I am writing to alert you to a serious problem.

Both my son and I must vote by mail. I am immune compromised and exhausted from cancer. As a result I am unable to go to a polling place. My son takes care of me and therefore also cannot risk getting sick. As a result he does not go to the polls either. In addition it is not feasible for either of us to drive all the way downtown to the ONLY ballot box.

As a result we both must rely on mail in ballots. As a former judge of elections and activist I understand the importance of and take GREAT care to request ballots WELL in advance so as to allow more than enough time for processing on your end given COVID and possible delays within the mail system. I KNOW how to do this and as a result have not had a problem until this recent primary. We BOTH were UNABLE to cast our ballots in the most recent primary and that is unacceptable!

Note that we did exactly what was required and in the same way as before. Both mail in , not absentee, ballots were requested online , WELL in advance and within minutes of each other. In spite of the care taken, my ballot did not arrive in time to be mailed back ; it came just a few days before the election. My son's ballot NEVER came!

I also took care to follow up , tracking the status of both ballots online , after submitting the requests. I did this numerous times because my son's showed that it was in limbo up to and including on Election Day. I was , at the time and still remain, very upset. I tried calling numerous times to see why his ballot could not be tracked online but no one answered the phone. I left messages but my calls were not returned. I want to know what happened to my son's ballot ! He is a registered voter. There is no excuse for this!

Here is our information. Please get back to me with the reason my son never received his ballot as we need to address any problems before the next election.

Greetings,

May 17th was my first time working the polls.

I felt that many questions were raised about the integrity of the 2020 election and that, by large, they had not been adequately addressed by the appropriate authorities. In truth, it seems that the largest issue was mail-in ballots, but seeing as how I couldn't really control that aspect, I resolved that it would have to be enough to make sure that my little ward was as fair and accurate as possible.

I had high hopes going in. The training made it sound straightforward.

The first issue that we encountered was that the registry of voters was entirely incongruous with the list of voters that had requested an absentee ballot. We had a gentleman arrive and he was given a ballot because there was no flat in the registry, but then we found that his name was on the list of people who had requested an absentee ballot. We spent a great deal of time trying to get in touch with someone on the phone to understand what was going on and were ultimately told that we should go by the registry and ignore the list we had posted on the wall.

The second issue was that people started coming in and surrendering mail-in ballots whose names were not flagged in the registry.

The third issue we had was that we were not issued enough party-specific ballots (although we did still have ExpressVote ballots as a backup).

The fourth issue was that we were all entirely inexperienced and closing the polls was a nightmare. We ended up with an extra vote that was cast in the machine that we couldn't account for. No one had any remaining mental power with which to deal with this situation and we didn't leave our polling location until 11 PM.

I left feeling quite defeated and, frankly, terrified at the prospect of doing this again in November when the stakes are raised, there will be more voters, and tensions will be running higher.

All of this leads me the following:

- The registry must be the absolute source of truth for the poll workers. I don't understand the "last minute" additions, it seems like there are deadlines for registration, and I can't understand the excuse for this books not being accurate.
- There absolutely cannot be any errors about who has and has not received an absentee ballot. If they requested one, it MUST be in the book. If they did not, it must not state that they did. Having people bring in absentee ballots without there being a flag in the book is a crystal clear indicator that some people are voting twice. Are you catching that? Judging from the state of the registry, I have serious doubts.

Subject: Poll Worker Shortage

The purpose of sending this comment to the Board is to propose solutions to a few problems experienced that resulted in poll worker shortages.

During the April 25, 2022 Allegheny County BOE meeting, Director Jessica Garofolo's plea was loud and clear, in that 2,000 poll workers were needed to correct a deficit to adequately populate polling locations. Please consider the following problems encountered with use of current processes and procedures.

My experience was less than stellar when dealing with the county's schedulers during the pre-planning process prior to the 2022 Primary. Serious flaws and inadequacies were encountered during discussions with schedulers. In particular, my husband and I became too frustrated, when we learned we would be separated from our scheduled polling place, which would not include my dedicated team of workers. There was no negotiation. The unfortunate result was we withdrew our service as a well trained Judge and Inspector despite our dedicated service over the past years.

The current process used to schedule workers is fragmented and in large part the root cause of shortages. When a county scheduler lacks customer service skills, allows Township Managers to populate Election Boards, does not return phone calls, or ignores logic, this imperfect scenario creates unnecessary process complications and wastes valuable time. As a result, Volunteers continue to back-off from enrolling, especially after several failed phone call attempts to answer simple questions. Wasted efforts are duplicated over and over again by volunteers seeking a confirmed assignment. Please...train employees to enhance their customer service skills. A good communicator uses a tactful professional tone and language.

The time is past due for the county to recognize and replace the existing, antiquated process with one that not only allows a volunteer to sign-up to work, but to choose a poll location close to home. There's no excuse for a scheduler to tell a volunteer "you'll work where I tell you", or "are you threatening me." This is misplaced language and is unacceptable. The current setup discourages seasoned and trained workers with the last minute and untrained. Why?

In conclusion, the current process is not user friendly. Enhance sign-ups with choice of polling location. Schedulers dealing with the public need Customer Service training or be replaced. Election Volunteers are an asset in Allegheny County and should be treated with respect throughout the process. Lastly, please inspect what you expect.

To the elections board:

My name is Michael Stroucken, I have been serving as an elections officer at Mount Lebanon, Ward 1 District 2 for the last nine years.

I would like to comment on the organization and operation of the May 17th primary election at the district level.

1) Until this election, I have served for quite a while as an appointed Judge of Election. Last November, a citizen of the district ran for the office and won. Before the primary election, she notified the division of elections that she would be unable to serve on May 17th. The division of elections then appointed another person as judge. Emphatically disclaiming any personal jealousy, I think it would have been preferable if the division had appointed me as judge, since I had several years' experience in the district and was supported very well by my teammates.

2) When our judge did not show up by 6:30, I wanted to call the division of elections for advice on how to proceed. One of our team members had brought a copy of the training materials which had the support phone numbers listed in it. However I was greeted by an announcement to "call back during business hours". I sincerely hope that this will not repeat in future elections. Our judge showed up around 6:40 and we were able to open by 7:03.

3) Arriving at the polling location, I noticed that this was the second time in a row that proper furniture was not in place. The tables that had been provided were all standing-height for the voters, with no sitting-height tables provided for the election officers. School custodians were able to assist in exchanging tables. The large wheeled ballot scanner assemblies for all the polling locations at that school were delivered to an elevated stage with no discernible safe means of bringing them down to their intended locations. In November, several of us younger and stronger people handed them down from the stage, fortunately without injuries. In this election, school custodians were able to wheel them around the school grounds to an elevator somewhere.

4) I think the staffing process of district elections officers has suffered. In the past, Rosalee maintained a list of people who served as officers. Eight weeks or so before the election, she called us and asked if we wanted to serve again. It was a straightforward process, and it worked. For this election, I was contacted in March to sign up on some online cloud service the county had contracted with, something called "Pollchief". Using that platform was not convenient: I had to take precautions to protect my private information from Google, which is used by Pollchief. I also had to loosen security on my browser due to sloppy programming on Pollchief's part. I expected to be contacted, either in person or via email after I had signed up. When I hadn't heard anything for three weeks, I logged into the site again and saw that the site was now asking whether I wanted to serve. I was talking with my teammates during this time, none of whom are comfortable with the online lifestyle. They

Comments to the Board of Elections for the June 6, 2022 meeting

Greetings! I come before you today to raise a major concern about transparency around our elections.

As you know, our media environment is awash in misinformation and disinformation which threatens the heart of our democracy by leading to a situation where official information – including election results – are no longer widely accepted as true by the general public. Colleagues who research the best way to counteract this especially with respect to elections often conclude it is best countered by consistently communicating accurate information through channels readily identifiable as coming from official sources. An easy-to-implement recommendation is to provide information on a .gov domain. Allegheny County should but still does not do this, making it easier for attackers to create disinformation Web pages that are harder-than-necessary for most people to distinguish from real, legitimate sites.

On your behalf, the County is actively refusing to comply with certain transparency provisions of the Elections Code, which provide for e.g. access to declaration envelopes and other information about mail-in and absentee ballot requests. They are doing this even when improved compliance with the requirements would likely take just a few minutes of additional effort to run an export with the right fields selected, or a similar amount of time to copy and send the set of scanned envelope images it already stores on file. Even when a request for access to records is backed by an unappealed order from the state's Office of Open Records (obtained after months of effort), the County ignores requests for appointments and refuses to permit the photocopying of public records which the Elections Code plainly allows, to raise the time-and-effort costs to a Requester. This restriction doesn't fully prevent access to either information on public records the County deems secret or information like drivers' license numbers and the last 4 digits of social security numbers that actually do appear protectable from public disclosure, even when a Requester points out that the treatment of these two classes should be reversed. Instead, the County states that they require an elector of the County sue at high cost and obtain a Court order before it will comply with transparency obligations.

Seeing these barriers, many members of the public will justifiably give up attempting to seek accurate information through official channels, permitting misinformation and disinformation to spread even more easily.

The Elections Code formally places transparency duties of compliance with the Board of Elections, so I am asking you to pass a resolution at this meeting requiring the Elections Division to immediately comply with the requirements of 25 P.S. §§ 3146.9 & 3150.17, including at least the provision of the envelope scans, the export of the listed fields regarding postal ballot requests, and the permission to photograph/scan/photocopy public-record envelopes.¹ If you do not, I will not hesitate to file suit against the Board of Elections (as you formally bear the responsibility & have the power to do this) and get the court order the County says it requires. Note that if I have to do so I will also be seeking attorney fees and civil penalties, and the theoretical maximum total of penalties under the law is very high.

¹ 25 P.S. § 2648 states that the records of (or in the custody of) each county board of elections open to public inspection "may be inspected and copied by any qualified elector of the county during ordinary business hours."

The Elections Code gives a 48 hour maximum window for compliance; it does not contemplate Requesters having to wait for months going through formal proceedings.

Of greater concern, the reason given for denying access to public records is that the public-record declaration envelopes and ballots have a corresponding code, and the PA Constitution prohibits anyone (including election officials!) from having access to that information. The County continued marking its ballots this way in the 2022 primary election you may be certifying results of today, and as far as I can tell plans to continue the practice in future elections. Please pass a resolution today prohibiting the County from permitting any voter-specific markings on ballots or otherwise distinguishing between ballots for the same municipality, ward, precinct, precinct split (if applicable), party (in a primary), and method (e.g. mail-in vs. absentee vs. in-person). This has been previously encouraged in greater detail but ignored. You apparently will not meet again until it is too late to change this for the fall election.

I also encourage you to pass a resolution requiring the use of privacy envelopes for 'secrecy' envelopes instead of see-through ones. You previously asked the Elections Division about this, and they said they'd look into it and get back to the BoE as a way of dismissing the concern, without actually doing anything.

In contrast to markings on ballots, I urge you to pass a resolution requiring the unique tracking of the outer envelopes with USPS Intelligent Mail Barcodes, to be better able to communicate with voters who did not receive promised postal ballots even when sent multiple times, and to better quantify any issues with mail delivery so as to provide confidence in whether that issue could have affected election outcomes, instead of allowing speculation and disinformation on this topic to flourish. The County also has some serious data quality issues in its existing ballot tracking practices it should also address.

In 2022, the County appears to have again contracted with Midwest Direct for the preparation of voting by mail packages, through middleman RBM Consulting. This middleman is apparently needed because Midwest direct is not licensed to do business in PA or even its home state of OH due to issues related to a past mail fraud conviction. I hope you will dig more deeply into this than a few questions with readily accepted answers. The Elections Division lied to this Board in response to pointed questions from the Board of Elections about how this vendor was selected in 2020, when they sent approximately 29,000 wrong ballots to voters (even with using voter-unique codes on ballots, which they claimed to be for preventing this issue though it did not) under a Trump flag flying overhead. RBM's contract in that year provided only for operation of ballot printers at the elections warehouse, not preparation and mailing of postal-voting packages. Contrary to what the Division told this Board at a later meeting in response to repeated direct questions, the vendor did NOT provide either the full refund or compensation for County staff time associated with the wrong-ballot issue – they instead charged the County extra for the extra work associated with the issue. Yet, the County ensured they would be the only bidder on the 2022 contract.

Finally, I encourage the Board of Elections to require the creation and use of documented, observable procedures for ballot handling at each stage, including ballot remaking, mixing, tracking, counting, and storing.

One Republican voter who identified herself as such said that they ran out of Republican ballots so she and others had to use the emergency voting booth. She came out and told us some people had left who were in line because (I suppose) would they did not want to wait. The person running the elections there said that she knew they were low on ballots and started requesting additional Republican ballots at 2 PM. Additional ballots did not arrive until I believe after 7 PM. I was at the pool from 12 PM until 8 PM.--

Dear Mr. Voye,

I appreciate you and your staff considering and responding to my concerns regarding the Absentee Ballot lists from the May 17, 2022 election. I will disclose myself as being a citizen who is concerned about the integrity of our election process in Pennsylvania and, therefore, I approach incidents through a skeptical lens. I also understand that many would consider my concerns nuanced and easily dismissible. However, I believe if the system is to be trustworthy and reliable, discrepancy and inefficiencies should be eliminated in order to avoid any potential abuse. Striving for the fairest and most reliable election process possible should be our collective goal.

I have worked the Sewickley Heights poll center (00 01) for several years. This year we received three "Absentee Ballot Request" sheets to post for public view and for reconciliation with the poll book. Three pages struck me as more than usual so I further scrutinized the lists. To be clear, the lists were not labelled to include "Mail-In" ballots although possibly this was to be implied. (The title of the list should be clear in announcing what information it intends to transmit). Additionally, to my recollection, there was no longer the column which confirmed receipt of requested ballots therefore putting into the question the fundamental purpose of the list. Upon further scrutiny, I found **my** name listed as having requested a ballot. I work the poll. I did not request an absentee ballot. My daughter's name was listed as well. I became rather upset when I realized all that stood between me and a provisional ballot was the poll book. I happen to be a citizen who highly values same day, in-person voting and believe that the provisional system is very important for dealing with a host of comparatively rare discrepancies but should **not** serve as a casual catch-all for flaws in the election process. Fortunately, my daughter and I were not marked as having requested a ballot in the poll book but the episode raised my antenna. A fellow poll worker and I reconciled the three pages with the poll book and found roughly half of the names listed had not returned ballots so we flagged those names and proceeded to ask every voter who came in person to vote if they had requested a ballot. Every person I asked responded that they had not. That survey represented 15 voters. We also discovered at least 7 of the voters on the ballot request list were non-affiliated (NO or NF). Why would they have been on the ballot request list for the primary (yes, I understand at times there can be referendum votes and thus non-affiliated voters would participate but that wasn't the case in this election)?

I reiterate some of these issues can be explained or dismissed as not harmful, irrelevant or inefficient. My general concern is a lack of trust in the Pennsylvania electoral system and my personal concern is finding my name on a list where it doesn't belong. I am including here below a series of questions to which I would like to have answers. I thank you in advance for your responses and I appreciate your efforts to fortify, reform and strengthen election integrity in Pennsylvania.

1. What is the purpose of providing "Absentee Request" lists if they are not reconciled with received ballots?
2. Is the "Absentee Request" list intended to include Mail-In ballot requests and if so, could the title of the list be written to reflect exactly what it intends to confer?
3. Why are non-affiliated voters displayed on the request lists as having requested ballots and were they mailed ballots?
4. Have rules for the absentee ballot process changed from needing an excuse and must they be returned by the date of the election?
5. To avoid confusion, would it be possible to eliminate the automatic resend of any ballot request? Voters have mentioned frustration about this process at my polling place. To restate, could voters be required to request Mail-In or Absentee ballots for each election?

I have been working or serving as Judge of Elections at 11/10 the farmhouse in Pittsburgh for about 10 years. We typically have upwards of 90% of our eligible voters voting in the fall and 60% voting in the primary. We have about 575 registered voters. When we opened the ballots we had 10 Republican ballots, 150 democratic ballots and 50 express ballots. We tried to call about this at 7 am and continuously to only ringing phones and messages that the offices were closed. We didn't see a lead man or Rover until after 10 am when we already had used 8 of the 10 Republican ballots and 50 or so democratic ones. The farce continued when the runner brought us 150 Republican ballots at 11:30 and no democratic ballots. The lead man went and scoured up 50 express voting ballots from another ward when he was told that they had to print more ballots and the soonest we could get them was 5:30. We were using express ballots for both parties with one machine. Somehow the order was canceled and we didn't get democratic ballots until 5:30 and then We had more dropped off at 6:30.

Luckily the constituents in the neighborhood were flexible and patient but this could have been a disaster. I was 18 express ballots from not having a way for democrats to vote! That means that we had used about 80 express ballots and 150 democratic ballots and went on to use many more. I had voters at 7:55pm. The solution that was suggested to me was to use provisional ballots which would have been wrong. Oh, I started the day without the document needed for a voter turning in a mail in ballot to vote. I tore out the sample in the notebook and had her use that and had my husband print some from the manual because as I said I had no one to contact nor did anyone check in before 10 am.

This is the only time I have ever had problems so I was hesitant to comment but this was ridiculous and should never have occurred. Please know that we would like to see this rectified for November
