





Adjusted virus levels








General COVID-19 Updates

- Bivalent COVID-19 vaccines (Pfizer and Moderna)
- Continue with lower vaccination rates for children
- Paxlovid Study (Israel) reinforced benefit for 65 years and older <u>Nirmatrelvir Use and Severe Covid-19 Outcomes during the Omicron Surge</u> (nejm.org)
- Targeted case investigation for unvaccinated people with COVID aged 65+
 - Verify vaccination status
 - Recommend contact HCP for possible therapeutics
- Streamlined COVID-19 reports this week



Decline in Life Expectancy Associated with Pandemic


Figure 1. Life expectancy at birth, by sex: United States, 2000–2021

Figure 2. Life expectancy at birth, by Hispanic origin and race: United States, 2019–2021





- Vaccinations to date: > 3000 individuals
- TPOXX
 - Contract with Hilltop Pharmacy to deliver doses to county addresses (ensures access to medically-identified in need)
 - Pre-placed at hospitals for inpatient use



Bureau of Data, Reporting and Disease Control

- Updated <u>ID Surveillance data</u> through 2020
- Published school immunization report (2021-22)
- Wastewater testing for EV-D68 (associated with acute flaccid myelitis)
- Surveillance for monkeypox

Bureau of Administration and Public Health Lab

- RFP to determine new location for Public Health Laboratory
- 2023 budget requests submitted
- Working on new software solution for permitting programs



Bureau of Food Safety, Housing and Policy

Food Safety Program

- Targeted outreach to ensure food operators aware of recently approved Article III
- Finalizing IT system upgrades, training staff, public facing instructional materials

. Housing and Community Environment Program

- Weekly testing from 30 fixed mosquito sites from Pgh, Mon Valley, Allegheny and Ohio River valleys
- Mosquito spraying events in response to elevated West Nile virus levels
- Completed inspections of 377 seasonal pool operators
- Distributed 39,000 oral raccoon rabies vaccine baits August 1-5

. Overdose Prevention Program

- Pride Month celebrations (Pgh, Dormont, Millvale) distributed ~800 naloxone kits
- Attended events e.g. AC Health and Safety Fair, Market Square Farmers Markets



Bureau of Community and Family Health

- Chronic Disease: Posted AC Asthma Resource guide on website
- WIC: mobile van and UPMC Magee
- Breastfeeding Friendly Awards announced
- FCH awarded Family Support Grant from OCDEL to continue evidenced based home visiting and Fatherhood Support Services
 - ACHD received increase of over \$200k and 2 new positions



Bureau of Clinical Services

- Sexually Transmitted Diseases/HIV Program
 - NACCHO Leveraging Pharmacies for STI Services and Care Grant partner with Hilltop Pharmacy for testing and treatment of chlamydia/gonorrhea
 - SURRG (Strengthening US Response to Resistant Gonorrhea) Grant- 2nd year of partnership with CDC and PADOH to identify resistant gonorrhea
- Dental Program: Fluoride varnish program in schools resumed
- Immunization Program:
 - Monkeypox virus and COVID-19 (vaccinations/treatment)
 - Back-to-school immunizations for children ongoing in Immunization Clinic
- Emergency Prep: ~80,000 home COVID-19 tests to high-risk communities
- Pharmacy: New software reduced time for med dispense (75 \rightarrow 26 minutes)













Types of air pollution emissions from coke oven batteries regulated by Article XXI






Current Coke Oven Standards and Inspection Procedures

- Article XXI, Section 2105.21, only addresses the emissions standards for coke ovens and coke oven gas.
- The test methods and inspection procedures for coke ovens are provided in the ACHD's Source Testing Manual.







History of 2020 Proposed Coke Oven Regulation Amendments

- Oct. 5, 2020: Recommendation by Air Advisory Committee for public comment
- Nov. 4, 2020: BOH approved for public comment
- Nov. 20, 2020 Jan. 21, 2021: Public Comment period
- Jan. 20, 2021: Public Hearing
- Received 596 written comments and 65 comments at hearing



2019 U.S. Steel Settlement Agreement and Order

- ACHD agreed to amend Article XXI to incorporate test methods and inspection procedures for coke batteries
- Agreement included process to resolve disputes between ACHD and U.S. Steel
 - "Informal" dispute resolution requires "good faith" efforts to resolve
 - "Formal" dispute resolution decided by Hearing Officer



"Informal" Dispute Resolution Process

- Jan. 20, 2021: U.S. Steel notice of informal dispute resolution
- Informal dispute resolution: Jan. 20 April 16, 2021
- April 16, 2021: "Resolution" Agreement U.S. Steel agreed to not challenge issues resolved during informal dispute process
- Issues not resolved during informal process
 - "Pushing" (Sections 2101.20, 2105.21.e)
 - "Coke Oven Gas" (Sections 2101.20, 2105.21.h)
 - "Miscellaneous Topside Emissions" (Section 2105.21.j)



"Formal" Dispute Resolution Process

- May 5 May 24, 2021: U.S. Steel and ACHD filed "Statements of Position"
- June 23, 2021: U.S. Steel filed Petition with Hearing Officer
- Sept. 8 Oct. 22, 2021: U.S. Steel and ACHD filed briefs
- Dec. 6, 2021: Hearing Officer issued final decision
- "Pushing" (Sections 2101.20, 2105.21.e) ACHD
- "Coke Oven Gas" (Sections 2101.20, 2105.21.h) U.S. Steel
- "Miscellaneous Topside Emissions" (Section 2105.21.j) ACHD
- All documents available on ACHD Hearing Officer Docket



2022 Proposed Coke Oven Regulation Amendments

- In early 2022, ACHD revised proposed Coke Oven Regulation Amendments
- Amendments only addressed changes made to meet requirements of 2019 Agreement and Hearing Officer's decision
- ACHD offered comment period (March 18 to May 17) and public hearing (May 11) on 2022 amendments to allow public to comment on changes



Public Comment on 2020 and 2022 Proposed Coke Oven Regulation Amendments

- All 2022 public comments were considered for possible changes to regulations
- Comments received on 2020 proposed amendments
 - ACHD posted comment/response document on website before 2022 comment period started
 - ACHD encouraged all 2020 commenters to offer comments on 2022 proposed amendments



Proposed Final Coke Oven Regulation Amendments

- All 2022 public comments were considered for possible changes to regulations
- Received 45 comments from 148 commenters
- No changes were made except a typographical correction.
- Documents submitted to Board
 - "Coke Ovens Regulations. Proposed Revision": All changes made to current regulations **bolded** and <u>underlined</u> in black
 - Includes changes since 2020 amendments
