

As the AE in Allegheny County ODS registers eligible Allegheny County residents with Intellectual Disability (ID), Autism, Developmental Disability (DD) prior to age 9, Medically Complex Condition (MCC) prior to age 22. ODS connects them to Supports Coordination and other supports and services.

AC DHS (ALLEGHENY COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES)

AC DHS provides publicly funded social services for people in Allegheny County. www.alleghenycounty.us/Services/Human-Services-DHS/DHS-Offices

AAA (Area Agency on Aging)

OBH (Office of Behavioral Health)

SC (Service Coordination) assist individuals diagnosed with a mental health diagnosis find and connect to supports in their communities.

MATP (Medical Assistance Transportation Program)

If are receiving Medicaid, you may be eligible for free public transportation (bus, subway, incline) ahead of time tickets, or reimbursement for your use of public transportation/private vehicle, or free door-to-door service when medically necessary via a shared ride.

CYF (Office of Children, Youth and Families)

Mandated by law to protect children from abuse and neglect. Provides a wide range of preventive, protection, and supportive services to work with children and families, with emphasis on family preservation. CHIP (Children's Health Insurance Program)

ODS Acronym Tips

MCO (Managed Care Organizations)

HealthChoices is the name of Pennsylvania's managed care programs for Medicaid / Medical Assistance recipients. Through managed care organizations, eligible individuals receive quality physical and behavioral medical care, as well as long-term supports.

Each HealthChoices consumer is assigned a Behavioral Health Managed Care Organization (**BH-MCO**) based on county of residence The Allegheny County BH-MCO is **CCBH** (Community Care Behavioral Health Organization). Also known as Community Care. www.ccbh.com/

EMSU (Enhanced Member Supports Unit) Formerly known as Special Needs Unit

Each Physical Health Managed Care Organization has an EMU to assist members, navigate benefits and access services.

EPSDT (The Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment)

The EPSDT benefit provides comprehensive and preventive health care services for children under age 21 who are enrolled in Medicaid. EPSDT is key to ensuring that children and adolescents receive appropriate preventive, dental, mental health and specialty services.

SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) Formerly known as Food Stamps.

People in eligible low-income households can obtain more nutritious diets with SNAP increasing their food purchasing power at grocery stores and supermarkets. Those who are eligible receive an Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) ACCESS Card to make food purchases.

PA DHS ODP (PA DHS Office of Developmental Programs)



This office administers the Commonwealth's intellectual disability and autism programs consisting of home and community-based services (HCBS) for individuals with an intellectual disability and/or autism, private ICF/IDs, and state operated Intermediate Care Facilities (ICF/IDs) known as "state centers." ODP administers federal Medicaid HCBS programs in partnership with county/Administrative Entities.

HCBS (Home and Community Based Services)

Also known as waiver-funded services or waiver programs. HCBS provides for supports and services beyond those covered by the Medical Assistance (also referred to as Medicaid) program that enables a person to remain in a community setting rather than being admitted to a Long Term Care Facility. Currently, the Department of Human Services administers 12 HCBS programs. Each HCBS program has its own eligibility requirements and services.

AE (Administrative Entity)

A county/joinder or non-governmental entity that enters into, and maintains a signed current agreement with the PA DHS to perform administrative functions delegated by the Department, as the Department's designee, and Level of Care (LOC) evaluations in compliance with the Department's approved Intellectual Disability/ Autism (ID/A) Waivers... *The Allegheny County AE is ODS*.

BSASP (Bureau of Supports for Autism and Special Populations

Provides administration and program support for ODP's two programs for adults with autism, the Adult Autism Waiver (AAW) and the Adult Community Autism Program (ACAP). *The ACAP program is not available in Allegheny County.* This Bureau also provides training, resources and technical assistance related to supporting special populations (i.e, deaf/hard of hearing, children with medical complexities).

HCSIS SSD (HCSIS Services and Supports Directory)

A tool for individuals with intellectual disabilities or autism (ID/A), their families, and circle of support to locate services and service providers in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The directory can help you locate particular service providers or search for services and supports provided in an individual's community. It is an online resource that lists available programs, services, and providers for individuals with disabilities.

Pre-ETS (Request Pre-Employment Transition Services) for Students with Disabilities

Can include group and individual services and may be provided by a combination of OVR staff, Community Rehabilitation Providers (CRPs) and/or other agencies.

OVR (Office of Vocational Rehabilitation)



Provides individualized services to assist people with disabilities to pursue, obtain, and maintain satisfactory employment. ...OVR placement services are provided at no cost to eligible individuals with disabilities.

Includes an Individualized Employment Services Plan (IES).
