NORTH PARK LAKE

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR WATER CRAFTS

The following policy for use of water craft on North Park Lake will be placed in effect, April 15, 1978, revised Feb. 1984.

- 1) No motor boats shall be permitted on the waters. (Other than those used by Police or Park Officials.)
- 2) Canoes, kayaks, rowboats, and sailboats, <u>less than</u> 16 feet in length, are permitted on the lake.
- 3) Rubber rafts <u>must be</u> at least seven (7) feet in length with at least two (2) separate air compartments.
- 4) Only paddle boats owned and operated by the County are permitted on the Lake.
- 5) Each water craft shall possess one U.S. Coast Guard approved life preserver for each occupant and all non-swimmers and children under 12 years of age shall wear an approved vest type life preserver while on the waters at North Park Lake.
- 6) No inner tubes or other floatation devices except those described above shall be permitted on the waters of North Park.
- 7) Marshall Lake is <u>closed</u> to all water craft and fishing without exception.
- 8) North Park Lake will be open to water craft from Opening Day of Trout Fishing season until the lake is covered with ice.
- 9) Windjammers will be permitted on the lake, provided a U.S. Coast Guard approved life jacket is worn at all times.
