What is Community Counts?

Every January, communities across the country participate in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's annual effort to estimate the number of people experiencing homelessness on a single night.

In Allegheny County, this upcoming count will take place the evening of **Tuesday, January 27, 2026** from 9:00 pm to as late as 2:00 am.

How You Can Help

Allegheny County is launching "Community Counts" to build a tradition of community engagement. The goal is to recruit 300 volunteers and make this an annual initiative that residents look forward to - a meaningful way to connect with and support homelessness efforts year after year.

Volunteers are essential in making this effort possible. Volunteer participation helps ensure that every person in Allegheny County is seen, counted, and connected to support.







Allegheny County has asked for our help to mobilize teams of volunteers for one night in January to conduct a census of people experiencing homelessness. I'm hoping you will consider signing up for this unique and important volunteer opportunity.

Every year, communities across the country participate in the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's annual effort to estimate the number of people experiencing homelessness on a single night.

In Allegheny County, this count will take place the evening of **Tuesday, January 27, 2026, from 9:00 pm to as late as 2:00 am** (Yes -- 2 am.) This year's approach, locally named "Community Counts," is modeled after other cities' counts like New York and Paris.

If you sign up to help, you'll receive training that night and then work in teams with other volunteers, traveling by foot or car, to complete a brief survey for each person you encounter outside. If individuals are sleeping, the survey will be based only on observation.

Participating in this event provides a chance to learn more about homelessness in our community. Your participation allows us to ensure those experiencing homelessness are seen, counted, and connected to supports.
