Free Programs

Early Head Start and Head Start programs are high-quality and free for families who qualify. Your child is eligible* for free services if any of the following are true

- Your household income is within qualifying limits
- Your child has an eligible disability
- The child is in foster care
- The child's family is experiencing homelessness

Your local Early/Head Start program will determine your eligibility when you contact them to enroll.

*Space in the programs is limited. Eligibility does not guarantee placement in the program.

How to Find Your Local Program Online

- 1. Visit the Early Head Start/Head Start page on the DHS website at www.alleghenycounty.us/ dhs/headstart

How to Enroll

- 1. Gather required documents
 - a. Tax documents, pay stubs or TANF receipts for all household members
 - b. Child's immunization records
 - c. Child's birth certificate
 - d. If applicable
 - i. Custody or court documents
 - ii. Disability documentation
 - iii. Health insurance card
- 2. Contact your local program by calling the phone number provided by your search.
