


ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

- Air Quality: Planning
 - PM 2.5 Redesignation Request (November 2022)
 - SO2 Redesignation Request (October 2023)
 - H2S Dashboard & Emissions Inventory Dashboard
 - Targeted Airshed Grant for Pittsburgh Regional Transit (PRT) totaling \$10 million for electrification of bus fleet
 - Clean Air Fund Requests to Mon Valley municipalities totaling \$2.3 million for municipal fleet electrification and canopy restoration
- Air Quality: Enforcement
 - In addition to other work, over 700 asbestos permits inspections conducted in 2023
 - More than 500 asbestos permits issued in 2023

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

- Air Quality: Monitoring
 - Allegheny County currently monitors in attainment for all criteria pollutants
- Air Quality: Permitting
 - Title V (29 Facilities)
 - 2019 unissued: 8/31 = 25.8%
 - 11/01/23 unissued: 7/29 = 24.1%
 - 01/31/24 unissued: 4/29 = 13.8%
 - Minor Permits (348 Facilities)
 - 2020 unissued: 179/202 = 88.8%
 - 11/01/23 unissued: 61/348 = 17.5%
 - 01/31/24 unissued: 35/348 = 10.1%





ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

- Plumbing
 - Approximately 2,000 virtual inspections conducted so far in 2023
 - On track for 22,000 total inspections in 2023
- Wastewater & Solid Waste Management
 - The recycling program is evaluating ways to enhance the overall recycling activities in the county:
 - Additional materials
 - Education
 - Revising our Solid Waste Management Plan

FOOD, HOUSING & POLICY

- Food Safety
 - Implementation of Article III
 - Revision of job specifications
 - Food Safety by the Numbers
- Housing
 - Outreach initiative for multi-family housing
 - Tenant Resource Guide distribution
 - Treating >10,000 catch basins during mosquito season





FOOD, HOUSING & POLICY

- Overdose Prevention
 - Adding test strips to harm reduction
 - Revision of Article II
 - Awarded new CDC Overdose Data to Action Grant (\$14.5 million over 5 years)
- Policy
 - New policy coordinator
 - Regulations are on schedule now for regular revisions
 - Up in 2024
 - Plumbing, Housing & Community Environment, HIV Reporting Rules
 - Continual revisions to Air Pollution Control, Food Safety and others

PUBLIC HEALTH LABORATORY

- New Public Health Laboratory
- Middle Hill District Laboratory
 - Inspection in October
 - No Deficiencies
- BSL3 Select Agents Program coming up
- Wastewater Testing
 - Enrolled Johnstown
 - Added Enterovirus EVA71 and new COVID variants
- Self-Testing

Plan for a Healthier Allegheny (2023-2027)



Priority Area: PHYSICAL HEALTH

More Allegheny County residents are physically healthy.

Key Metric: By 2027, more than 90% of Allegheny County residents will report having good, very good, or excellent health (baseline 87.4%, 2019)



Priority Area: BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

More Allegheny County residents experience mental well-being.

Key Metric: By 2027, fewer than 11% of residents will answer 'not good' for 14 or more days to the following question: "Now thinking about your mental health, which includes stress, depression and problems with emotions, for how many days during the past 30 days was your mental health not good?" (Baseline 14%, 2019).



Priority Area: ENVIRONMENT

More people in Allegheny County live in safe and resilient communities.

Key Metric: By 2027, at least 98% of people in Allegheny County will respond "safe" or "extremely safe" to the following question, "How safe from crime do you consider your neighborhood to be?" Baseline was 95% in 2017.



Community Health Workers for COVID Response and Resilient Communities (CCR) Grant

- 3-year grant (2021-2024) from Centers of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)
- Purpose- Support training/deployment of community health workers (CHWs) and build/strengthen community resilience to COVID-19
 - Priority populations
 - Increased risk/prevalence of COVID-19
 - Risk for poor health outcomes from COVID-19 due to long-standing health disparities
- Partnership with 22 organizations, University of Pittsburgh, and Southwest Pennsylvania Area Health Education Center
- Strategies
 - Train CHWs
 - Expand deployment of CHWs
 - Support engagement of CHWs

Community Health Workers for COVID Response and Resilient Communities (CCR) Grant

- What is a CHW?
 - Member of community who serves as advocate and liaison between community and health/social services

Facilitate access to services

- ↑ uptake and access to health care services
- ↓ need for emergency and specialty services
- ↑ adherence to health recommendations


Communicate between community members and health providers

- ↑ quality
- ↑ cultural competence of service delivery


- Challenges facing widespread use of CHWs
 - Low numbers of trained individuals
 - Funding/reimbursement
 - Poor integration of CHWs into teams and system

- Goals
 - Support social/emotional learning for K-12 students
 - Build pipeline of professionals
 - Partnerships: AIU3, 10 pilot school districts, higher education
 - Funding: 2-year project (2022 - 2024), CDC Expanding Lab Capacity grant



Supporting Expansion and Enhancement of K-12 School-Based Social, Emotional Supports (SEES) Initiative

- Higher Education
 - Building capacity of pre-service education students
 - Social Emotional Learning Certificate/Endorsement
 - Improving university faculty expertise in Social Emotional Learning
- Community Partners
 - Increasing awareness



Improving Air Quality in Childcare Programs in Mon Valley Project

- Background
 - Indoor air pollution is a serious health risk
 - Indoor gases and particles
 - allergens, smoking, cooking, mold, chemicals from consumer and building products
 - Outdoor air pollutants
 - Children at high risk due to developing respiratory and immune systems
 - ↑ risk for severe respiratory infections and asthma exacerbations
 - Air quality can be improved by source reduction, ventilation and filtration





Improving Air Quality in Childcare Programs in Mon Valley Project

- Goal
 - Improve indoor air quality in childcare programs located in environmental justice communities*
- Funding- 2-year project, PADOH and foundation support
- Specific aims
 - ↓ spread of respiratory infections and frequency/severity of asthma flares
 - Measured by rates of absenteeism due to chronic respiratory illness
- Project management
 - Allegheny County Department of Children's Initiatives
- Evaluation of facilities
 - STANTEC engineering firm



Improving Air Quality in Childcare Programs in the Mon Valley Project

- Outcomes thus far
 - Department of Children Initiatives received 80 applicants at early after application opened → closed application
 - STANTEC now completing 3 evaluations per day
 - Report on 1st 25 facilities in Nov
 - Recommendations for air filtration and/or reconfigure of air systems
