3) Are there startup funds available for this program, and if so in what amount?

Startup funds will be negotiated and may involve utilization of reinvestment funds.

2) This looks to be an Alternative Outpatient (AOP) funded program. How will program operations such as staff, utilities, mortgage and other staff support be funded?

Yes, this is program is AOP and fee-for-service. Community Care and DHS will negotiate a per diem rate for the AOP/Treatment services and a per diem for room and board for non-treatment services. Community Care will be responsible for payment of AOP/Treatment services for HealthChoices-eligible individuals. DHS will be responsible for payment of AOP/Treatment services for individuals who are not eligible for HealthChoices, as well as for room and board (non-treatment) costs for all individuals.

1) Is it correct to assume that the proposed LTSR must be located within Allegheny County?

While DHS and Community Care would strongly prefer a program located in Allegheny County, we will consider other locations on a case-by-case basis. Should the selected program be located outside of

Allegheny County, the individuals served will retain their medical assistance and HealthChoices eligibility in Allegheny County.
