What issues prevented precincts from completing their reporting of the in-person vote results until days after the closing of the polls? This is referring to the in-person votes cast on 11/3 across the 1323 precincts, and a number of those precincts were showing as "Partially Reported".

Where can we go to see the results at a precinct level? We need to be able to see the count of each precinct's votes, both walk-in and mail-in, so that we can see the allocation of those 702,764 votes.

How many mail-in ballots were received, but not accepted? How many of those votes are part of the 28,879 that were reprinted due to the printing issues that were reported on 10/14?

Where can we get an accurate account of the application, approval, date of mailing, and date of return for ALL ballots printed for the residents of Allegheny County? The state's OpenDataPA site is reporting inaccurate information for Allegheny County, and what's the point of being "open and transparent" if the information being reported is wildly inaccurate? For example, on October 13th, Midwest Direct said that they were processing a batch of 19,564 "pending requests" that would be mailed out on October 14th-15th and the reprinted 28,879 ballots were to be mailed between October 15th – October 17th – that's a total of nearly 50k ballots that were being mailed between the 14th and the 17th, and I don't see where these ballots are reflected in the data reported to the state:

Hello,

I am writing to you about my concerns over the recent election. I helped to work as a clerk at the voting polls on November 3rd and am genuinely concerned about the way Pennsylvania handled the election. This was my first time working at the polls. The small precinct I worked had 1800 registered voters. Of that 1800 approximately 850 people showed up to vote. I was shocked to see so much confusion and mistakes made during the mail-in ballot process. I even had a voter tell me how she received a mail in ballot for her husband that had passed over 2 years ago. One of my biggest concerns is that there is no way to track whose ballot belongs to whom.

A friend of mine (Registered Democrat) that lives in Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, sent me the following email:

Talked to my sister. She's been voting at the same polling site for 29 years - usually voted late in the day due to work schedule and was usually #52 to #55 voter. She retired and so was able to vote early on Tuesday. Went in at 8:15AM. She was handed regular ballot and told where to go to complete. She said wait - don't you need me to sign? No, were not doing that - not required was the response. She said - been coming here 29 years - have always required my signature. Again answer was - not needed. So she went and completed ballot and scanned in - she was number 45 voter - 1 hour and 15 minutes in on the day. As she was doing that a group of 4 people walked in together to vote - again no check in - no signature here's your ballots.

Considering early voters and mail-in voters, my sister couldn't believe she was the 45th voter so early in the day. Super suspicious - right? Her son reported it to the Tribune Review newspaper Tuesday morning and they said they would investigate but have no idea if anything was done.

If Allegheny County is not making people sign for their ballots how do they even know who came to vote? I have a phone call into the County but have yet to hear anything back. I do have the information of the individual that went to vote and did not need to sign anything. She is more than willing to tell her story.

My name is Karen Toft and I am the Judge of Election for Wilkins Ward 1 District 3. These comments pertain to the General Election that was held on 11-3-2020. The District Register(Polling Binder) was very confusing. My binder had 3 supplemental additions. It's obvious that the register was printed before all the mail-in and absentee ballots were received. Several people were marked as a regular voter in my original register but also had their name in the supplemental register as having received a valid ballot.

The Elections Department did not know if their ballot had been received and counted as already voted. (I personally cross-checked every name.) If only the original register was checked, those voters could have voted twice: once by mail and once in person.

Because we had a very large number of first-time Judges, who did NOT receive adequate training, the above mentioned mistake could easily have occurred. I had 31 voters who canceled their mail-in ballots at my poll because they wanted to vote in-person. One voter had received 2 valid ballots, both of which I marked "surrendered".

The list of received Absentee Ballots was in an envelope, but some of those names were also in the supplemental books.

The method of accepting Mail-in/Absentee Ballots AFTER the register is printed and AFTER election Day, provides an immense opportunity for mistakes and voter fraud. These ballots should already be accounted for by the time the registers are printed. I also discovered several errors and conflicting information in the handbook which I will submit in a separate report.
