DHS internship basics

If you are looking for a meaningful, substantive opportunity to work in county government for an agency nationally recognized for its innovative approaches to providing human services to its residents, the Allegheny County Department of Human Services may have internships that fit with your skill sets and aspirations. DHS internships are paid positions, either part-time or full-time. We accept interns during the summer or the school year for varying but defined durations.

Who can be a DHS intern?

To qualify for a DHS internship, you must be enrolled in a higher education program and be either a legal resident of Allegheny County or attending a college or university in Allegheny County.


