I would like to request that Allegheny County NOT certify the 2020 election. I work for Representative Bob Brooks who represents part of Allegheny County. I have never seen so much confusion and chaos involved in an election. I still receive calls in our office on a daily basis of people unhappy with the election. People call daily with examples of how they have been disenfranchised. Many to this day do not even know if their provisional ballots have been counted or not! I have heard complaints in my office of mail in ballots not received, mail in ballots received but not requested, and duplicate ballots received. Many people were given provisional ballots and poll workers gave them incorrect information on how to fill them out. For example, some were told to put the polling location on the envelope rather than their home address and others were told to sign in the election book and then given a provisional ballot not knowing that would disqualify their vote. In addition, there is evidence of ballot curing in Allegheny county. These are all serious problems. The legislature determines election laws and then we the people expect the safeguards associated with those laws to be followed; however, Allegheny county has taken it upon themselves to ignore those safeguards! You do not have the power or authority to pick and choose what parts of the law you want to follow and sadly that is what workers in Allegheny County have done. This has contributed to the lack of uniformity in this election statewide and you have accepted ballots that you should not have and you have engaged in illegal ballot curing. Dear Board,

Thank you for your heroic efforts and the successful execution of the November 2020 election. Your hard work and the efforts of thousands of your peers around the country "saved democracy" and I am profoundly grateful to each of you.

With the election behind us, I believe it is necessary for us to look back and review. I am requesting a detailed investigation and report of the mishandling of the 28,879 mail-in ballots that were processed by Midwest Direct as described by the October 14th press release from Allegheny County.

My family was affected by this error. My ballot, as well as the ballots of my wife and daughter, were all on the list of ballots that were "incorrect" My wife and daughter both sent in the "original incorrect ballot" as well as the "corrected" ballots with the orange strip. My name is Kimberly Butler and these are my comments regarding the counting of mail-in ballots on November 3, 2020 in Allegheny County:

- I was appointed canvasser of mailed vote counting. I was placed to observe counting at a warehouse located at 901 Pennsylvania Avenue in Pittsburgh, PA (Allegheny County). There were 2 observation areas that were approximately twenty-five (25) to thirty (30) feet away from where ballots were being received, opened, and scanned. Besides myself, there were others in the observation areas.
- There were security cameras around the facility. There were four (4) overhead television screens approximately seventy-five (75) inches. Two screens were located overhead in the observation area of the opening of the privacy envelopes and two screens overhead located in the scanning observation area. The cameras did not provide full visibility of these areas.
- There were nine ballot scanning stations, of which only one was visible to us from the observation area. It appeared that any ballot that became jammed or did not scan, came out onto a different tray than those ballots that scanned, and were reinserted to be rescanned. If the ballot could not be scanned due to damage of some type, the ballot was put into a tote located at each of the 9 scanner locations.
- An election official named, "Amy" told us in the observation area that over 400,000 ballots were received, of which only 170,900 were scanned as of 2 A.M. on November 4 when scanning stopped and we were asked to leave the facility. We were told that scanning would resume at 10:00 A.M. on November 4. All uncounted ballots in the scanning area were locked in a cage. The unscannable ballots from each of the nine totes were all dumped into one tote. Several pieces of yellow ribbon were placed over this tote which was then placed in the cage. We were informed that the unscannable ballots were to be entered by hand. I have no inkling of what the fate of these so-called unscannable ballots was. The entire operation was highly labor intensive and conducted almost-entirely out of our view.
- I had no way to verify if these ballots were authentic, watermarked, spoiled (or not spoiled) or verified in any way.
- As a separate issue, I myself voted via mail-in ballot at a drop-off location. The mail-in ballot that I received had the incorrect district. I corrected in person at the Department of Elections in Allegheny County. I then received an orange striped ballot in the mail. I was informed later that the ballot I corrected was still incorrect and that only the new ballot with the orange stripe was valid. This was confusing to anyone who did not learn that the orange-striped ballot received by mail was the correct new ballot as there were no words saying "corrected."
- Though scanning had stopped at 2 A.M., a new shift had been brought in to open the privacy envelopes without anyone in the observation areas.
- I could not see where the outer envelopes were actually being opened.
- I observed two other areas of activity, one was a large sorter where we were told sorts the ballots by municipality. The second was a computer area where the operator verifies information if there was an issue with the outside envelope. I could only view these areas from the observation area and were too far away to verify the actual activity of these two areas or the next step of their process.
- I was disturbed by the distance of the observation area to the work areas and the lack of actual visibility on the monitors of the massive amounts of mail-in ballots that arrived at the warehouse that I, as a canvasser, could not see to verify.

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ATTENTION: Allegheny County Board of Elections I strongly request no certification by the Allegheny County Board of Elections for the Nov 3rd General Election due to incomplete, careless, and irregular circumstances. Twenty days after the election my Pennsylvania State Senate District 45 winner has not yet been declared. In addition, election irregularities and violations of the PA Election Code are evident. Examples are early and extended voting dates and times, drop boxes, incomplete Voter Declarations and/or Provisional Ballots where no signature and/or no date was provided, unsealed ballot boxes during satellite voting, coaching voters to complete or change the Voter Declaration envelope and its contents, and blocking poll watchers. The registration lists are grossly inaccurate, despite the settlement with PILF to correct (deceased, moved, and duplicate voters remain with their Voter ID numbers). A proven "irregularity" was provided to me of a loved one who cast their vote on October 26 despite his death in year 2002. As Judge of Elections at a precinct in my municipality, I am witness to voters who surrendered two or three ballots, and in-person voters were incorrectly listed in the poll book as having voted previously by mail-in. Non-residents attempted and were sent to vote in my precinct (unsuccessfully). When observing at the warehouse during canvassing, I am aware of instances when the two DS200 flash drives were not removed from the DS200 scanner equipment on election night. The flash drives were discovered when the DS200 scanner was returned to the northside Allegheny County Warehouse several days after Election Day. It is because of the several reasons stated herein, I argue a decision to certify this election would be a haphazard, unfair, and unwise decision by the Board.

I object to the certification of the election results for Allegheny County. The November 3rd canvassing and the satellite office voting had too many irregularities to be ignored.

- Early voting was never passed by the PA legislature, nor is it anywhere to be found in the PA Election Code, yet the county conducted early voting via downtown and satellite offices for 3 consecutive weekends in October. The county election office on Forbes Ave continued to provide this service on the week preceding the November 3rd election.
- The ballot drop box was never passed by the PA legislature, nor is it anywhere to be found in the PA Election Code, yet Allegheny County proceeded with this method of mail-in ballot voting for 3 consecutive weekends in October. The county election office on Forbes Ave continued to provide this service on the week preceding the November 3rd election.
- During early voting, full ballot boxes were replaced with empty ones; the full ones being taken to holding areas, out of public view, with ballot slots unsecured as mandated by PA Election Code Art XII Sect 1224
- During the canvas of the vote, 10,000 votes were removed from an upload to the PA system approximately 12 AM on November 4 due to a problem, then were re-uploaded within the hour.
- The vote canvass was suspended at 2AM on November 4 due to workers' fatigue & was announced to be resumed at 10AM. It is the county election division's responsibility to assign workers in shifts to continue the canvass in a way that is both transparent and efficient. Further, this suspension was congruent to other tabulation centers' suspensions in several states and is a cause of current litigation in candidates' races.

The PA Election Code is quite clear in its establishment of duties, processes, and procedures; checks and balances are evident throughout the code. Because the code was not followed, the integrity of the November 3rd election is severely compromised. The argument of voter disenfranchisement rings hollow as the 50 day time frame for issuance & return of absentee and mail in ballots was more than adequate.

I object to the certification of the Allegheny County vote due to these reasons and request an audit of the November 3rd election.

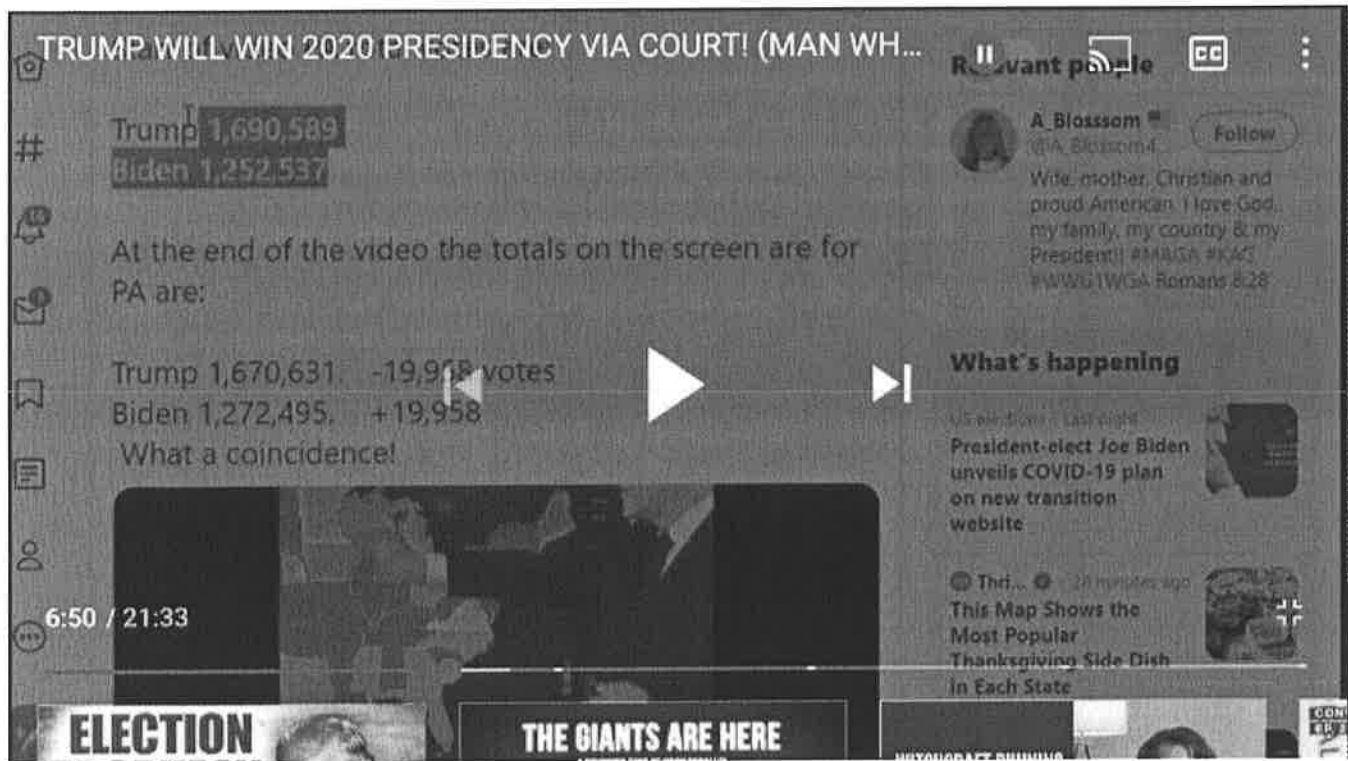

DECLARATION

1. My name is Karen S Toft. I am over the age of 18. All the facts stated herein are true and based on my personal knowledge. This report is submitted this 22nd day of November, 2020.

2. I am a resident of the Wilkins Township, Allegheny County, Pennsylvania.

3. I am a registered voter in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

4. For approximately 5 years, I have served as a judge of elections at Wilkins Township Ward 1 District 3. (Prior to that, I worked as a poll worker and the Majority Inspector for about 12 years.)

5. Observation 1 - Major Concern: Multiple **Voter Registers** potentially allow mail-in voters to vote TWICE. If the name was only checked in the First Register (my board had 4), that mail-in voter could vote in-person and then also mail in their ballot (or it was already mailed in). Susie Neft, of the Elections Department of Allegheny County, AGREED that voters with mail-in ballots could vote TWICE if not caught at the in-person sign-in. In reference to the multiple registers, Susie Neft "wishes that didn't happen." If the Mail-in Ballots had been required to arrive and be counted *before* Election Day (like Absentee Ballots used to be), there would not be a chance for this type of fraud to occur.

6. Observation 2 - Poll Worker Training was inadequate. I was trained on October 6th and my Minority Inspector was trained on October 5th. We both agreed that the video went over the items too quickly and not enough notes could be taken. (I recommend that the video be available to watch on-line.) There were many workers and Judges that had never worked an election before, and all this new information was over whelming.

7. Observation 3 - Opening the polls was chaotic and the paperwork was confusing. I was able to set up my polling area the day before which was very helpful. In my polling place there are two polls in the same room. Wilkins Ward 1 Dist 4 did not set up the day before and they were barely able to get opened on time. No one on that board had ever worked an election and they were scrambling to get ready. The paperwork and who is eligible to vote was very confusing. (see observations below)

8. Observation 4 - Paperwork was confusing and not correct. I could see where this created chaos, especially in the new workers. Some of the paperwork was specifically for a primary election, not a general election (example: The Numbered List of Voters). Instructions for dealing with conditional Regular Paper Ballots (page 44 of manual) were very confusing. "Surrendered", "Spoiled", "Abandoned", and "Remitted" ballots all go in the "Spoiled" Envelope but do not count "Surrendered" ones.

(surrendered and remitted are actually the same.) The registers were confusing because not all the names on the "List of Absentee Voters" to be posted were in the registers. There were no instructions on where the list was to be filed. Some of the people who already received a mail-in ballot were not marked as such in the original register. The General Returns Sheet were not correct. (This is the final count.) I think the sheet has "a= b+c". This does not correspond to the instructions on page 28 of the manual that says Provisional ballots are not to be numbered. (This is because they are NOT scanned.) The K Envelope says NOT to seal it and on page 45 of the manual, it says TO seal it.

9. Observation 5 - The SEALS: The seal on the Orange Pouch was NOT secure! I unzipped it *without* breaking the seal and was able to obtain the "Secret" password. There were two sticker seals, but only instructions to use one. Was

the other one extra? That is NOT secure. The instructions for the zip-tie seals were not clear. Susie Neft said that she had received a lot of calls concerning what to do with these seals.

10. Observation 6 – The Returns Process was TOTAL CHAOS! I returned my materials to the Boyce Park Ski Lodge. I observed a very long line of Judges of Elections returning their materials. Many of them did not know what was to be placed in the Returns Bag and what was to remain in the black suitcase. One Judge left some of his returns paperwork in his suitcase. The officials had to unload all the black suitcases to locate his, in order to retrieve the correct paperwork. Another Judge was carrying around her Yellow Bag (of voted ballots) like she was carrying a gym bag. The officials had to pack it into the suitcase. It was very clear that a lot of these judges did not know what they were doing. I had to wait in line about an hour and a half before I could turn in my materials.
 11. Observation 7 - The Polling Place instructions to control Electioneering, on pages 7 and 73, were not clear concerning the 10ft restrictions from the entrance. The “Check Materials” list on page 4 is missing “Provisional Ballot Procedures”.

Comments of Roy Blankenship, Jr. Community Organizer for the Black Political Empowerment Project (B-PEP) – Sunday, November 22, 2020

In the 2020 election cycle I, Roy Blankenship Jr., B-PEP's Community Organizer worked on the Election Protection campaign and The Phone Banking Election Awareness campaign. During these weeks B-PEP has reached out to over 1100 voters, Mobilized 200 volunteers and utilized collaborations to assure participation in a bi-partisan fashion. We also trained to learn all the protocols of citizens working to insure the integrity of the voting process regardless of party affiliation. B-PEP's ELECTION PROTECTION efforts promoted the links for training of other citizens to help ensure Americans keep a just and integral democratic process!! While our efforts were welcomed and met with inspiration, comradery and participation, we were left with the knowledge that through our outreach voters were informed, educated and engaged!

During the day of election B-PEP's staff, collaborators, and volunteers worked to mobilize our region! We learned that the vast majority of voters had wanted changes in government and in leadership. As a nonpartisan organization are excited about the civic engagement and the level of voter turn out! As B-PEP's Community Organizer I am inspired to keep our civic engagement intact, because the overall participation of the people has shown overwhelming results.. The people rallied and have spoken with their vote! Elections are decided by the numbers, and numbers don't lie!

As this election participation has been historically documented, we must all now ensure that our vote and the right therewith never lose its integrity or power! We are grateful for the awakening of the people and will continue to educate, inform and build a more engaged African American community and engage those with whom we share this great nation.

Though participation in the election was unprecedented there were hurdles that were encountered, I worked worked as a rover/poll monitor and visited 16 polling places, the largest recurring issue was the lack of knowledge that polling staff members and officials had of the process for the signatures of the Judge of Elections and Minority Inspectors which were to go onto the top right hand corner of the green envelopes which held provisional ballots. Prior to B-PEP's engagement some of the green envelopes were not being completed appropriately. Thankfully with the help of Mr. Barker of Allegheny County Council and Vote Pa we were able to help get the word out to polling places to ensure that the validity of the provisional ballots were not compromised! Also there were volunteers signing the Provisional Ballots on behalf of a Judge of Elections and Minority Inspectors which could have ended up rendering a ballot void.

These issues were quickly addressed, thanks to the leadership of Mr. Tim Stevens who gave me the task to stop poll watching at a specific location, and to instead begin visiting as many polling places as possible to help ensure that all polling places were understanding the provisional ballot submission process, and making sure that the signers of the provisional ballots green envelopes were the correct election officials. In short,while COVID-19 has caused new processes for elections, I feel the Board of Elections must put more training into the actual polling place election officials training. But one again, I am grateful for all who participated to make this electoral process a success in a time of crisis!

Thanks for the great work done for the November 3, 2020 Presidential Election. There were quite a few challenges with you, the Elections Division staff and poll workers had to confront. What we encourage going forward is to review where overall training of poll workers can be improved to improve the possibility that every vote counts, in that the system of mail-in ballots is still new, as is the process for 'curing' ballots. The use of provisional ballots seem to remain a bit confusing to some poll workers. We also ask that you seek additional ways of educating the voting public on our voting system, including information on both in-person voting and use of the mail-in ballot. In the past the Elections Division used to keep track of issues brought to their attention following an election. We are asking that such a process continue, or be reactivated in order to help improve the voting process.

Our B-PEP Planning Council recently voted to urge the Board of Elections to continue, on a permanent basis, use of the satellite offices for voting, and to consider expanded use of them and possibly additional sites.

Again, congratulations on a job well done and please convey our heartfelt thanks to the poll workers and the county staff who had to count the votes!
