HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION



Eviction Prevention

Assistance with satisfying unpaid rent Income, eviction process status, and other eligibility criteria apply and vary across different programs



Rental Assistance

Assistance with costs related to securing housing from an experience of a housing crisis

HOMELESS PREVENTION

Prevention Assessment:

- Where are you in the eviction process?
- How did you get behind in your rent?
- How far along in the eviction process are you?
- How much do you owe in delinquent rent?
- How many months are you behind?
- Are you able to sustain your rent moving forward?
- Have you talked to your landlord about a payment plan?

Street Outreach

Access to support, services, and resources for people who are unsheltered



Emergency Shelter

A safe place to sleep when there is no other option





Traditional shelters accept walk-in or selfreferrals

Allegheny Link and Field Unit staff receive daily updates on vacancies

Invite only shelters by referral from Street Outreach staff only



Adults with Minor Children

Family shelters do not accept walk-in or selfreferrals

Referrals only from Allegheny Link

Contact Allegheny Link daily

RESOURCES FOR LONG TERM NEEDS

Bridge Housing

- Up to 12 months of rental assistance in a community rental unit
- Up to 12 months of rental assistance in a site-based rental unit
- General case management support

Rapid Rehousing

- Up to 24 months of rental assistance in a community rental unit
- Housing stabilization focused case management
- Coordination of services related to other needs

Permanent Supportive Housing

- Ongoing rental assistance in a community rental unit
- Housing stabilization focused case management
- Coordination of services related to other needs

Housing First Principles



Immediate access to permanent housing with no housing readiness requirements



Consumer choice and self-determination

COORDINATED ENTRY

A process developed to ensure that all people experiencing a housing crisis have fair and equal access and are quickly identified, assessed for, referred, and connected to housing and assistance based on their strengths and needs.

Access

Assessment

WHEN IT IS NECESSARY TO CONTACT THE LINK

People must contact the Link for:

- Getting space in a family shelter for families who meet the Allegheny County CoC definition of homelessness
- Getting referral to the Field Unit for individuals who meet the Allegheny County CoC definition of homelessness
- Being assessed for housing programs for people who Allegheny County CoC definition of homelessness
- Checking eligibility for first month's rent for people who Allegheny County CoC definition of homelessness

People can contact the Link, but not necessary for:

- Individual shelter list or information about shelter and engagement center information
- Information about housing search
- Information about rental assistance and referral to AHSC if appropriate
- Information about eviction process and referral to appropriate resource such as Neighborhood Legal Services and Just Mediation
- Information about utilities

QUALIFYING TO COMPLETE THE ALLEGHENY HOUSING ASSESSMENT

- Staying on the street
- Staying in a place not meant for human habitation
- Staying in an emergency shelter or other institution determined as eligible
- Hospitalized and discharging to the street within one day
- Hospitalized for 90 days or less (and homeless prior to entry)
- Actively fleeing domestic violence

WHAT TO **EXPECT FROM** THE ALLEGHENY HOUSING ASSESSMENT

- Must connect with person in housing crisis
- General intake and information gathering
- Detailed discussion of current and past housing status
- Allegheny Housing Assessment
- Long term programs are not available immediately
- Not everyone will or can be assisted
- Problem solving assistance

OCS INTEGRATED HOUSING COORDINATOR (IHC)

IHC'S Role:

- Provide support to, and consultation for, individuals experiencing both behavioral health challenges and homelessness.
- Provide guidance and coordination to appropriate behavioral health and housing/homelessness services.
- Assist individuals with maintaining or reestablishing connections to their behavioral health, housing, and other community supports.
- Collaborate with homeless housing and behavioral health providers to problem solve barriers that obstruct individuals from reaching their desired stability and goals.
