Tornado Readiness

Tornadoes can develop so rapidly that advanced warning is not possible. Remain alert for signs of an approaching tornado, such as a dark, often greenish sky, large hail, or a loud roar similar to a freight train.

- ⇒ The safest place to be in the event of a tornado is an underground shelter, basement or safe room.
- ⇒ If none of those options are available, use a small, windowless interior room or hallway on the lowest level of a sturdy building.
- ⇒ If in a mobile home, use the bathroom and cover your head with your hands or a blanket.
- ⇒ If you are caught outdoors; immediately get into a vehicle and drive to the closest sturdy shelter. If there is flying debris, pull over and park. Stay in your vehicle, put your head down below the windows and cover your head with your hands.
- ⇒ If you can safely get lower than the roadway, exit your car and lie in that area, covering your head with your hands.
