 4 MR. BARKER: Next up is Heather Sage, who signed
 5 up to comment but did not submit any comments beyond
 6 saying that she intended to speak about hair
 7 discrimination legislation.

 10 PRESIDENT CATENA: Okay.

 14 MR. JOHNSTONBAUGH: Good evening, ladies and
 15 gentlemen. I'd like to present a quick commentary on the
 16 Allegheny County Grants Special Accounts and Agency Fund
 17 budget, attachment B, number 37, parks and the 2021
 18 Allegheny County Capital Budget.
 19 I have included a thumbnail summary of the
 20 capital budget for 2020 versus 2021. This is likely the
 21 first time a citizen has come before Council to express a
 22 concern regarding an increase in budgeted spending for the
 23 Parks Department. Specifically, I'm concerned about the
 24 massive increase in construction spending, 84 percent more
 25 than 2020, and massive cut in equipment spending, 75
 26 percent less than 2020. Regarding construction spending,
 27 North Park has three toilet facilities. Two were
 28 fabricated off site and dropped into place, and one is a
 29 total gut renovation of a small building. All begun in
 30 the spring of 2020. At this time none of these facilities
 31 are operational and available to the public. Because
 32 construction was begun without a public comment period
 33 there is significant disappointment among North Park
 34 constituents as to the design choices, location and
 35 functionality of these facilities. There is no rational
 36 explanation as to why the two prefabricated facilities are
 37 not open for public use at this time.
 38 The second illustration I offer is the Martial
 39 Island Bridge. The pedestrian bridge has been closed
 40 since 2017. The Parks Director had bids on his desk in
 41 January of 2018 for the fabrication of a new bridge and
 42 subsequently received a bid from gateway engineers to act
 43 as project manager. The total cost, according to the
 44 information I have received through a right-to-know
 45 inquiry is that the cost is less than \$150,000, and I have

 16 MR. BARKER: We actually have several people
 17 signed up.
 18 PRESIDENT CATENA: Okay.
 19 MR. BARKER: The first four submitted their
 20 comments in writing.
 21 PRESIDENT CATENA: Okay.
 22 MR. BARKER: First is Shandre Delaney, who's in
 23 the City of Pittsburgh. Hair discrimination. I am a
 24 victim of hair discrimination while working in the City of
 25 Pittsburgh for over 30 years. On several occasions I was
 26 told that I was highly-qualified for jobs, but I should
 27 change my hair because it wasn't professional. I'm a
 28 black woman with curly hair. I wear my hair pulled up on
 29 top of my head in what is considered to be an afro puff.
 30 When I wore my hair in braids it was a problem on jobs.
 31 This is a real issue that needs to be corrected.
 32 America is a diverse country with many different
 33 cultures. White society should not have the right to
 34 dictate how black folks wear their hair. Who gave white
 35 folks the right to determine the standard of beauty? We
 36 have a right to our culture, and shouldn't have to
 37 assimilate to be part of a nation that is derived of many
 38 cultures.
 39 MR. BARKER: Next up is Chardae Jones, who lives
 40 in Braddock Borough. Olivia Bennett's hair
 41 discrimination, I thought this would be a no-brainer, but
 42 hair discrimination exists. Just because something isn't
 43 happening to you doesn't mean it's not happening. My
 44 first experience with hair discrimination was my mother
 45 being told that she would never get a decent job with her

1 no rational explanation as to why this project was not
 2 completed years ago.
 3 My comments are much too extensive for my three
 4 minutes, so I will jump to equipment. As to the reduction
 5 in the equipment budget, North Park alone is in desperate
 6 need of the entire \$250,000 budget. Here are the
 7 immediate needs, fully-enclosed three point tractor with
 8 climate troll so that a brush hog can be operated in
 9 inclement weather year round, fully-enclosed tractor with
 10 climate control and articulating boom arm and brush hog
 11 that can be operated in inclement weather year round, two
 12 plug aerators, one of large heavy design to accomplish the
 13 acreage and one that is small and easily manipulated, a
 14 state-of-the-art blade sharpening machine shop and a
 15 preventative maintenance program to regularly sharpen
 16 blades. In addition to capital equipment we are in
 17 desperate need for three employees, a replacement mechanic
 18 to fill the position left open when our mechanic was
 19 transferred to South Park, a junior mechanic to act as a
 20 helper ---.
 21 PRESIDENT CATENA: Thank you, Mr. Johnstonbaugh.
 22 MR. JOHNSTONBAUGH: Thank you.
 23 PRESIDENT CATENA: Just for clarification,
 24 that's a non-agenda item, what you just talked about.

 11 finance.
 12 New business, motions. 11650-20.
 13 MR. BARKER: A Motion of the Council of
 14 Allegheny County urging the United States Senate to pass
 15 H.R. 451, the Don't Break Up the T-Band Act of 2020, with
 16 all deliberate speed. Sponsored by Councilmember Catena.
 17 PRESIDENT CATENA: Does anyone have an objection
 18 to doing a roll call vote on this, or would we prefer just
 19 a voice vote?
 20 MR. FUTULES: Mr. President?
 21 PRESIDENT CATENA: Yes.
 22 MR. FUTULES: I just want to tell Jared that
 23 I'll co-sponsor that, please.
 24 MR. WALTON: I have some concerns as far as I
 25 don't know what this is.
 26 PRESIDENT CATENA: The information was in your
 27 packet. Did you get a chance to read your packet or?
 28 MR. WALTON: No.
 29 PRESIDENT CATENA: Okay. Basically, this is the
 30 T-band act. Congress passed legislation a few years ago,

 39 auction it'll be very expensive for the County. Because
 40 it's going to basically parcel off the service that is
 41 responsible, that the County's actually using for their
 42 --- for the bandwidth for the County emergency services,
 43 for the radio system, to make a long story short.
 44 Does that sort of answer your --- or no?
 45 MR. WALTON: Okay. Maybe we can have ---.

1 PRESIDENT CATENA: Okay. Are you good with
 2 that? Okay.
 3 So Jared, would you --- does anyone have any

 41 reason?
 42 MR. WALTON: I don't have to give a reason. I
 43 abstain.
 44 PRESIDENT CATENA: According to the rules, you
 45 do.

1 MR. WALTON: I abstain.
 2 PRESIDENT CATENA: Let it reflect for the record
 3 that Mr. Walton refused to provide the abstention reason.
 4 MR. BARKER: Mr. Zavarella?
 5 MR. ZAVARELLA: Yes.
 6 MR. BARKER: President Catena?
 7 PRESIDENT CATENA: Yes.
 8 MR. BARKER: Ayes 12, nos 0, with one
 9 abstention. The bill passes.
 10 PRESIDENT CATENA: Thank you. Ms. Kirk, I
 11 believe we have a non-agenda motion?
 12 MISS KIRK: Yes. Thank you, Chairman Catena.
 13 I'd like to make a motion to suspend all operations and
 14 activities of the Friends of the Park as of November 1st,
 15 2020 as we begin to review the ordinance. And I do
 16 believe Councilwoman Bennett would like to be added as a
 17 sponsor also.
 18 PRESIDENT CATENA: Okay.
 19 MS. HALLAM: I would also, President Catena.
 20 This is Bethany Hallam.
 21 PRESIDENT CATENA: Okay.
 22 MR. FUTULES: Me too, Jared. Thank you.
 23 MS. KIRK: Do we have a second?
 24 MR. DUERR: I'll second, Cindy.
 25 MS. BENNETT: Second.

 35 (Chorus of ayes.)
 36 PRESIDENT CATENA: All those opposed?
 37 Motion carries.
 38 We'll now have notification of contracts.
 39 MR. BARKER: We have none.
 40 PRESIDENT CATENA: Okay. Is there any public
 41 comment on general items?
 42 MR. BARKER: We have only one. That would be
 43 Steve Johnstonbaugh.
 44 PRESIDENT CATENA: Mr. Johnstonbaugh, I assume
 45 this is what your other item was, the non-agenda item.

1 During the virtual Cherry Blossom Festival the
 2 Friends of North Park Facebook community membership grew
 3 to 10,404 members at the time the bloom ended on May 9th,
 4 2020. It is important that you understand of the 254
 5 trees planted many species have been carefully selected by
 6 the architects to compliment the Sakura grove. A sampling
 7 of the complimentary species follows. I am requesting
 8 that Council issue a proclamation recognizing the Sakura
 9 Project for their accomplishments and acknowledging the
 10 quantity and variety of species planted in the style of a
 11 Japanese forest garden that citizens had great
 12 appreciation for a place of peace and tranquility in the
 13 midst of pandemic and a blanket offer of assistance to
 14 support their mission going forward. Thank you.
 15 PRESIDENT CATENA: Thank you.
 16 MR. FUTULES: Mr. Johnstonbaugh, you wouldn't
 17 happen to be the man that owns the music store?
 18 MR. JOHNSTONBAUGH: That would be my baby
 19 brother.
 20 MR. FUTULES: Your brother?
 21 MR. JOHNSTONBAUGH: My youngest brother.
 22 PRESIDENT CATENA: So is there a motion to
 23 adjourn?
 24 MR. WALTON: So moved.
 25 MR. MACY: Second.
 26 MR. FUTULES: Second.
 27 PRESIDENT CATENA: Motion has been made and
 28 seconded. All those in favor signify by saying aye.
 29 (Chorus of ayes.)
 30 PRESIDENT CATENA: All those opposed? Thank you
 31 everyone. Have a great evening.
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1 So you're taken care of then?
 2 MR. JOHNSTONBAUGH: This is my non-agenda item.
 3 That is correct.
 4 PRESIDENT CATENA: Well, your first one was your
 5 non-agenda item.
 6 MR. JOHNSTONBAUGH: The way I read the ---.
 7 PRESIDENT CATENA: Correct.
 8 MR. JOHNSTONBAUGH: The way I read the agenda,
 9 you were going to talk about the special accounts for 2020
 10 as new business.
 11 PRESIDENT CATENA: No. That's not --- no.
 12 That's not considered new business.
 13 So, I mean, I'll allow you this time to make the
 14 comment, but moving forwards, I mean, please make sure
 15 you're on track with what you want to comment on so.
 16 MR. JOHNSTONBAUGH: Yes, Mr. President.
 17 PRESIDENT CATENA: Thank you.
 18 MR. JOHNSTONBAUGH: My apologies.
 19 My name is Steve Johnstonbaugh. This is a
 20 proclamation request recognizing the Pittsburgh Sakura
 21 Project and its healing gift to North Park and its
 22 visitors in the time of COVID-19. The Pittsburgh Sakura
 23 project established a relationship with North Park,
 24 formalized by council in 2008 via ordinance number 3905-
 25 08. A master plan was created through the collaboration
 26 of two landscape architecture firms, Arimoto and Mercer
 27 and Ron Block Landscape Design. The master plan has been
 28 updated yearly. In the winter of 2020 I began to
 29 collaborate with the Sakura Project, acting as a liaison
 30 with the Facebook community Friends of North Park, who
 31 increased the awareness. What we found was that in the
 32 midst of the pandemic many people found the Sakura trees
 33 to be a calming and healing place. I have included a full
 34 page of quotations from citizens that were picked up from
 35 the Facebook page as they occurred. I'll read a couple of
 36 them.
 37 I truly want to thank the dedicated Sakura
 38 project people for the planting, watering, pruning and
 39 maintenance of these beautiful trees. You are really
 40 amazing. We have Washington, D.C. in our backyard. Who
 41 knew? Your photographers are gorgeous. What more can a
 42 person ask for? Beautiful photos to brighten our
 43 homebound days. Is this inside the park? It's beautiful.
 44 Where are these trees? I can't believe I've never seen
 45 them. Would like to this year.
