

In a few weeks, the annual budget process will be underway for County Council. Each year, a balanced budget must be enacted 25 days before the end of the year for the next fiscal year which begins January 1st. The process formally begins with the Chief Executive's presentation of the Comprehensive Fiscal Plan (CFP) which will take place on October 7th this year.

County Council then will hold three public hearings regarding the proposed budget for 2026. The hearings will be held on November 6th, 12th and 13th beginning at 4:00 pm in the Gold Room of the Allegheny County Courthouse. There will be presentations on the following topics: Community College of Allegheny County, Pittsburgh Regional Transit, Independently Elected County Offices, Courts, and General Government Operations. At the conclusion of the public hearings, Council's Committee on Budget and Finance will consider the budget bills where amendments could be offered. The process culminates with the passage of the millage ordinance and resolutions establishing the operating, capital, grants and special accounts budgets for the next fiscal year. The budget will then take effect on January 1st which begins the county's fiscal year.



Legislative Updates

15-25 OR allows Hershey Productions to film the Hershey motion picture.

16-25-OR accepted a donation from the U.S. Golf Association for golf course improvements at North and South Park.

17-25-OR acquired right of way needed for the Greensburg Pike Lateral Support project.

02-25-RE approved a LERTA tax exemption for the Homewood Gateway Apartments which includes 45 affordable housing units.

03-25-RE approved a LERTA tax exemption on the Northside which will include affordable housing, parking, retail and workspace.

04-25-RE approved a \$145 million bond issuance for improvements at Duquesne University. The bonds will be issued by the Higher Education Building Authority and are not in anyway financed by County tax revenues.

05-25-RE a resolution in which Council expressed its intent to work with the Chief Executive, County Manager and the Department of Emergency Services to provide assistance to the County's volunteer fire departments.

Bill No. 136535-25 was passed on September 9, 2025. this resolution authorized the issuance of \$55 million in bonds by the Allegheny County Hospital Development Authority for the purchase and maintain of medical helicopters. This project is not in anyway financed by County tax revenues.

Bill No. 13500-25 was passed on September 9, 2025. Is an ordinance creating a public database showing countywide properties for sale.

Election Updates

The Allegheny County Board of Elections approved plans presented by Elections Division staff for ballot return sites and satellite offices in advance of November's general election.

The satellite office and ballot return sites serve the same functionality as they did in the 2024 elections and the primary election in the spring of 2025. Satellite offices are locations that voters can request a mail-in ballot, vote it on the spot (or take it home) and return it to elections division staff on site – functionally known as "over the counter voting." That service is also available in the County Office Building as soon as ballots are available, likely in the first week of October.

Ballot Return Sites are open the final few days before election day (after the deadline to request a mail-in ballot has passed) and only serve the function of being a place where a voter can hand a mail-in ballot to an elections division employee. This is an important service for voters, as relying on mail service to deliver a mail-in ballot back to the elections division that close to Election Day is not recommended.

The County Office Building lobby will be open during regular business hours, 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM Monday - Friday, as soon as ballots are available for "over the counter voting" and return mail-in ballots, in addition to the weekend satellite office hours listed.

Traveling Glass Recycling Program

Allegheny County's Department of Sustainability and PRC has rolled out a Traveling Glass Recycling program. This self-serve glass drop-off site travels to various locations around the county, making it easier to recycle glass.



Why recycle glass?



Glass is still one of the most recyclable materials we generate in our homes and should not be trashed. Glass bottles and jars are 100% recyclable and can be recycled endlessly without losing any quality! This makes the effort to put these items back into the recycling ecosystem even more important.

How do I prepare the glass?

Containers should be empty and rinsed. Lids and labels don't need to be removed. Please remember that any bags and boxes used to carry the glass must be taken with you and discarded off-site.

What types of glass are acceptable?
