

Retiring DHS staff member recognized for long-term service to Allegheny County

On December 6, County Executive Rich Fitzgerald, Council Vice President Nick Futules, and County Manager William D. McKain gathered at the Human Services Building to present Randolph Brockington, deputy director of the Office of Administrative and Information Management Systems (AIMS), with the 2017 Frank J. Lucchino Distinguished Service Award. This award recognizes and rewards exemplary performance by county employees as demonstrated through exceptional efficiency and productivity, customer service, or innovation and creativity.

As the award recipient, Randolph was honored with a county proclamation, a glass paperweight depicting the Allegheny County Courthouse, tickets to either a Steelers or Pirates game, and a formal plaque with a photograph from the presentation.

In a press release, Fitzgerald said, "Often people don't realize how much what the county does affects them, but most probably know someone positively impacted by our Department of Human Services.
