#### E-Cigarettes That Don't Look It

Like a cigarette, e-cigarettes, e-hookahs and vape pens can be nicotine delivery devices. Unlike a cigarette, these are unregulated by the F.D.A. They come in a variety of flavors, like Belgian waffle, vanilla cupcake, and peppermint blast.



These come in a variety of shapes and designs and can be interchangeable with e-Hookahs. This particular device is advertised as an "electronic cigarette" and includes a battery and charger.

## **Terminology**

- E-cigarette v. Vaporizer
  - Same technology
  - Cultural difference...
- "Vapor"
  - Actually an aerosol
  - Implies harmlessness
    - It's only water!



## Health Impact

- Long term effects are unknown
  - Emerging product
  - Lack of longitudinal, population-based studies
- Information is available about components
  - Chemical ingredients
  - Devices and batteries
  - Accidents



## Ingredients

- Base
  - Propylene glycol (PG)
  - Vegetable glycerin (VG)
- Nicotine
  - 0 mg-24 mg
  - Highly concentrated, very potent
  - Inconsistently labeled and classified
- Flavoring chemicals
  - 555




### **Flavors**

- Unregulated
- No labelling requirements
  - "Natural", "organic", "USP grade", "GRAS"
- Studies have identified:
  - Tobacco-derived chemicals
  - Carcinogens, toxicants, respiratory irritants
  - Heavy metals
  - Drugs

### **Accidents**

- Explosions and burns
  - 25 between 2009 and 2014
  - At least 21 more through March 2016
  - 9 more through April 2016
- Accidental poisonings



## **Availability**

- Widely available
- 881 licensed tobacco retailers in Allegheny County
- Yelp search for "vape shops" returned 77 results in and around Pittsburgh

→ As many as 950 locations selling e-cigarettes in Allegheny County.



#### Prevalence

- Current use (at least once in past 30 days):
  - 13.4% of high-school students
  - 3.9% of middle-school students
    - Use in both groups tripled from 2013 to 2014 (CDC)
    - Use in both groups exceeds traditional cigarettes
- Nearly 30% ever-use by college



## Policy elsewhere

- Comprehensive smoke-free laws
  - ND, NJ
  - Philadelphia, Boston
- Minor access
  - 18+ in all states except PA and MI
    - Philadelphia
  - 21+ in at least 140 localities



## Policy elsewhere

- Point-of-Sale
  - Licensing and permits
    - Philadelphia, Tacoma WA
  - Raise the price
    - MN, KS
  - Zoning
    - Chicago, San Francisco
  - Other restrictions
    - Advertising/window coverage (La Mesa CA)
    - Flavors (Providence, Chicago)



#### **Current events**

- FDA Deeming Rule
  - Final version with White House
- House Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies appropriations bill for FY2017
  - Section 749 would block FDA from using funds to "finalize, implement, administer, or enforce" this rule unless excludes "large and premium cigars" from FDA oversight



## Options available to ACHD

- Prohibit minor access
- Prohibit use in public places and workplaces
- Ban use by food service workers
- Permitting
