

In a few weeks, the annual budget process will be underway for County Council. Each year, a balanced budget must be enacted for the next fiscal year by December 6th. The process formally begins with the Chief Executive's presentation of his Comprehensive Fiscal Plan (CFP) which usually takes place in early October.

County Council must then hold two public hearings regarding its budgeting process for 2024. The hearings will be held on October 17th and 19th beginning at 5:00 pm in the Gold Room of the Allegheny County Courthouse. There will be presentations on the following topics: Community College of Allegheny County, Pittsburgh Regional Transit, Independently Elected Offices, Courts, and General Government Opera-tions. After the conclusion of the public hearings, Council's Committee on Budget and Finance will consider budget bills introduced by the Chief Executive or Council Members and amendments to those bills that might be offered. The process culminates with the passage of the millage ordinance and resolutions establishing the operating, capital, grants and special accounts budget for the next fiscal year. Adoption of the annual budgets constitutes appropriations for the expenditures from the funds indicated.

Ordinances:

Bill No. 12709-23 - enacted on July 11, 2023. An ordinance of the County of Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, amending the Allegheny County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 220, entitled "Campaign Finance Reports and Statements," in order to establish requirements and prohibitions relating to the County's searchable public database of campaign finance reports and certain forms of coordinated campaign expenditures, and clarifying existing law relating to penalties for violations.

Bill No. 12742-23 - enacted on July 11, 2023. An ordinance of the County of Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, amending the Administrative Code of Allegheny County, Article 207, entitled "New Board of Property Assessment Appeals and Review," §5-207.08, entitled "Filing of appeals," in order to clarify applicability of special assessment appeal windows for 2022 and 2023 for properties impacted by court-ordered adjustments to the County's Common Level Ratio.

Bill No. **12695-23** - enacted on August 29, 2023. An Ordinance of the County of Allegheny, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, providing for the development of a climate action plan by the Allegheny County Department of Sustainability no later than July 1, 2024.

Bill No. 12801-23 - Motion of the Council of Allegheny County authorizing the President of Council to conduct public hearings, pursuant to §801.05 of the Administrative Code on Tuesday, October 17, at 5 pm and Thursday, October 19 at 5 pm in the Gold Room of the Allegheny County Courthouse.


