When you or a loved one need help right away with a mental health, substance use, or human services crisis, Allegheny County has people and services to help.

24/7 RESOURCES FOR CRISIS SUPPORT

If you or a loved one is experiencing a mental health crisis or is in emotional distress, contact resolve Crisis Services.

- **Call** 1-888-7YOU CAN (1-888-796-8226). If needed, a mobile team can be sent to your location.
- **Visit** the walk-in center at 333 North Braddock Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15208.

resolve provides 24/7 telephone, mobile, walk-in, and residential crisis intervention services for all Allegheny County residents – children, adolescents, adults, and older adults. Insurance coverage is not required.

Callers are put in touch with professional mental health and substance use counselors to receive immediate, confidential crisis counseling and emergency support. resolve can also refer callers to someone for ongoing help.

Other services include:

- A mobile crisis team that can travel to the site of the crisis 24/7
- Specialized teams for child, adolescent, and family interventions
- Walk-in services and short-term overnight services
- An after-hours drug and alcohol engagement center for individuals who experience a crisis involving substance use

Pathway to Care and Recovery offers its services at no cost to Allegheny County families, loved ones, and individuals aged 14 and up with challenges related to alcohol and/or other drugs and substances.

IRES is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and puts callers in touch with an Allegheny County delegate who can provide information, find someone to provide ongoing help, or help arrange involuntary examination and treatment when needed. All involuntary commitments **must** be authorized/approved by IRES, a physician, or the police.

Following an emergency psychiatric examination, an individual might be committed (required) or recommended for inpatient hospitalization if their illness poses a danger to themselves or others at the current time.

Inpatient hospitalization for mental health concerns provides short-term inpatient psychiatric services for people with acute illness to help stabilize symptoms so that clients can continue recovery at home and in the community.

Certified Assessment Centers

Certified Assessment Centers allow Allegheny County residents to be seen within 48 hours or less, complete a Level of Care Assessment (LOCA), identify barriers and non-treatment needs, and make referral(s). Individuals receive follow-up calls to ensure treatment admission, engagement, and additional resources if their admission into treatment is delayed.

Other resources include peer support services, education, and a mobile response team that can travel to the individual if needed.

Outpatient Treatment Providers

Types of Outpatient Treatment

Services provided at these facilities can include:

Outpatient treatment

Outpatient treatment services that include individual and/or group sessions

Intensive outpatient treatment

Outpatient treatment with a more significant time commitment – at least 12 hours per week

Partial hospitalization

Services that are similar to an inpatient program but do not require patients to stay overnight at the treatment facility

Medications for Substance Use Disorder

Outpatient treatment may also include medications for Substance Use Disorder, including suboxone, Vivitrol, and methadone

Residential Services including Inpatient Withdrawal Management (Detox)

Types of Residential Services

Residential services provide an inpatient, 24-hour supportive treatment environment and daily clinical services. There are different levels of care available depending on the level of support needed. An assessment helps determine which level of care is appropriate. Some levels of residential services also include medical management or monitoring:

Medically monitored intensive inpatient services

24-hour nursing care with physician monitoring, additional medical specialties as needed, and daily clinical services

Medically monitored inpatient withdrawal management

A non-hospital withdrawal management center with 24-hour observation and medical staff availability

Medically managed intensive inpatient services

24-hour acute, inpatient care for individuals with needs that require primary medical and nursing care

Medically managed intensive inpatient withdrawal management

Hospital-based withdrawal management unit that includes full medical care as well as ICU as needed

Community-based treatment interventions that are usually delivered in a clinic.

We include an overview of the different types of services below. However, different providers may offer different types of therapeutic services, some of which require a referral. These specific services are listed below each provider if you have a treatment that's been recommended to you or one that you are interested in. Your provider will help you decide what treatment(s) can best support you and your loved ones.

Types of Office-Based Services

Behavioral Support Services

Services designed to meet the unique needs of a person and include a variety of service options and implementations.

Outpatient therapy

Community-based treatment interventions that are usually delivered in a clinic setting. Services include individual, group, family, and play therapies.

Partial Hospital Program

A mental health treatment intervention delivered in a clinic or school setting to assist an individual in transitioning from inpatient treatment or to prevent a psychiatric hospitalization. Services include individual, group, and family therapy, as well as psychiatric services, which may include the use of medication.

Psychiatric Services

Services offered and overseen by a licensed psychiatrist, which may include the use of medication.

Therapeutic preschool

A preschool designed to improve social and emotional development while teaching academic skills to young children.

COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES

Blended Service Coordination

Blended service coordinators support individuals who are experiencing serious emotional disturbances that interfere with their ability to function at home and are receiving treatment from two or more providers or systems (such as education, child welfare, or juvenile justice). They also serve as a link and an advocate between multiple systems to ensure the person gets the services that they need. This service is community-based and works with individuals to assess, plan, and link to resources to meet basic needs.

Note: A waiver can be discussed with county monitors if an individual does not meet eligibility criteria but could benefit from this service.

TREATMENT-BASED COMMUNITY SERVICES

These services are delivered in a community setting and have a clinical treatment component.

Note: These services require specialized referrals and are treatment-based.

Types of Treatment-Based Community Services

Community and School-Based Behavioral Health

A service for children with severe emotional and/or behavioral health needs that interfere with functioning at school, in the home, or in the community. Services include individual, group, and family therapy in the school, home, and community setting.

Community Treatment Team (CTT)

Community Treatment Teams provide voluntary, comprehensive, and intensive outpatient mental health and substance use treatment in addition to rehabilitative and support services to those with serious and persistent mental illness and substance use problems. CTT services merge clinical, rehabilitative, and support staff expertise within one team with minimal referrals to other programs for treatment services. CTT is designed for individuals who have not historically benefitted from traditional community-based mental health and substance use services.

Dual Diagnosis Treatment Team (DDTT)

Treatment service teams that meet the needs of individuals with a mental health diagnosis who have another behavioral health diagnosis, most typically a substance use disorder.

Enhanced Clinical Service Coordination (ECSC)

Enhanced Clinical Service Coordination is a team-based approach that includes a therapist, nurse, certified peer specialist, and a care manager to help the individual identify the services and supports they need to maintain or improve their independence to remain in the community and to advance identified recovery goals.

Family Based Mental Health (FBMH) Services

Intensive in-home services designed to prevent out-of-home placement. Services can include individual and family therapy, service coordination, crisis intervention, and family support. Services are provided by a team of two mental health workers, who establish treatment goals in partnership with the family. Services are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, including holidays, for scheduled appointments and crisis intervention.

Intensive Behavioral Health Services (IBHS)

Individualized, strengths-based mental health services delivered in non-traditional community settings, such as home and school, that allow a child to receive services in the least restrictive setting possible.

Mobile Medication

Mobile medication teams support individuals who have been prescribed a psychiatric medication, alone or in conjunction with an injectable psychiatric medication, by an outpatient mental health provider with maintaining their medication regimen. The expected length of treatment with the Mobile Medication Team is three to six months to provide community-based medication education and assistance with adhering to a medication regimen to foster independence with medication management.

Mobile Transition Age Youth (MTAY) Services

A voluntary and comprehensive service for transition-aged youth ages 18-26 that provides outpatient treatment along with rehabilitative and support services within one service delivery team. MTAY is designed for young adults transitioning out of the CYF and Juvenile Justice systems.

Multi-Systemic Therapy

An evidence-based treatment program designed to serve dependent and delinquent youth who are at risk of out of home placement or who are currently in out of home placement.

Short-Term Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility

A short-term, approximately 30 days, residential treatment facility, offering 24-hour treatment and medication management support to assist in stabilizing youth experiencing severe mental, emotional, and behavioral health challenges.

NON-TREATMENT-BASED COMMUNITY SERVICES

These services are delivered in a community setting but do not have a clinical treatment component, though individuals may also receive clinical treatment in coordination with these services.

Note: These services *may* require a specialized referral

Types of Non-Treatment-Based Community Services

Benefits Counseling

A service where a professional works with an individual to determine what fiscal program(s) they are eligible for and how employment-based income will affect their benefits.

Certified Peer Specialist (CPS)

Certified Peer Specialists have lived experience with mental health recovery. Certified Peer Specialists help individuals understand their strengths and develop their goals. They also connect individuals to resources to help them reach their goals. They work with families and treatment providers to ensure that the individual being served receives consistent care.

Diversion and Acute Stabilization

A Diversion and Acute Stabilization Unit is a temporary residential unit for adults that provides an alternative to inpatient hospitalization and can be used as a transition back into the community from inpatient treatment, or as a step-down unit from a Residential Treatment Facility. Its primary focus is to reduce acute symptomology, stabilize medication, avert inpatient hospitalization, and divert from long-term residential treatment facilities. It is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Joint Planning Team (JPT)

A strength-based, family-driven program that uses a team-based approach to support youth and their families. Teams include a Family Support Partner, Youth Support Partner, coach, and facilitator.

Justice Related Services (JRS)

Justice Related Services is comprised of county and state support services, diversion services, community-based services, Mental Health Court, Drug Court, and DUI Court to support individuals with mental health difficulties and/or co-occurring substance use disorders who encounter the criminal justice system.

Psychiatric/Social Rehabilitation

Services for individuals with a mental health diagnosis that interferes with at least one domain: educational, social, vocational, self-maintenance, or relative to the person's ethnic/cultural environment. Services are collaborative, person-directed, and individualized. The focus is to develop skills and access resources needed to increase their capacity to be successful and satisfied in the living, working, learning, and social environments of their choice.

Clubhouse

A psychiatric/social rehabilitation program that provides an opportunity for growth and recovery to those living with the effects of a moderate to severe mental health diagnosis. They help participants acquire skills and social development in a community setting using a "workday" model.

Drop-In Centers

A psychiatric/social rehabilitation program that functions as an informal community center and provides a support network for those living with the effects of a moderate to severe mental health diagnosis.

Residential/Housing Services

Residential programs are designed to help adults and children in recovery. Services vary from 24-hour intensive programs to individually tailored housing supports and services in a variety of settings such as supported housing, comprehensive mental health personal care homes, long-term structured residences (LTSR), and host homes.

Supported Employment

A type of vocational rehabilitation that emphasizes obtaining, maintaining, or regaining skills that allow an individual to obtain competitive employment.

EARLY INTERVENTION SERVICES

Infants and toddlers under three years old who are experiencing a developmental delay or may be at risk of a developmental delay are eligible for a developmental evaluation at no cost to families. If the evaluation determines that the child is eligible for services, those services are provided at no cost to the family. Service planning and delivery occur in the child's natural learning environment (home, childcare, park, etc.) and include the input and participation of the child's caregiver(s) to address each child's unique developmental needs and each family's concerns and priorities.
