our --- all of our third time, so  
 44 we're like really in awe of what's going on and we really  
 45 appreciate it, so thank you.

 3 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Okay.  
 4 We're going to go back to 10910-19.  
 5 MR. BARKER: Before proceeding, please let the  
 6 record reflect that Mr. Klein is present.  
 7 10910-19 A Proclamation recognizing Luke  
 8 Lipowcan upon receiving the Eagle Scout Award. Sponsored  
 9 by Council Member Palmiere.  
 10 MR. PALMIERE: I think I left my glasses over  
 11 there.  
 12 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: He forgot his eyes.  
 13 MR. PALMIERE: Congratulations.  
 14 MR. LIPOWCAN: Thank you so much. Nice to meet  
 15 you.  
 16 MR. PALMIERE: How do you say your last name?  
 17 MR. LIPOWCAN: Oh, Lipowcan --- Lipowcan.  
 18 MR. PALMIERE: Lipowcan Okay Okay Mr  
 19 President and Members of Council, we have another young  
 20 gentleman up here, another young person up here and I want  
 21 to --- I wanted to recognize Luke for some of the  
 22 wonderful things he's done. Obviously, he's earned his  
 23 Eagle Scout rank here, but I want to just share with you  
 24 what he's been able to do over a period of time here.  
 25 WHEREAS, founded in 1910, the Boy Scouts of  
 26 America is one of the largest scouting organizations and  
 27 youth organizations in the United States with more than  
 28 2.4 million youth participants. The Boy Scouts of America  
 29 goal is to train youth in responsible citizenship,  
 30 character development and self-reliance through  
 31 participation and a wide range of outdoor activities,  
 32 educational programs and at an old --- and at older age  
 33 levels, career-oriented programs in partnership with  
 34 community organizations and;  
 35 WHEREAS, Eagle Scout is the highest rank  
 36 attainable in the Boy Scouting program. After a lengthy  
 37 review process, only four percent of Boy Scouts are  
 38 granted the Eagle Scout rank. Requirements include,  
 39 earning at least 21 merit badges. An Eagle Scout must  
 40 demonstrate scout --- scout spirit and ideal attitude  
 41 based up on the scout oath, law and mission service and  
 42 leadership. This includes, an extensive service project  
 43 that the scout plans, organizes, leads and manages and;  
 44 WHEREAS, Luke Lipowcan, as a --- a Pittsburgh  
 45 creative performing art school student and a member of Boy

1 Scout Troop 296 of Brentwood was --- recently presented  
 2 his Eagle Scout award and;  
 3 WHEREAS, roughly one year ago, Luke began  
 4 planning his Eagle Scout project. He opted to honor those  
 5 who dedicated their lives to serve their country with a  
 6 Veterans monument to Jefferson --- Jefferson Memorial  
 7 cemetery in Pleasant Hills. A total of \$4,000 was raised  
 8 to help design the monument, which bears the seals of all  
 9 five service branches and inscribed with a line from  
 10 Theodore O'Harris poem, Bivouac of the Dead. Also, Luke  
 11 organized 40 volunteers to help clean and reposition over  
 12 1,000 grave markers in the Veterans section of Jefferson  
 13 Memorial cemetery.  
 14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that I,  
 15 Councilman John Palmiere and all other members of Council  
 16 do hereby comment and recognize Luke Lipowcan upon  
 17 receiving an Eagle Scout award and we congratulate him for  
 18 dedicating time, leadership, creativity in an effort to  
 19 making this community better. Congratulations.  
 20 MR. LIPOWCAN: Thank you very much.  
 21 (Applause)  
 22 MR. PALMIERE: Go ahead, you want to say  
 23 something?  
 24 MR. LIPOWCAN: It's an honor to be here and  
 25 thank you again, Councilman. It was a lot of hard work.  
 26 As he said, we raised over \$4,000 and we had over 40  
 27 volunteers in a period of two days come to work on the  
 28 grave markers in the Veterans section to clean-up and we  
 29 raised the \$4,000 for the monument to be placed in front  
 30 of the Veterans section of Jefferson Memorial cemetery.  
 31 So it was a lot of hard work. I'd like to thank all my  
 32 contributors, my --- my donors and all the people that  
 33 came out to help and thank you. And my --- my family and  
 34 my Troop 296, they were a very big help in getting me to  
 35 my rank and thank you.  
 36 (Applause)  
 37 (Pictures taken)  
 38 PRESIDENT DEFAZIO: Congratulations.  
 39 10918 --- I mean, 13-19 and the rest will be  
 40 read into the record.  
 41 MR. BARKER: 10913-19. A Certificate of  
 42 Recognition presented to Whitehall Public Library's  
 43 Director, Paula Kelly, upon the momentous occasion of  
 44 being awarded the 2018 I Love My Librarian Award.

 13 knew who you were. I'm just meeting you today in  
 14 reference to this hurricane of death that's just running  
 15 through our community. And I am not safe, just for my  
 16 neighbor, lived around my corner from my house, home  
 17 invasion.  
 18 They tied her up --- her and her husband and  
 19 he's dead. We are scared out here. These guns are  
 20 claiming too many African-American lives and I have yet to  
 21 see Council stand and speak about saving life. Mr.  
 22 Fitzgerald, he knows me. I work throughout the community  
 23 I have took my pain and redirected it and put it into  
 24 Jamar's Place of Peace. That's to come out here to give  
 25 some of these young men and women the basic tools that  
 26 they need to become self-sufficient in society because  
 27 that's the deeper-rooted issue as these homes and the  
 28 governors over these children --- the homes are broken,  
 29 the children are broken. So when they come out into  
 30 society, we are definitely impacted by the pain and the  
 31 violence and the rage of this children. And I'm coming  
 32 here today to ask you, what would you do to help us give  
 33 them some of the basic tools out here to become  
 34 self-sufficient in society where they are --- they are  
 35 homeless --- is that it?  
 36 MR. BARKER No, you have a minute.  
 37 MS. HARPER Okay. They're homeless, you know,  
 38 they're looking for outlets. You know, I --- I bring them  
 39 clothes. I just got a donation of furniture. I help the  
 40 parents. I'm doing this just from the goodness of my  
 41 heart. I don't want nothing out of it. What I want to  
 42 see is these people to live. Also, I stand as CeaseFire,  
 43 I'm a member and I learned that if everybody stand their  
 44 position and collaborate, we can make a hurricane of help  
 45 out here.
