








Monkeypox Update



70 cases to date in Allegheny County



Mon Valley Episode Rule

- Significantly strong inversions and weather pattern caused extended episode
 - Inversion: When warmer air aloft and cooler air below helps to trap PM 2.5 and other pollutants at lower levels which causes increase in their concentration
- Since rule implementation five episodes
 - 12/14/21: warning at 10 AM, ended noon 12/15
 - 03/15/22: warning at 8 AM, ended 4 PM 3/16
 - 04/24/22: warning at 9 AM, ended ~4 PM 4/25
 - 10/10/22: watch only
 - 10/22/22: warning at 7 AM, ended 6 AM 10/26
- Program analyzing data to help determine effectiveness of invoking an episode on air quality, specifically for PM 2.5

PHAB Reaccreditation Planning

- Community Health Assessment (CHA) completed
- Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) (helps/support from 4th Economy)
 - June: Held 9 listening sessions and ~400 surveys
 - July Sept: used public input to draft goals, objectives, strategies
 - October sent draft to public input via survey
 - Reviewing survey responses (~130)
 - Revising CHIP based on comments

- Overdose Prevention Program's communications campaign (July launch) -
 - ~8.9M impressions (billboards, TV ads, social media posts)
 - Directs viewers to County's Harm Reduction Allegheny website (carrying naloxone, contact info OD prevention partners/services
 - Next phase launch additional locations for signage

Food Safety Program

- Continues outreach and implementation to re: Article III regulation
- Notice of food facilities' classification/fee schedule mailed to all AC food facilities
- Article III outreach sessions events coordinated with Live Well Allegheny and Greater Pittsburgh Food Bank (Nov)



Food, Housing and Policy Bureau Updates

Housing and Community Environment Program

- Yearly uses National Lead Poisoning Prevention Week (Oct. 23-29, 2022) as opportunity to raise awareness of lead exposure
- This year teamed up with the Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh
- ACHD staff visited 5 branch locations in Pittsburgh
- Shared info on most common sources of lead exposure and appropriate mitigation techniques








55,000 Tests in 2022

- Rabies Test
- STD, GI, Respiratory Molecular Tests
- Viral Culture
- Bacterial Culture and Sensitivity
- HIV, Syphilis, Hepatitis, MMRV Serology
- Urine Drug Screen
- Saliva Alcohol Screen





New Laboratory Facility


- Approximately 50,000 gross square feet (12,500 GSF at present site)
- Support New Initiatives
 - Laboratory Response Network B Reference Laboratory
 - WHO Influenza Collaborating Laboratory
 - Nucleic Acid Sequencing Service
 - Immunological Test (IGRA) for Tuberculosis
- Move in by end of 2023



Wastewater Testing for SARS Coronavirus 2

- Rolled Out in March 2022
- 8 Sewage Treatment Plants
- Samples collected 3 times per week
- Quantitative results in 4 to 6 days
- Results displayed on ACHD Dashboard








Strengthening United States Response to Resistant Gonorrhea (SURRG)

- *Threat*: untreatable gonorrhea
- *Treatment*: ceftriaxone (IM)
- Purpose: identify stains with reduced susceptibility to ceftriaxone and cefixime
- Clinics: ACHD STD, Central Outreach, Allies of Health
- Methods: Culture and Sensitivity (Etest)
- Testing Started: June 1, 2022
- Results:
 - 797 specimens cultured; 79 (9.9%) yielded Neisseria gonorrhoeae
 - None of the isolates had reduced susceptibility to ceftriaxone and cefixime





Automated Molecular Testing

- Hologic Panther Instruments (N=2)
- Random-access, high throughput (300 specimens/shift/instrument)
- Instrument Interface with LIMS/EPIC systems under development
- SARS Coronavirus 2 testing available
 - 5,305 specimens tested
 - 323 (6.1% positive)
- Gonorrhea/Chlamydia assay being validated





Second Shift Testing Service

- Began October 11, 2022
- Hours: M-F, 3 11 pm
- Staffing
 - Supervisor, Microbiologist, and Clerk
- Functions
 - SARS Coronavirus 2 molecular testing
 - Gonorrhea/Chlamydia molecular testing (2023)





Allegheny County Rules and Regulations Article II Update

Introduction

- Article II provides oversight to Syringe Services Programs (SSPs)
- SSPs prevent the spread of HIV, Hepatitis B and C, other bloodborne pathogens, and bacterial infections by providing clean injection equipment and biohazard containers
- SSPs provide an opportunity to connect individuals with substance use disorders to appropriate medical care, social services and treatment options



Overview of Proposed Revisions

Modernizes terms and definitions

- Language updates throughout Article II reflect ongoing infectious disease crisis and incorporate harm reduction
- Addition of current public health best practices definitions

Clarifies Administrative Requirements

- New "Application and Approval Process" section that clarifies responsibilities of SSP operator and ACHD
- Clarifies SSP applications, including need for municipal engagement prior to Board of Health review



Overview of Proposed Revisions

Clarifies Reporting Requirements

- Updated to current recommended practice and expanded infectious disease requirements
- Added ability to report on complimentary harm reduction services

Sets Process for Decisions Regarding Non-Compliance

- Revised and added role of the BOH in determining status of SSPs
- Specifies ability of municipalities to bring grievances to the BOH
- Responsibilities of ACHD to provide notice to non-compliant SSPs added



Vote for Public Comment Period

- Proposing 60-day public comment
- ACHD will conduct outreach to impacted community for feedback
- ACHD will conduct public hearing in early 2023 and compile public comments, as well as provide answers in response document
- After public comment period, ACHD would present final Article II draft to BOH during a future meeting for vote





Allegheny County Rules and Regulations Article XXIII Update

Introduction

- Article XXIII established mandatory blood lead level testing for children in Allegheny County
- The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) provides guidance for performing blood lead level testing and the recommended health care and environmental actions to pursue based on testing results
- In 2021, CDC updated the blood lead level of concern from 5 µg/dL to 3.5 µg/dL
- Revisions align Article XXIII with the new CDC standard and reflect current department practices



Overview of Proposed Revisions

- Modernizes terms and definitions
 - Replaces "lead poisoning" with "elevated blood lead levels"
- Revises Blood Lead Level Testing Requirements
 - Subsection B align blood lead reference value (BLRV) with CDC
 - Requires capillary blood samples to be confirmed with venipuncture test
- Clarifies Schools, School Administrators and ACHD Responsibilities
 - Removes unnecessary reporting requirements
 - Removes references to school reporting
 - Clarifies ACHD's role in monitoring blood lead levels and assisting families



Vote for Public Comment Period

- Proposing 60-day public comment
- ACHD will conduct outreach to impacted community for feedback
- ACHD will conduct public hearing in early 2023 and compile public comments, as well as provide answers in response document
- After public comment period, ACHD would present final Article XXIII draft to BOH during a future meeting for vote
