Five questions with Rachel Schneider

1. What was your path to Allegheny County/DHS?

2. DHS is looking into/has recently purchased new policy software. What does this software do and why was it important?

DHS is in the process of purchasing PolicyTech, the gold standard in policy management software. Moving to this new user-friendly software will allow for easier collaboration across the department by automating document creation, review, approval, archiving and attestation (employee signatures) processes. Some neat features include the ability to choose a public view setting for documents; email alerts throughout the policy management life cycle; training quizzes to ensure comprehension; automated archiving of old documents; mobile access; and the ability to embed links to relevant policies, procedures, or resources within a document. The software will ultimately improve the efficiency of policy management across DHS through automation and reduce staff time spent on managing and updating documents.

3. How does your role help DHS to meet its mission and goals?

Improving policy management at DHS can make processes more efficient, reduce liability and risk, and enhance service provision. Not only will good policy management provide organizational benefits, but it will also likely enhance employee and consumer satisfaction, safety, and equity.
