"NO PLASTIC PLEASE" Awareness Day

County Council declared Tuesday, March 5, 2019 to be "NO PLASTIC PLEASE" Awareness Day in Allegheny County, and they encourage all citizens to replace single use plastic with sustainable alternatives wherever possible by saying "no plastic please" at stores and restaurants.

Each year, around 8 million metric tons of plastic enter the world's oceans; the equivalent to dumping a rubbish truck full of plastic in the water every single minute.

By declaring "NO PLASTIC PLEASE" Awareness Day in Allegheny County, Council stresses the importance of all residents saying "no plastic please" in everyday business transactions and replacing single use plastic with sustainable alternatives.

2019 Allegheny County Summer Road Projects



- Fleming Park Bridge (Neville Road) in Neville Township and Stowe Township is expected to remained closed till end of June 2019. Traffic will be detoured using Route 51, I-79, and Grand Avenue.
- Work on **Homestead-Duquesne Road** between Homeville Road and Grant Avenue in West Mifflin Borough began on Tuesday, April 2, 2019 and is expected to last until the end August 2019. Crews will perform their work between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. on weekdays.
- The **Rachel Carson (Ninth Street) Bridge** in the City of Pittsburgh is closed to vehicle and pedestrian traffic and expected to last through summer 2020.
- Nightly lane and ramp closures on the **Homestead Grays Bridge** between the City of Pittsburgh and Homestead Borough from 10pm to 6am. The bridge preservation work is expected to last until early June 2019.
