What is the Credential for Strengths-Based Family Workers?

The Credential for Strengths-Based Family Workers is an enhanced training and credentialing program that ensures family development workers have the basic knowledge, skills and values to facilitate a family's ability to obtain and maintain self-sufficiency. It is offered in Allegheny County through DHS with the credential issued by Temple University, Harrisburg. The credential is nationally recognized.

SFW is ideal for people working with families and individuals in programs related to:

- Family support
- Child welfare
- Education
- Employment and training
- Drug & alcohol prevention & treatment
- Early childhood
- Other direct human service

What does a worker need to do to receive the SFW credential?

Complete virtual classroom instruction of:

- The Foundations of Strength-Based Practice-Four Courses
- Six Core Content Courses based on Temple University's "Help Giving Cycle" and Motivational Interviewing models.
- Pass a national credentialing examination.
- Complete the SFW Practicum

SFW Core Competencies:

- Demonstrates professionalism and commitment to ethical practice
- Recognizes strength in diversity and difference: demonstrating sensitivity in practice
- Understands and utilizes the power of clear, non-judgmental communication
- Demonstrates self-care and lifelong learning
- Applies strengths-based principles to practice with families
- Applies strengths-based principles to agency and community system



The SFW Credential is honored by various human service organizations and colleges. After the completion of the course workers receive the SFW Credential and SFW Digital Badge.

When will the course be offered?

- SFW is offered twice each year in Allegheny County.

What is the cost of the SFW?

- \$575 for program registration, materials, test, practicum and credential fees. All other costs are underwritten by DHS.
- A limited number of partial scholarships are available. Interested parties should submit a completed SFW application for scholarship.

SFW Outcomes

In research conducted on the outcomes of the SFW training,

Workers said:

- They use family development skills in their professional and personal lives
- They enhanced their skills in helping families develop their own goals of self-reliance
- They increased the ability of families to meet their goals

Supervisors reported:

- Increased effectiveness in helping workers relate to families
- Improved communication among workers and families
