Jace is school age youth manager in the Office of Community Services.

1. What was your path to your current role at DHS?

I started working under CYF as the community outreach specialist in 2016.

2. How does your team support DHS/the community?

We are responsible for supporting and monitoring 26 after school providers at 75 locations. Most of our support is done through monitoring visits that provide an opportunity to touch base with each partner and collect and share information as it relates to the quality and safety of the programming being offered to our youth.

We desire to support our providers in facilitating quality programming that empowers our youth to become the best they can be. The programming is very diverse and meets the critical need of providing a safe, nurturing environment during the time gap between after school and early evening.
