Data, Reporting & Disease Control

The Bureau of Data, Reporting & Disease Control is responsible for collecting, analyzing, and interpreting data that

provides actionable infor-mation on a variety of conditions of public health importance and on the health status of County residents.

Food Safety

Permits new food-related operations, conducts inspections of existing food facilities, responds to consumer complaints

about food safety and certifies Food Protection Managers. All food facility inspection reports are available at *alleghenycounty.us/foodsafety*.

Housing & Community Environment

Investigates citizen housing and community environment complaints; investigates cases of childhood lead poisoning; monitors and

treats mosquito-breeding sites; inspects and regulates public swimming pools, nursing homes, rooming houses and boarding homes.

Plumbing

Permits new or modified residential and commercial plumbing installations to assure compliance with the plumbing code; requires and issues licenses to all plumbers in the county.

Recycling

Works with municipal recycling programs and promotes special events for hard-torecycle items.

Solid Waste Management

Inspection and oversight of operating and closed landfills, waste processing facilities, material recovery facilities and leaf/yard composting sites.

Water Pollution Control

Inspection and oversight of all sewage treatment plants and sewage collection and conveyance systems in Allegheny County.

Public Health Emergency Preparedness

Prepares the county to respond to public

contingency plans, and strives to enable the County to quickly recover from an emergency.

AmeriCorps

Our annual cohort of Health Corps members works with a variety of underserved populations in the county. In collaboration with partners from community agencies,

services, including health literacy and outreach to some of our hardest-to-reach populations.

Overdose Prevention Program

Provides opioid overdose prevention information and resources including naloxone distribution and trainings, as well as resources for individuals seeking connection to care such as treatment, harm reduction, and recovery supports.

Our programs promote awareness and prevention of major chronic diseases: cancer, heart disease, respiratory disease and

Injury Prevention

The Injury Prevention program's goal is to save lives and prevent injuries to all residents of Allegheny County. This is

done through direct education and evidence-based programming on a variety of topics such as falls prevention and healthy activities.

Infectious Diseases

Traveling overseas? Have you gotten your shots? Have you been bitten by an animal? Do you have one of over 70 reportable diseases? Infectious disease staff provide vaccinations

for adults and children, and track and investigate disease outbreaks.

Family & Child Health (FCH)

The Family & Child Health programs support a healthy start in life for babies in our county and their moms. We provide home-based nursing

services to at-risk pregnant women, new moms and families. We also promote healthy breastfeeding. The Home Visiting Network coordinates resources among the Allegheny County Health Department, Healthy Start Inc., and home visiting agencies from around the County.

Office of Violence Prevention

The Office of Violence Prevention partners with community stakeholders to investigate and understand the root causes and consequences

of gun violence in Allegheny County. The office is committed to striving to reduce all forms of violence from occurringthrough primary prevention programs, policy interventions and advocacy.

Pediatric Dentistry

Our dental clinics in the Hill District. McKeesport and Mt. Oliver provide children with preventive and corrective treatments,

including: examinations, cleanings, fluoride treatments, fillings, and sealants.

Public Health Clinic

This clinic provides confidential, free testing and clinical services for sexually transmitted infections. Counseling is provided before and

after HIV tests. Community organizations and individuals can order free safer sex supplies through our program. We also provide health education presentations for folks 13 and older.

Traffic Safety

This program promotes and educates community members of all ages about safe use of all modes of transportation including driving,

WIC is a federally funded public health nutrition program under the

USDA providing nutrition education, nutritious foods, breastfeeding support, and healthcare referrals for medically at-risk, income-eligible women who are pregnant or post-partum, infants, and children up to age 5. There are 11 WIC clinic locations in Allegheny County.


